Princess Peach sits 12th in the Super Mario Kart division and in the 2nd percentile of the broader field, and nothing about this roster suggests that math is wrong. The draft is the clearest place to start the autopsy: zero steals, zero values, and two major reaches that define the roster's ceiling before a single game is played. Drake Maye cost a 1.04 pick despite an ADP of 2.02, which is a mild overpay you can forgive, but Bucky Irving at 3.04 when the market said 7.03 is the kind of swing that echoes for months. Irving projects as RB21, which is fine, but fine does not justify surrendering nearly four rounds of draft equity to acquire it. The projected starters grade out at QB2, RB8, RB21, WR15, WR28, WR30, and TE18, a lineup that reads competent on paper yet lands near the bottom of the field in practice. Last season's 42 percent win rate was not an anomaly to overcome; it looks more like a baseline.

There is a version of this KCAW roster that looks fine on paper, and then there is the version that actually has to compete in the Scott Fish Bowl, where fine on paper lands you 11th in the Super Mario Kart division and in the 14th percentile of the field. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and James Cook at RB5 give the lineup a legitimate foundation, but after that the floor drops fast, and nothing in the draft haul suggests the manager found a way around it. Zero steals, zero values, 18 chalk picks, and a weakest projected starter in Khalil Shakir at WR51, which is not the profile of a team that outran its projections on draft day. The quarterback situation is where the quiet dread lives: Brock Purdy checks in at QB13, Tyler Shough at QB20, and Cam Ward at QB23. Shough is intriguing in theory, with a legitimately talented supporting cast in New Orleans, but he is 27 years old and still searching for a leap that may never come. KCAW is not obviously broken, it is just quietly, comprehensively outgunned, and there is no obvious lever left to pull.

KyleSoppe enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Super Mario Kart division and in just the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster does not make a compelling case for a reversal of fortune. The draft tells most of the story: three major reaches, including Josh Jacobs taken nearly two rounds before his ADP and Sean Tucker pulled a full three and a half rounds early, and zero steals anywhere on the board. Those aggressive swings did not land on upside, they landed on depth that a positionless format cannot fully redeem. Jonathan Taylor and De'Von Achane project as genuine difference-makers at RB4 and RB6, but the supporting cast thins out quickly, and the receiver group tops out at Jaylen Waddle at WR23. At quarterback, Jordan Love is the kind of QB who wins analytical arguments and loses fantasy matchups, a player who caps out around QB17 while Green Bay's receiving room searches for an alpha that does not yet exist. KyleSoppe had a 67 percent win rate in 2025. The roster is asking for patience the standings may not grant.

Deebo Kong finished 30th percentile in scoring last season and the 2026 projections offer little reason for optimism, with the team sitting ninth in the Super Mario Kart division and checking in at just the 42nd tournament percentile. The foundation looks solid enough on paper, Bijan Robinson projects as RB2 and Ashton Jeanty slots in at RB7, giving this roster genuine star power at the top. But the problem with Deebo Kong is everything below that tier. The draft was almost entirely chalk, with zero steals and only one value across the whole board, which means the manager had no margin for error and mostly got exactly what the market expected. Rashee Rice grades out at WR13 and forms a sensible stack with Patrick Mahomes, but beyond that the receiver group fades fast, with Deebo Samuel projecting at WR70 and Dalton Schultz penciled in as the weakest projected starter at TE22. When your floor depends on Robinson and Jeanty staying healthy and your depth is built on late-round coin flips, you are not building a contender, you are buying a lottery ticket.

Toad Patrol arrives in the Super Mario Kart division sitting eighth and projecting at just the 42nd percentile of the field, and there is very little in the draft sheet to suggest a turnaround is coming. The headline problem is not a lack of names but a lack of upside below the top tier: Josh Allen is a genuine QB1 anchor, Colston Loveland slots in as a projected TE3, and Malik Nabers grades out as a WR12, so the floor is not nonexistent. But the roster drops off fast after that, and the draft did nothing to change the trajectory. Of the two major reaches on the board, Jayden Higgins cost nearly three rounds of draft capital ahead of his ADP and projects as a WR54, and Elic Ayomanor was grabbed almost four rounds early and sits at WR95. That is a lot of currency spent chasing upside that the projections simply do not support. A team that went 12-24 last season and scored in the 27th percentile cannot afford to burn early picks on long shots, and Toad Patrol did exactly that.

