BlandinoHair lands in 2nd percentile of the field, sitting 12th in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division, and the draft log explains exactly how they got there. The board was kind enough to offer a first overall pick, and BlandinoHair spent it on George Pickens at WR10, taking him a full round ahead of his ADP. That is the most defensible decision on the sheet. From there, the draft devolved into a string of reaches with nothing to show for it, zero steals, zero values, and 20 picks that were either chalk or paid a premium. The most damning reach is Germie Bernard at WR79, grabbed 6.5 rounds early, a bet that cost real capital and projects as a fringe contributor. Even Justin Jefferson at WR6 cannot carry a roster that was assembled this carelessly. Parker Washington is a reasonable name to like, but his hold on a featured role in Jacksonville is genuinely fragile, and betting on him as a meaningful contributor here is less a calculated risk than a prayer offered to an indifferent universe.

There is no elegant way to spin an 18th-percentile projection and an 11th-place divisional standing, so YouShnowDawkins will not get one. The roster's best moments come from Bijan Robinson (RB2) and Saquon Barkley (RB8), a genuinely strong pair of backs who will produce, but after them the cupboard gets thin fast. The receiver group grades out weak as a unit, and the top projected starter there is Jaylen Waddle at WR23, which is respectable without being the kind of anchor that drags a borderline roster into contention. The draft did not create much runway for optimism either: three major reaches, including Dalton Kincaid at TE11 taken nearly three-and-a-half rounds ahead of his ADP and Jonah Coleman at RB51 taken nearly three rounds early, suggest a manager chasing value that wasn't really there. Lamar Jackson (QB3) is a legitimate asset, but Robinson and Jackson and Barkley together can only carry so much weight when the rest of the lineup projects this quietly. YouShnowDawkins is not broken. They are just, unfortunately, short.

There is no sugarcoating the outlook for rmggraham16 in 2026. Sitting 10th in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division and projecting at just the 22nd percentile of the field, this roster is in genuine trouble, and the draft did not help matters. The manager spent significant capital chasing quarterbacks, reaching on Jordan Love (QB17) nearly two full rounds early and then doubling down on Sam Darnold (QB21) ahead of schedule, leaving the position still graded weak despite the investment. There is real talent anchoring the group, Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and De'Von Achane (RB6) are as good a top two as anyone could ask for, but the supporting cast grades out thin enough that the floor is soft when either misses a week. The one genuine win on draft day, landing Tee Higgins (WR19) a round and a half past his ADP, is a bright spot, but a single value pick does not fix a roster that came in last season at 47 percent wins and appears headed in the same direction.

The Underd0gs sit ninth in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division and check in at just the 26th percentile of the field, and the draft didn't do much to change the trajectory. The RB group anchored by Ashton Jeanty (RB7) and Jeremiyah Love (RB13) is genuinely strong, but the wide receiver corps is a slow leak: Mike Evans (WR27), Rome Odunze (WR30), and Xavier Worthy (WR49) project as the starters, and Worthy at WR49 is a shaky floor to build from. Worse, the draft decisions that shaped this roster lean toward addition by subtraction. Jaxson Dart, taken two full rounds ahead of his ADP, projects as QB11, which is a steep price for a player who lands outside the elite tier. Meanwhile, Mike Washington Jr. was reached on by four rounds and grades out at RB59. Those are the kinds of draft-capital miscalculations that compound, leaving a team with no obvious corrective move and a long season to reflect on them.

yankeehotel is sitting at 43rd percentile and eighth in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division, and the roster construction does not offer much reason for optimism. The draft was almost entirely chalk, 16 of 19 picks coming in right at ADP, which means this team is exactly as good as it looks on paper and not a dollar more. The two major reaches tell the real story: Jalen Coker at WR55 cost two and a half rounds of draft capital to land a player who projects outside the top 50 at his position, and Elijah Arroyo at TE40 was grabbed nearly five rounds early for a player who does not crack the projected starting lineup. Justin Herbert at QB8 and James Cook at RB5 are legitimate building blocks, and the Jared Goff stacks with Amon-Ra St. Brown and Sam LaPorta add some correlation upside. But when your weakest projected starter is J.K. Dobbins at RB36 and your two biggest draft swings both missed, there are simply no levers left to pull and nowhere to hide.

tjunco07 enters 2026 as the Super Smash Bros. Melee division's most credible middling team, which is either reassuring or quietly damning depending on your perspective. The roster projects 46th percentile across the field, division rank seventh, and last season's 53 percent win rate tells the same story: fine, functional, never frightening. The top end is genuinely good, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Drake London at WR7 give this team a ceiling worth defending, and the Patrick Mahomes and Rashee Rice stack adds the kind of correlation upside that can swing a week. But the draft tells on the manager: four major reaches, headlined by Keenan Allen pulled 8.1 rounds ahead of his WR99 projection and Deebo Samuel grabbed 3.1 rounds early at WR70. Those are late-roster spots where you collect value, not where you force sentiment. When Romeo Doubs at WR53 is your weakest projected starter, the margin for error vanishes fast, and tjunco07 spent most of its draft currency in the wrong places to widen it.

