There is no version of this draft that flatters Malyon, and the numbers confirm it. Sitting at the bottom of the Super Mario World division and projected in just the 10th percentile of the entire field, the roster reads like a case study in misallocated capital. The receiving corps is the clearest evidence: Xavier Worthy projects as WR49, Jayden Higgins as WR54, and those are the starters. That is not bad luck, that is the consequence of reaching five times on minor targets while the board still had real value on it. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 give Malyon genuine firepower at the top, but this format rewards depth across the whole lineup, and when Higgins is your weakest projected starter, the floor is visibly fragile. Kirk Cousins, pulled four and a half rounds before his ADP, is the single best illustration of how this draft unraveled: a QB35 spent like a QB1, and nothing downstream recovered from the hole that left behind.

BuenosNoches enters 2026 sitting 11th in the Super Mario World division and in just the 20th percentile of the field, and the roster grades out in a way that makes optimism genuinely difficult to locate. The receiver group is legitimately good, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba projecting as WR3 and a supporting cast that runs deep enough to keep the lineup fed, but the rest of the roster keeps undercutting it. Saquon Barkley checks in as RB8, which sounds fine until you realize the projected running back depth behind him bottoms out at Blake Corum at RB35. The quarterback situation is similarly squeezed: Caleb Williams projects as QB6 and was the draft's one notable reach, taken nearly a full round early, while the Bo Nix stack with Jaylen Waddle offers some ceiling given Nix's habit of leading the league in pass attempts, but Nix grades as QB15 and that is the upside. A team coming off a 33 percent win rate in 2025 needed a draft that swung for the fences. This one mostly colored inside the lines, and the standings are likely to show it.

Last year, gouda was a machine, a 92nd-percentile scoring operation that went 26-10 and made the kind of noise that earns a manager genuine respect heading into a new season. This year's roster looks like it was built by someone who remembered the outcome but forgot the ingredients. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, Rashee Rice at WR13, and Garrett Wilson at WR17 forming a top tier that would make any manager feel good, and Tyler Warren at TE4 alongside Tucker Kraft at TE5 adds real depth at the position. But projections don't lie, and this team sits at the 21st percentile, dead last in the Super Mario World division, because the players feeding those pass-catchers are a wasteland. Jacoby Brissett, Geno Smith, Deshaun Watson, and Justin Fields clock in at QB28, QB30, QB34, and QB38 respectively, which is less a quarterback room and more a support group. Reputation is a fine thing to have. It is, unfortunately, not a scoring category.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes from watching a 93rd-percentile season evaporate in the offseason, and Dotson03 is living it. Last year's version of this team was elite. This year's sits at the 24th percentile and ninth in the Super Mario World division, and the distance between those two data points is the whole story. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and James Cook at RB5 give this roster a legitimate foundation, but the projected starters beyond that tier thin out quickly, and J.K. Dobbins as the weakest projected starter at RB36 captures how fast the floor drops. The receiver group, anchored by Jameson Williams at WR21 and Carnell Tate at WR29, is average, not the difference-maker a team in rebuild mode needs. Dalton Kincaid at TE11 could help, but Bills GM Brandon Beane's own words suggest his knee is still an open question heading into 2026. Dotson03 drafted almost entirely to consensus, zero steals on a roster that desperately needed some. Reputation is not a lineup spot, and last year's trophy does not move the needle on this year's projections.

Bowers Castle enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Super Mario World division and barely inside the bottom third of the field at the 36th percentile, and a close look at the roster explains exactly why. Brock Bowers is a legitimate TE1, and pairing him with Colston Loveland (TE3), Sam LaPorta (TE8), and Travis Kelce (TE10) as projected starters is genuinely impressive depth at one position, but this is a positionless format, and when that group runs out, the drop-off is steep. Malik Nabers flashes WR12 upside, though his torn ACL recovery has been anything but straightforward, and banking on him being a full-go contributor in the early weeks feels less like a strategy and more like a prayer. Beyond Nabers, Baker Mayfield checks in at QB18 and Bhayshul Tuten at RB25, meaning the projected starters outside the tight end group grade out somewhere between replaceable and forgettable. The draft board did not help either, featuring two major reaches and only one steal. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, just a manager hoping Nabers stays healthy and the rest of the field stumbles.

Two Toads One Peach sits seventh in the Super Mario World division and checks in at just the 41st percentile of the field, and the draft log does not offer much in the way of optimism. The top of the roster is genuinely good: Josh Allen is a QB1, De'Von Achane grades out as RB6, and the Allen/D.J. Moore stack gives the team a built-in floor. The problem is that the middle and bottom of the roster never deliver on that promise. Seven minor reaches and a major reach on Tory Horton, a WR93 taken more than three rounds early, suggest a manager who kept paying a little too much for a little too little. Kyler Murray, clocking in at QB19, brings genuine uncertainty given a lisfranc injury that cost him most of last season and a quarterback competition in Minnesota that may or may not be the formality everyone assumes it is. With a weakest projected starter in Denzel Boston at WR58, there is no obvious upgrade hiding at the bottom of this roster. Allen is real. The rest of this is hope dressed up as a plan.

