Flawless Victory drafted with patience and discipline, landing 14 chalk picks and barely overpaying anywhere, and the roster they built for their trouble sits in the 7th percentile of the field. That is the draft equivalent of eating clean all week and still gaining weight. The cruelest evidence is at the top: Justin Jefferson (WR6), Nico Collins (WR9), and Rashee Rice (WR13) form a genuinely elite group of projected starters, and yet the team ranks 12th in the Scorpion division. The construction makes sense pick by pick, especially with Sam LaPorta (TE8) and George Kittle (TE9) offering real upside at tight end, but the cumulative result does not reflect the process. C.J. Stroud (QB22) came as a steal at 11.09 against an ADP of 9.08, which sounds fine until you realize he projects as the weakest starter on the roster. Flawless Victory played the value game correctly, got roughly what they paid for at nearly every turn, and still ended up somewhere they absolutely did not intend to go.

JazschiahMcCORTI3 did almost everything right and still finds itself sitting 11th in the Scorpion division, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether drafting well even matters. The value ledger reads cleanly: Zach Charbonnet fell nearly three rounds past his ADP, Jonah Coleman fell nearly as far, and the manager had the discipline to scoop both without flinching. And yet the projected starters tell a grimmer story. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and George Pickens at WR10 are genuinely excellent, but the backfield peaks at Kyle Monangai at RB33, and no amount of late-round patience changes that ceiling. The two major reaches compound the problem: Tyreek Hill was taken nearly seven rounds early and projects at WR77, meaning a pick spent chasing nostalgia is now a projected non-contributor, and Christian Watson was grabbed nearly two rounds ahead of schedule at WR28. The value was real. The results are not. That gap, quiet and merciless, is what defines this roster.

There is a version of this roster that looks deceptively promising on paper. Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Joe Burrow at QB4, and a projectable receiving corps anchored by Carnell Tate and Marvin Harrison Jr. could sketch the outline of a contender. The problem is that the sketch never quite becomes a painting. Tate, the first receiver off the board in the real NFL draft, arrives in Tennessee tasked with making Cam Ward's promise pay off in fantasy, and that is exactly the kind of "we'll need this to work in a big way" gamble that defines this entire build. McCaffrey was the one genuine draft-day bargain, but the rest of the board was chalk, minor reaches, and a Mason Taylor selection that jumped nearly four full rounds ahead of his ADP at TE35. The talent ceiling exists, but alight86 currently sits 10th in the Scorpion Division and in just the 28th percentile of the field, and with no obvious lever left to pull, hoping Tate and Ward figure each other out fast is less a plan than a prayer.

There is a specific kind of fantasy fatigue that sets in when you look at a roster, squint at it from different angles, and keep arriving at the same uncomfortable conclusion. Hanzo's Revenge is sitting ninth in the Scorpion division and projects in just the 28th percentile of the field, and the draft offers little cover for optimism: no steals, no big values, just a wall of chalk punctuated by six minor reaches. The wide receiver group is legitimately impressive, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Davante Adams at WR25 all projecting as starters, and the Caleb Williams and Rome Odunze stack adds a ceiling play that could spike a week. But a fantasy team is only as good as its floor, and when Wan'Dale Robinson at WR47 is your weakest projected starter, the floor has some give in it. The pieces to dream on are present. The pieces to win consistently are not, and at this stage of the draft, there is no obvious move left that changes that math.

dylhunt drafted with genuine discipline. Fourteen chalk picks, almost nothing taken before the market, and the two players who fell to him, Baker Mayfield at QB18 and Rico Dowdle at RB32, arrived at real discounts. The process was sound. The result is an 8th-place division projection and a 36th-percentile tournament standing, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question whether process matters at all. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Drake London at WR7 give this roster a legitimate top end, but the supporting cast collapses in a hurry. The receiver group past London and Tetairoa McMillan reads like a series of long shots, Travis Hunter at WR62, Jaylin Noel at WR83, Chris Bell at WR87, and Hunter Henry projects as a TE18. The floor here is thin, and thin floors get exposed over a full season. dylhunt did almost everything right on draft day and still built a team that is one injury away from genuine trouble. That is not a critique of the manager. That is just a cruel draft.

Laces Out enters 2026 parked at 43rd percentile and seventh in the Scorpion Division, and the draft log doesn't offer much reason for optimism. The roster hinges on Josh Allen and De'Von Achane anchoring the top of the lineup, but after those two the projected starters grade out as a collection of WR24-through-WR51 receivers who are solid enough and not much more. What makes the situation harder to defend is the draft capital spent getting there: three major reaches, including Rashid Shaheed pulled nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP and David Njoku taken more than two rounds early, suggest the manager was chasing upside that the board wasn't offering. Justin Herbert is the most interesting wildcard, though his arrow is genuinely hard to read, as new offensive coordinator Mike McDaniel could unlock him or the Chargers could simply keep winning pretty games with the ball on the ground. With no obvious reclamation project on the bench and a draft that leaned on chalk and paid too much for the exceptions, Laces Out looks like a team that has already pulled most of its levers.

