Brock Bowser lands at 7th percentile in the field and dead last in the Super Mario 64 division, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster produced zero steals, zero values, and twenty pulls either at chalk or worse, which is a remarkable achievement in the wrong direction. The four major reaches tell the story most clearly: Trevor Lawrence, a QB10 projection, came off the board at 3.02 against an ADP of 4.11, which is a questionable priority even before you accept that Lawrence at his ceiling is a borderline starter. Then Jaydon Blue, a projected RB70, got yanked at pick 16.11 when his ADP sat at 24.07, which means Bowser burned a late-round pick chasing a depth piece nearly eight rounds before the rest of the field would have bothered. The anchor of this roster is Brock Bowers at TE1, a genuinely elite asset taken at 1.02, but one foundational piece cannot paper over a draft that reads like someone was in a hurry, guessing, or both. Romeo Doubs, a projected WR53, is the weakest projected starter. That is not a punchline. That is the ceiling.

There is not much mystery to MadiFenton's situation in the Super Mario 64 division: this roster grades out at the 13th percentile of the entire field, and the draft did nothing to change that trajectory. Zero steals, zero values, fourteen chalk picks, and a major reach on Pat Bryant taken nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP summarize a process that generated no upside and banked entirely on consensus. The top end has its bright spots, Trey McBride at TE2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 are legitimate difference-makers, but beneath them the floor drops quickly. Rico Dowdle projects as the weakest starter at RB32, and the wide receiver group leans on Zay Flowers at WR16 with little behind her. Last season's 33 percent win rate and 24th-percentile scoring were not bad luck to outrun, they were a preview of this roster's ceiling. Sitting 11th in the division before a single game is played, MadiFenton looks less like a team on the verge of a breakthrough and more like one still waiting to find the lever that changes things.

rcurleyjr sits at 10th in the Super Mario 64 division and the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it easy to understand why. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, with CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) anchoring a deep collection of projected starters, but in a positionless format that rewards balance, a strong receiver group can only carry so much weight when everything else is sputtering. The quarterback situation grades out with Jordan Love at QB17 and Baker Mayfield at QB18, neither inspiring enough to tilt a week, and the backfield is quietly catastrophic, with Kyle Monangai checking in at RB33 and Alvin Kamara at RB50. Worse, Monangai was the single biggest reach of the draft, taken two rounds ahead of his ADP, which means the cost was real and the reward has been underwhelming on paper. T.J. Hockenson at TE23 offers little relief. Lamb and Jefferson are legitimate stars, but this roster is a sports car with three flat tires, and rcurleyjr looks set to spend another season watching the ceiling and the floor stay frustratingly far apart.

LuskerDu sits ninth in the Super Mario 64 division and in the 22nd percentile of the field, and the roster construction explains why. The receiver group is legitimately strong, with Drake London (WR7), Nico Collins (WR9), and Malik Nabers (WR12) all projected as starters and forming the kind of top-end talent that can carry a lineup. The problem is everything flowing through Patrick Mahomes (QB12), who grades out as the weakest link in an already constrained situation, backed by Malik Willis (QB24) as the next option in line. Loveland at TE3 is a genuine asset, though it cost LuskerDu dearly, taken almost a full round ahead of his ADP in the first round. The receivers are doing their part, but this roster feels like a car with a strong engine bolted to a faulty transmission, nothing quite connects the way it needs to. There is no obvious fix on the horizon, and at this percentile, hoping the projections are wrong is not a strategy, it is a prayer.

Big Boos Haunt enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Super Mario 64 division and projected at just the 25th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet does not offer much reason for optimism. The roster does have a genuine anchor in Puka Nacua, who projects as WR1 and gives this team a weekly ceiling that most managers in the division would envy. The problem is that the supporting cast drops off sharply, and the draft did little to address it. Thirteen of the team's picks came in at chalk, five landed as minor reaches, and the one major steal the manager uncovered was Eli Stowers at TE32, a player whose upside is modest at best. Meanwhile, five picks arrived before their ADP, none more puzzling than Kimani Vidal, grabbed 2.7 rounds ahead of schedule and projecting all the way down at RB60. Last season's 36-percent win rate was not a fluke worth dismissing, and right now the 2026 projection reads like a sequel nobody asked for, with Nacua carrying the load while the depth behind him grades out near the bottom of the tournament.

Lethal Lawrence Land isn't hiding what it's doing. The Dak Prescott and George Pickens stack is the centerpiece, and the Jared Goff, Jameson Williams, and Sam LaPorta double-dip makes the plan unmistakable: this team rises or falls on whether its pairings fire together. That's a legitimate philosophy in a positionless format where ceiling matters more than floor, but it also means the variance cuts both ways. Bijan Robinson at RB2 gives the roster a high-floor anchor outside the stack, and the draft showed genuine patience, landing TreVeyon Henderson nearly two rounds past his ADP. The uncertainty, though, is real. Prescott is a QB7 projection, which is good but not dominant, and if the Goff connections underdeliver, the supporting cast thins out quickly. Sitting at 46th percentile in the field after a 71st percentile scoring season in 2025, Lethal Lawrence Land feels like a team that drafted its hope rather than discovered it, which is fine, until the stacks go cold.