craigycraigo84 sits at 53rd percentile and sixth in the Super Mario World division, which is about as on-the-nose a summary of this roster as you'll find. The case for optimism starts at receiver, where CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) form a genuinely elite top end, Jefferson's revival depending on whether Kyler Murray unlocks what JJ McCarthy buried last season. The case for concern starts almost everywhere else, particularly at running back, where Jadarian Price (RB26) and RJ Harvey (RB28) are the best options on a group that thins out fast. Both were draft-day values, Price falling nearly two and a half rounds past ADP, but value at acquisition only matters if the player delivers at the position. Mark Andrews (TE14) was another late-falling bargain and slides into the starting lineup without much resistance. The math here is simple: if Lamb and Jefferson are everything their projections suggest, craigycraigo84 is alive in any given week. If either stumbles, there is very little margin underneath to absorb the hit.

The Chargin Chucks did not build this roster on one flashy swing. They built it pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting comfortably at 53rd percentile with real room to climb. The foundation is a receiver group that genuinely stands out, with Nico Collins at WR9 and George Pickens at WR10 giving this team two projected top-ten options at the position, backed by Ladd McConkey at WR20 and Luther Burden at WR22 as legitimate contributors. Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors the backfield and may be the single most valuable player on the roster. The draft was mostly chalk, which gets a bad reputation it does not always deserve, because chalk means the manager consistently identified fair value and did not flinch. The one blemish is Woody Marks at RB44, pulled nearly two rounds ahead of his ADP, a reach that looks harder to justify given where the rest of the backfield sits. The quarterback room is the softest part of the projection, but in a positionless format, Collins and Pickens can cover a lot of ground.

campinmonkey didn't need a heist to build a contender in the Super Mario World division, just a draft that kept winning small. The foundation is genuine: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 is a legitimate top-of-roster anchor, and landing Lamar Jackson at QB3 two picks after his ADP means campinmonkey essentially got the best quarterback in this field for a discount. Pair Jackson with projected starter Zay Flowers in a stack and that connection alone gives the roster a weekly ceiling most managers would envy. The receiver group deepens things further, with Emeka Egbuka at WR18, Rome Odunze at WR30, and Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33 all projecting as starters, meaning campinmonkey enters the season with genuine lineup options rather than prayers. Matthew Golden, taken 2.5 rounds before his ADP, is the one swing that could either look visionary or costly by October. But one reach in an otherwise disciplined draft is a footnote, not a flaw. At 71st percentile and fourth in the division, this roster belongs exactly where the projections have it, right in the conversation.

Banzai Bill didn't need a single lottery ticket to land in the 79th percentile of this field, just a draft full of quiet, consistent wins. The receiver corps is the engine here: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Drake London at WR7 give this roster a genuine top-tier foundation, with Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Alec Pierce at WR32 extending the depth well past where most managers can follow. None of those came from heroic gambles on upside, just a manager who kept coming out ahead at the table. Matthew Stafford, sliding past his ADP by nearly a round and a half, adds a quietly compelling storyline: a 37-year-old coming off an MVP season now playing with one eye on the heir apparent the Rams drafted behind him, which is exactly the kind of motivated late-career chess piece a smart roster loves to carry. Kyle Pitts rounds out the projected starters at TE7. Third in the division and knocking on the door of the tournament's top quarter, Bill built this thing the right way, brick by unremarkable brick.

The Buffalo Bullet Bills did not build this roster by swinging for fences and hoping. They built it by drafting well, over and over, and the result is a team sitting at 81st percentile in the field with genuine star power at the positions that matter most. Drake Maye projects as QB2, Trey McBride as TE2, and Brock Purdy as QB13 pairs with George Kittle as a live stack, giving this team multiple ways to win a week. The value column is modest by the numbers, just two picks that beat ADP, but those picks were George Kittle at TE9 and David Montgomery at RB23, both landing a round or more after they should have. That kind of quiet, compounding discipline is exactly how rosters end up stronger than they look on paper. The WR group is the thinnest collection on the roster, with Tee Higgins at WR19 and Terry McLaurin at WR24 carrying the projected starts, but in a positionless format those two are perfectly serviceable contributors. This team was not built on any single master stroke. It was built on not making mistakes, and in the Scott Fish Bowl, that is usually enough.

SSteele84 sits at the top of the Super Mario World division and in the 95th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The backbone here is a relentless ground game headlined by Ashton Jeanty (RB7), Omarion Hampton (RB9), and Chase Brown (RB11), all projected starters, with Brown arriving as one of five genuine values on the board after falling more than a round past his ADP. That kind of patience compounds quickly, and SSteele84 exercised it again with Kyren Williams (RB15), Rhamondre Stevenson (RB31), and Tony Pollard (RB30), each collected later than the market expected. Puka Nacua (WR1) anchors the receiving corps at the top of his position, and a Jaxson Dart (QB11) and Isaiah Likely (TE13) stack adds a bonus layer of correlation when the points start flying. Bryce Young (QB26), landed at 15.03 against an ADP of 11.08, is the kind of find that makes a draft look almost unfair. This is a clean, disciplined build with very little to criticize.
