There is no charitable read available for scflyer51, a team sitting dead last in the Street Fighter II division and projected in the bottom 12th percentile of the entire field. The draft tells the story plainly: six major reaches across 21 picks, zero steals, and a philosophical commitment to paying full price and then some for running backs who will not return the investment. Kimani Vidal was snagged nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP, Jaylen Wright nearly six rounds early, and Braelon Allen over three rounds ahead of schedule, a collective act of generosity toward the rest of the field that borders on charity in the wrong direction for a charity tournament. The anchor of the team, Omarion Hampton at RB9, was also reached on in round two. The one genuine value on the board, Ladd McConkey, fell a full round past his ADP and scflyer51 nabbed him, but one accidental bargain does not redeem a draft where Kyler Murray, coming off a lisfranc injury that cost him most of last season and now fighting to hold a starting job in Minnesota, represents the backup quarterback plan.

There is a particular kind of draft heartbreak reserved for managers who did everything right and still ended up here. Sagats Tiger Shots played the value game with genuine discipline, collecting five players at or after their ADP, including Caleb Williams a full round late and Harold Fannin more than a round past where he was supposed to be gone. The problem is that patient, efficient drafting built a roster that projects 13th in the division and in the bottom 15 percent of the field, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the entire enterprise. The run-heavy backfield anchored by Ashton Jeanty and Kyren Williams looks promising, but the receiver group is thin at the top, with Makai Lemon as the projected WR1 at WR40. Meanwhile, the team's only genuine reach, Rico Dowdle at RB32 taken two rounds early, is projected as the weakest starter on the roster. The value was real. The floor just happened to be low.

There is no kind way to say this: ks44 is projected to finish last in the Street Fighter II division and sits at just the 14th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The receiving corps is genuinely strong, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 giving the team a legitimate top end, but the quarterback situation underneath all that talent is grim. Baker Mayfield, already sliding from a top-5 finish in 2024 to a middling QB18 in 2025, now loses Mike Evans to free agency and enters a season where consensus opinion is skeptical he can claw back to his previous form. The fallback is Bryce Young at QB26, the projected weakest starter on the roster. Fourteen chalk picks, zero steals, and two major reaches in the draft left ks44 with no surplus capital and no hidden upside to uncover. The receivers are ready. The problem is there may not be enough quarterback to get them the ball.

There is a particular kind of tired that comes from knowing exactly where things went wrong and having no clean way to fix it. Guile Force enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Street Fighter II division and in just the 25th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains most of the damage. The manager found genuine value in a few spots, landing James Cook at RB5 and Derrick Henry at RB12 later than their ADPs deserved, but those wins were quietly undone by a receiver corps built almost entirely on wishful thinking. Quentin Johnston, projected WR41, was taken 4.3 rounds ahead of his ADP. Jalen Tolbert, projected WR102, cost a pick 5.6 rounds early. Courtland Sutton and Keon Coleman each went well before the market thought they should. The pattern is not bad luck, it is a manager who fell in love with upside at receiver and paid for that love in draft equity that could have shored up everything else. Josh Allen at QB1 is a genuine anchor, but one elite player cannot carry a roster that graded out this thin, and the cupboard offers no obvious trade chip to change the math.

There is not much optimism to manufacture here. Dee Jay sits eighth in the Street Fighter II division and checks in around the 30th percentile of the field, and the draft did nothing to improve the outlook, producing zero steals and zero values against seventeen chalk picks and a major reach in Javonte Williams, taken at 4.01 against an ADP of 6.06. Williams projects as RB17, which means the manager burned premium capital on a player who barely cracks the top half of the position. The roster does have a legitimate anchor in Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and some real upside from De'Von Achane at RB6, but after those two the projections soften fast, and the weakest projected starter is Jadarian Price at RB26, a shaky floor for a team that needs everything to break right. The tight end group, headlined by AJ Barner at TE24, projects weak across the board. Dee Jay is not without talent, but talent alone does not fix a draft that left no margin for error.

Hadouken comes into 2026 sitting seventh in the Street Fighter II division and in just the 31st percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason for optimism. The foundation is real: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, and pairing him with Kenneth Walker III (RB10) and Travis Etienne (RB18) gives this team genuine backfield depth that can carry a week. But the receiving corps is where things get ugly in a hurry, with Michael Wilson projecting as the top pass-catcher at WR39 and Jayden Reed right behind him at WR48. In a positionless format where the ceiling of your best players defines you, that is a significant ceiling. The draft did not help matters: the board shows zero steals, one value, and a trail of chalk and reaches, including Woody Marks pulled two-plus rounds early. Bo Nix has a safe floor and could grow into a true fantasy asset in Denver, but "safe floor" is faint praise when the rest of the roster needs high-end production just to stay competitive. There is no obvious lever left to pull here.