Yoshi-vas stack lives in the margins, and the margins are honest territory. The core is genuinely good: Joe Burrow at QB4 and Brock Bowers at TE1 give this roster a ceiling that most teams in the Super Mario Kart division cannot match, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10, Javonte Williams at RB17, and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 form a projected starting group that is quietly difficult to dismiss. The problem is that quiet is doing a lot of work in that sentence. A 31% win rate and 17th-percentile scoring in 2025 are the arithmetic of a team that competes without converting, and the draft did almost nothing to change the underlying math, producing 13 chalk picks, four minor reaches, and one major reach in Travis Hunter at WR62, taken two full rounds before the market agreed he was worth selecting. Hunter may justify the reach. He may not. That ambiguity is exactly the kind of coin flip that separates 7th in division from 4th, and Yoshi-vas stack has built a season out of them.

miamifins03 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by repeatedly getting players after the market had already discounted them. Dallas Goedert at TE15 fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before this team scooped him up. Daniel Jones, projected QB25, slid almost two rounds as well and gives the team a functional starting option at a position the format doesn't punish you for streaming. The receiver group is where the foundation really shows, with Nico Collins at WR9, George Pickens at WR10, Jameson Williams at WR21, and D.J. Moore at WR26 all projecting as starters and all taken at or near fair market value, the kind of disciplined chalk that builds a floor without requiring anything to break right. The one blemish is Chris Brazzell II, taken nearly five rounds early at WR101, a reach that stands out precisely because the rest of the draft didn't need it. Sitting 57th percentile in the field and sixth in the Super Mario Kart division, this roster has enough consistent quality to push higher if the projections hold.

Koopa Troopa is sitting at 80th percentile in the field not because of one flashy swing but because this draft was simply correct, over and over again. Start with the top of the roster: Trey McBride projects as TE2, CeeDee Lamb as WR5, and both were acquired at value, with Lamb slipping a full round past his ADP and Dak Prescott following him into the same stack at a discount of nearly a full round as well. That Prescott-Lamb pairing is exactly the kind of correlation that quietly inflates ceilings without requiring a manager to gamble. Drop down the depth chart and the discipline holds: Chase Brown at RB11 and Kyren Williams at RB15 give this team two legitimate contributors at the position, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 is the kind of projectable talent that fills a lineup without drama. The weakest projected starter is Jordan Addison at WR43, which is a fine problem to have. Koopa Troopa did not reinvent the wheel here. They just consistently came out ahead of the market, and in a positionless format, that compounds fast.

Last year was a disaster for datff51, a 7-29 record and a 15th-percentile scoring finish that left little to build on. The 2026 roster looks like a genuine course correction. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Drake London at WR7 give this team a top-end punch that most managers in the field simply cannot match, and Luther Burden projecting at WR22 means the quality doesn't fall off a cliff after the first two names. Tucker Kraft at TE5 and Sam LaPorta at TE8 add another layer of projected production that pushes this roster to the 80th percentile tournament-wide, a swing of 65 percentile points from where datff51 stood twelve months ago. The quarterback situation is the one soft spot, with Baker Mayfield at QB18 and Sam Darnold at QB21 providing functional but unspectacular options, though both were drafted past their ADPs, which shows some savvy at the margins. This isn't a squad built on optimism. It's built on Chase, and that's a different thing entirely.

Heat Seeking Toads finished third in the division and in the 82nd percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: 17 chalk picks, three values, zero reaches. That is not a team that swung for the fences and got lucky, that is a team that drafted with discipline and kept coming out ahead on the margins. The values are worth naming. Jayden Daniels, a QB5, fell nearly a full round and a half past his ADP. T.J. Hockenson, a TE23, slipped almost two rounds. Chigoziem Okonkwo, a TE19, dropped over a round. None of those picks made headlines in the moment, but that is exactly the point. Meanwhile, the top of the roster is legitimate: Lamar Jackson at QB3, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Harold Fannin at TE6, and Kyle Pitts at TE7 give this team a starting core that belongs in any serious conversation. The weakest projected starter is Michael Pittman at WR44, which is the kind of floor that most managers would gladly accept.

Tyler Warrio didn't need a lottery ticket to build one of the better rosters in the field. He just needed to keep winning the small moments, and he did. Jalen Hurts, projected QB9, slid a full round and a half past his ADP and landed at 5.03. Chris Olave, projected WR11, fell an entire round and came along for the ride. Those aren't splashy stories, but they're the kind of quiet advantages that compound over a season. The receiving corps is legitimately elite at the top, with Puka Nacua projected WR1 and A.J. Brown projected WR8 anchoring a group that gives Warrio options on nearly every slate. Add Tyler Warren at TE4 and George Kittle at TE9 as projected starters and the depth at tight end alone would be the envy of most rosters in the tournament. His 2025 campaign, 92 percent wins and a 100th percentile scoring season, suggests this is not a manager who stumbles into good rosters. Division rank second, tournament percentile 88th. There's nothing here that looks like luck.

There was no single marquee moment that defined this draft, just round after round of sensible decisions that quietly added up to something special. Justin Jefferson at WR6 slipping to the second round is the kind of gift that makes a draft, and this team was there to collect it. Caleb Williams at QB6 fell more than a full round past his ADP and landed in the fourth. Those two values alone would have made this a draft worth respecting, but the rest of the board tells the same story: fifteen chalk picks executed cleanly, Jaxon Smith-Njigba and Garrett Wilson reinforcing a receiver group that projects to be genuinely elite, and Travis Kelce and Mark Andrews giving the team credible options at tight end. The only real gamble was Jordan James, taken nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP in the back half of the draft, a reach that barely registers when the top of the roster looks like this. First in the division, 92nd percentile in the tournament, and built the boring, winning way.