NumberKruncher didn't win the draft with one spectacular swing. They won it by consistently coming out ahead, pick after pick, in the quiet ways that don't generate highlight clips but do generate wins. Drake Maye at QB2 slid two spots past his ADP at 2.06, a small gap that amounts to a meaningful edge when the board is moving fast. Brock Bowers at TE1 gives this team a positional advantage at a spot where the drop-off from elite to replacement is steep enough to matter all season. Layer in the Jalen Hurts and DeVonta Smith stack, two projected starters connected at the hip with built-in upside, and NumberKruncher has constructed something that doesn't need a lot of things to go right. At 67th percentile in the tournament and sixth in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division, this is a team that finished 39 percent in 2025 and clearly addressed why. The ceiling isn't outrageous, but the floor is built on real decisions. Cautiously, that earns some respect.

LunathunderPunch didn't build this roster with one dramatic swing, and that's exactly what makes it worth respecting. The real story is a receiving corps that would look at home on a championship contender: Puka Nacua at WR1, A.J. Brown at WR8, and Nico Collins at WR9 aren't lottery tickets, they're projected starters with real résumés. Add Zay Flowers (WR16) and Garrett Wilson (WR17) to that same group and you've got five receivers who could anchor lesser rosters outright. George Kittle at TE9 rounds out a starting core that's genuinely hard to attack. The draft itself was almost aggressively sensible, 17 chalk picks and barely a ripple of deviation, which sounds boring until you look at the result. When Tre Tucker slipped nearly two rounds past his ADP, this team was simply there to take him. Sitting at 67th percentile and fifth in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division, LunathunderPunch isn't a sleeper. It's a team that just quietly did the work.

FantasyMunster did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and hoping. They built it by consistently coming out ahead on value, and the cumulative effect is a squad that sits at the 70th percentile of the field with legitimate upside to climb. The tight end group is where that discipline shows most clearly: Trey McBride, Colston Loveland, Tyler Warren, and Harold Fannin project as TE2, TE3, TE4, and TE6 respectively, and all four are projected starters. Fannin came at a minor reach of under a round, but landing McBride, Loveland, and Warren at or near their ADPs while the rest of the field scrambled for the position is the kind of quiet competence that wins over a long season. Meanwhile, Malik Nabers fell nearly two rounds past his ADP before FantasyMunster grabbed him at WR12, and surrounding him with projected starters like Terry McLaurin, Marvin Harrison Jr., and Jordyn Tyson means the roster has both a high floor and genuine scoring upside. Coming off an 89th-percentile scoring season, this team has the look of one that knows exactly what it is doing.

dynastydorks didn't stumble into a stack and call it a plan. They built one deliberately, anchoring the entire roster ceiling to Joe Burrow and Ja'Marr Chase playing in concert. Burrow lands as QB4 and Chase as WR2, and when those two are humming together, the scoring correlation is the kind of thing that turns a good week into a tournament-advancing one. The rest of the lineup exists to keep the floor survivable while that pairing does its work: Omarion Hampton at RB9, Kyren Williams at RB15, and Travis Etienne at RB18 form a trio of projected starters who quietly keep points on the board regardless of how the stack performs on any given week. The draft itself was disciplined, with Burrow and Williams both sliding past their ADP before dynastydorks scooped them up, meaning the team got its most important pieces at a modest discount. Sitting third in the division and in the top 20 percent of the field, this roster is correctly understood as a live threat, one whose best-case scenario is genuinely high, provided Burrow and Chase show up to the same game.

gracedetes enters 2026 sitting second in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division and at the 86th tournament percentile, and the draft record explains exactly why: zero reaches, seven picks taken past ADP, and three genuine steals. The steals tell the story most cleanly. Quinshon Judkins landed at RB22 despite falling more than two full rounds past his ADP, Jadarian Price came nearly two and a half rounds late at RB26, and Chuba Hubbard slid almost three rounds to finish at RB29, all three of them tucked behind a backfield core that already includes Jonathan Taylor at RB4, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and Derrick Henry at RB12. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Travis Kelce at TE10 give the lineup legitimate upside at the top, and the 2025 résumé, a 69 percent win rate and a 79th percentile scoring finish, suggests gracedetes is not building toward something but simply doing it again with more ammunition. The board kept dropping value and this manager kept picking it up. That is not luck, that is discipline.

DMendy came to the Scott Fish Bowl 2026 draft with a plan and executed it with the kind of quiet confidence that makes other managers want to review their boards. The headline steal is Breece Hall, a projected RB14 who fell more than two full rounds past his ADP before DMendy scooped him at 7.03. Pair that with Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and the top of this roster is genuinely difficult to argue with. Then there is the depth work, where the discipline really shows: Aaron Jones, Kyle Pitts, and David Njoku were all taken meaningfully past their ADPs, accumulating value in rounds where most managers are just filling gaps. The two minor reaches on Jalen McMillan and Darnell Mooney are the kind of thing you notice only because everything else is so clean, and neither is alarming. DMendy sits first in the Super Smash Bros. Melee division and in the 92nd tournament percentile, backed by a 2025 season that finished in the 94th percentile in scoring. The résumé is real, and the 2026 draft only added to it.