SonicBoomSquad sits at 42nd percentile in the field and sixth in the Street Fighter II division, which is exactly where a team like this belongs: visible enough to matter, anonymous enough to be overlooked. The margins, as always, will tell the story. Trey McBride is the clearest reason for optimism, a TE2 projection snagged at 2.04 when his ADP sat at 1.08, and that kind of draft-day fortune gives this roster a real ceiling. The starting receiver group, anchored by Tetairoa McMillan (WR15), Luther Burden (WR22), Terry McLaurin (WR24), and Carnell Tate (WR29), offers genuine weekly firepower. The concern is that Bucky Irving, a projected RB21, cost a 3.09 pick against a 7.03 ADP, a 3.5-round overpay that compounds the memory of a 20th-percentile scoring season in 2025. That kind of draft capital miscalculation doesn't sink a team outright, but it narrows the margin for error considerably. SonicBoomSquad has the pieces to finish middle of the pack or better. Whether it does depends on how often the good version of this roster shows up on the right weeks.

Ken's 2026 Scott Fish Bowl roster didn't get built on a single splashy pick. It got built the way most good drafts actually work: pick after pick that just made sense. Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors the whole operation, and pairing him with A.J. Brown at WR8 gives Ken two legitimate difference-makers before the field even starts looking for its third. The real texture of this draft, though, is in the supporting cast. Josh Jacobs at RB16, Davante Adams at WR25, Mike Evans at WR27, and Parker Washington at WR35 all project as starters, and all of them add genuine weekly value rather than hopeful upside. Colston Loveland at TE3 is the kind of positional edge that compounds quietly over a long season. Ken's 2025 campaign checked in at the 79th percentile in scoring, and this roster looks like a step forward from that baseline. The draft chart shows no steals, sure, but it also shows almost no reaches. That kind of discipline, applied consistently across 18 picks, lands Ken comfortably at the 69th tournament percentile and firmly in the Street Fighter II conversation.

Blanka's 2026 roster doesn't have a flashy origin story, just a draft that kept making the right call. The centerpiece is a receiver group that would make most managers envious: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Drake London sits at WR7, and Nico Collins checks in at WR9, giving Blanka three projected starters who could anchor a contender on their own. Rome Odunze at WR30 adds a fourth starter with upside to climb. The draft process matched the talent, too. Xavier Worthy fell a round and a half past his ADP before Blanka scooped him at WR49, and Dalton Kincaid landed nearly a round and a half late as a projected TE5 starter. The Matthew Stafford and Nacua stack layers in a secondary connection that pays dividends when the Rams offense clicks. The Kaytron Allen reach in the late rounds is the one blemish on an otherwise clean sheet, but at pick 17.04, the downside is contained. Sitting fourth in the division and at the 73rd percentile, Blanka built this team the quiet way, and the results should speak loudly enough.

Yoga Fire didn't make any flashy moves in the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft, and that's precisely the point. This roster was built the same way a good poker player wins, not by chasing the big hand but by consistently making the right call. The receiver group is the foundation: Justin Jefferson at WR6, Malik Nabers at WR12, Tee Higgins at WR19, and Jameson Williams at WR21 are all projected starters, and Higgins arrived as genuine value, sliding more than a full round past his ADP. Brock Bowers anchors the tight end group at TE1, and Isaiah Likely at TE13 gives the team real depth behind him. The draft log shows 15 chalk picks and only two minor reaches, which is less a criticism than a portrait of a manager who knew what they wanted and took it without flinching. After a rough 2025 that landed in the 25th percentile, Yoga Fire enters 2026 sitting third in the Street Fighter II division and projecting to the 77th percentile. The work showed up in the preparation.

Last year, Zangiefs Iron Claw finished in the 18th percentile and went 9-27, a season best forgotten as quickly as possible. The 2026 roster reads like a deliberate answer to all of that suffering. Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and Jonathan Taylor (RB4) anchor the core, a pairing that gives this team a floor most managers in the Street Fighter II division cannot match, and Taylor arriving as a value at 2.05 after an ADP of 2.01 is the kind of draft-room patience that compounds over a full season. The tight end group is quietly the engine of this rebound story: Tyler Warren (TE4), Travis Kelce (TE10), Mark Andrews (TE14), and Dallas Goedert (TE15) were all acquired at or past their ADPs, meaning the manager consistently let the board come to them rather than forcing selections. Kelce fell a full round, Andrews fell nearly a round and a half, and the savings accumulated into real positional leverage. Sitting second in the division and in the 91st percentile of the field, Zangiefs Iron Claw looks less like a bounce-back candidate and more like a genuine problem for whoever draws them on the schedule.

E Honda Face Slap doesn't treat correlation as a happy accident, it treats it as architecture. The centerpiece is the Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase stack, the kind of pairing that turns a good week into a great one because both men are pulling from the same play. Burrow projects as QB4 and Chase as WR2, meaning this isn't a speculative bet on a developing connection, it's leaning into one of the most productive quarterback-receiver relationships in football. What makes the ceiling genuinely interesting is that the correlation doesn't stop there. George Pickens projects as WR10 and Rashee Rice as WR13, both projected starters, both capable of producing the sort of outlier weeks that decide tournament brackets. The draft work reinforces the vision: Jordyn Tyson fell more than a round past his ADP and Jauan Jennings fell nearly three rounds, giving the roster legitimate depth without the manager ever having to overpay for it. Sitting first in the Street Fighter II division and in the 92nd percentile of the field, E Honda Face Slap is built to boom.