Pound the Rock finished in the 89th percentile of scoring last season and returns with a roster that sits almost exactly at the tournament median, 49th percentile, which is either quietly encouraging or quietly alarming depending on how you squint at it. The foundation is real: Ashton Jeanty, Omarion Hampton, and Derrick Henry project as RB7, RB9, and RB12 respectively, and Trey McBride at TE2 gives this team a genuine anchor at a position where most managers are guessing. But the margins that decide a team like this live at the edges, and the edges are where the questions pile up. Jayden Reed projects as WR48 and is the weakest projected starter on the roster. Jordan Love, taken two rounds past his ADP, carries a QB17 projection that looks fine until you remember this format rewards upside. MarShawn Lloyd was the one significant draft overreach, taken five-plus rounds early, and at RB66 he needs to earn that investment. Jeanty and McBride can carry a week. They cannot carry a season.

QB1JasonStreet spent draft capital like someone who had done their homework and refused to apologize for it. Five minor reaches, two major ones, and yet the roster that came out the other end sits at the 52nd percentile with a genuine shot to climb. The centerpiece of that argument is Drake Maye, a projected QB2 taken at 2.11 when the board suggested patience, and Brock Purdy, a QB13 who slid more than a round past his ADP and landed as a clear starter. Those two moves alone give this team a quarterback room that most managers would trade half their draft for. The wilder bet is Luther Burden, a WR22 projection riding a wave of offseason hype after a blistering finish to 2025, with head coach Ben Johnson drawing comparisons to Amon-Ra St. Brown in training camp. Whether Burden actually cashes that ticket is unknown, but QB1JasonStreet paid for the version that does. This

roster is not built on luck dressed up as conviction. It is built on conviction that happened to look like luck on draft day.

kiwicoachklein lands at 65th percentile and fourth in the Scorpion Division, which sounds middling until you look at how the roster was actually assembled. The defining move was patience at quarterback: Jalen Hurts fell two and a half rounds past his ADP, and kiwicoachklein was waiting at pick 6.06 to grab a QB9 projection at a significant discount. Pair that with Lamar Jackson as QB3, and the top of this roster has genuine teeth. The running back group carries some cost, as Breece Hall and Josh Jacobs were both taken roughly a round and a half before their ADPs suggested they would be available, but the result is a projected RB14 and RB16 anchoring the backfield alongside Travis Etienne, who came at a round of savings. Add Brock Bowers as the TE1 at the top of the tight end group and this is a team built on consistent accumulation of value, not lottery tickets. No single splash moment, just a series of draft decisions that compounded in the right direction.

bigtnev sits third in the Scorpion division and in the 80th percentile of the field, and the draft arc that got them there is pretty straightforward: they just kept coming out ahead on value. James Cook at RB5 slipped past his ADP, Dalton Kincaid fell nearly a round and a half before bigtnev scooped him up at TE11, and Bo Nix, who has quietly been a top-10 fantasy quarterback in back-to-back seasons and now gets Jaylen Waddle added to his supporting cast in Denver, came a full round late at QB15. None of those moves look like lottery tickets. They look like a manager who did the homework and let the board come to them. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 anchor a backfield group that gives this team a ceiling most rosters in the field simply cannot match. The Kenyon Sadiq reach at TE21 is the one moment where bigtnev got ahead of the consensus, but with Tucker Kraft already locked in as a projected starter, it reads more like confidence than desperation.

sty1ee did not win the draft with one electric moment. They won it pick by pick, round by round, in exactly the way that holds up over a long season. The receiver group is the engine: Puka Nacua at WR1, A.J. Brown at WR8, Malik Nabers at WR12, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 form a projected starting core that most managers would trade their entire draft for, and Zay Flowers at WR16 is waiting behind them. Patrick Mahomes arrived at QB12 roughly a round and a half after his average draft position, which is the kind of quiet win that separates disciplined drafters from everyone else. The draft-versus-ADP ledger tells the same story: fourteen picks at fair value, two that came in under market, and zero major reaches anywhere on the board. That adds up to a roster sitting second in the Scorpion division and at the 87th percentile of the field, which tracks almost exactly with what a patient, process-driven draft deserves to produce.

Remember The Tight Ends sits first in the Scorpion Division and in the 95th percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly why: two steals, four values, and zero reaches of any kind. That kind of discipline is rare, and it shows up where it counts. Colston Loveland fell 1.3 rounds past his ADP and landed at pick 3.12, Tyler Warren dropped nearly a full round to 4.01, and together with Harold Fannin, Kyle Pitts, Travis Kelce, and Mark Andrews they form a projected starting group that reads like a fever dream. Fannin is the most intriguing piece here. He outplayed a veteran teammate last year en route to a TE6 projection, and with that teammate now gone, his ceiling in the red zone looks real even with the Browns' uncertain QB situation. Tyrone Tracy arriving at 18.01 when his ADP sat at 14.09 was the cherry on top of a draft that never panicked and never overpaid. Jakobi Meyers is the weakest projected starter, and even that feels like a minor footnote.