ATrain28 sits at 46th percentile and sixth in the Super Mario 64 division, which is exactly where the margins start to matter most. The receiver group is the engine here: Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), A.J. Brown (WR8), DeVonta Smith (WR14), Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33), and Chris Godwin (WR38) give this roster a top line that can go point-for-point with anyone in the field, and Brown and Godwin both came at genuine value, falling nearly a round past their ADPs. The problem is that the floor threatens to swallow the ceiling. Fernando Mendoza checks in at QB27, and while this format allows managers to field their best players in almost any mix, three quarterbacks ranked QB27, QB34, and QB37 is a thin hand no matter how you deal it. Add in J.J. McCarthy as a five-round reach and Mike Washington Jr. as a three-round reach, and ATrain28 spent real draft capital on players projected to contribute very little. Last year's 83 percent win rate suggests this manager knows how to compete. Whether that translates in 2026 depends entirely on how little the weak spots cost them.

Greenwich Mean Timers didn't build this roster on a single bold swing, they built it by repeatedly coming out ahead in small moments, and the cumulative effect is a team that projects well into 2026. The clearest example is Jonathan Taylor, snagged just four picks past his ADP at RB4, a quietly efficient move that anchors a starting group that also features Christian McCaffrey at RB3. Brock Purdy fell nearly two full rounds past his ADP before Greenwich scooped him up at QB13, which is the kind of patient opportunism that doesn't make highlight reels but absolutely shows up in the standings. Kyler Murray adds genuine upside at QB19, and while his lisfranc history warrants a raised eyebrow, the prevailing read is that Minnesota's starting job is his to lose, which means the floor is higher than the injury narrative suggests. The 2025 season backs up the optimism, with a 67 percent win rate and scoring in the 86th percentile. This team didn't get lucky once, it just kept not making mistakes.

The Trout Farm went into this draft and made four major reaches, and somehow came out looking like one of the smarter rosters in the Super Mario 64 division. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 was pulled a round and a half early, Tyler Warren at TE4 was grabbed before the board said to, and the manager kept right on reaching for Luther Burden, Blake Corum, and Tyreek Hill before their respective ADPs caught up. The board screamed patience; this team said no every single time. Here is the uncomfortable part for the rest of the division: it worked. Chase is a genuine WR2, Warren anchors the tight end group as a projected TE4, and Ladd McConkey at WR20 and D.J. Moore at WR26 give the lineup real depth behind him. The one concession to uncertainty is Matthew Stafford, a 37-year-old MVP coming off a career year while the Rams have already drafted his replacement, which is its own specific flavor of pressure. Whether this team is built on conviction or lucky timing, the 64th-percentile projection feels like it is leaving something on the table.

Felkrane didn't need a flashy cornerstone moment to build something worth watching in the Super Mario 64 division, just a draft that kept grinding out advantages pick after pick. Josh Allen at QB1 slipping to 1.11 was a quiet gift, and Saquon Barkley falling nearly a round past his ADP at 3.11 meant Felkrane was already ahead of schedule before the middle rounds even started. Then Jordan Addison tumbled more than two rounds past his ADP into Felkrane's lap at 12.02, giving a starting group that already included Terry McLaurin, Mike Evans, and Tetairoa McMillan another capable piece. The one genuine cloud hanging over this roster is George Kittle, who is recovering from a torn Achilles and, despite optimistic offseason talk, remains an uncertain presence for Week 1. If Kittle returns healthy, this lineup has the kind of depth that makes opponents nervous every single week. The 2025 squad went 34-2 and finished in the 99th percentile in scoring, and this roster, assembled without a single major reach, suggests that wasn't a fluke.

schultzs26 didn't luck into a great roster. They built one, pick by careful pick, and the draft log backs it up. Five players came in as genuine values against ADP, and the names attached to those slides are not afterthoughts. Harold Fannin, a projected TE6 and a starter, fell a full round and a half past where the field thought he'd go, and Davante Adams, projected WR25 and also a starter, drifted more than a round before schultzs26 scooped him in the seventh. That kind of patient accumulation compounds quickly when your top of roster already includes Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, James Cook at RB5, and Breece Hall at RB14. The one blemish is a nearly five-round reach on James Conner, projected RB56, which is a real overpay on a backend asset. But one mistake against five value acquisitions is a winning batting average in any draft room. The result is a squad sitting second in the Super Mario 64 division and in the 90th percentile of the field, which is exactly where a methodical draft should land you.

Hazy Maye-ze Cave sits atop the Super Mario 64 division at the 100th tournament percentile, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. This roster was built with the patience and precision of a manager who simply refused to panic, collecting four steals and five values across 19 picks without a single reach anywhere on the board. Drake Maye sliding to pick 2.12 despite projecting as QB2 is the kind of gift that anchors a roster, and pairing him with Lamar Jackson as a projected starter gives this team quarterback depth that most managers would envy. The running back group, led by Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 alongside Jeremiyah Love and Josh Jacobs, is staggering in its quality. Tucker Kraft falling more than two full rounds past his ADP to land as a projected TE5 starter is the steal that quietly separates good drafts from great ones. Alec Pierce carries some PUP list uncertainty, but even with that caveat factored in, there is almost nothing to pick apart here. Clean, disciplined, and dangerous.
