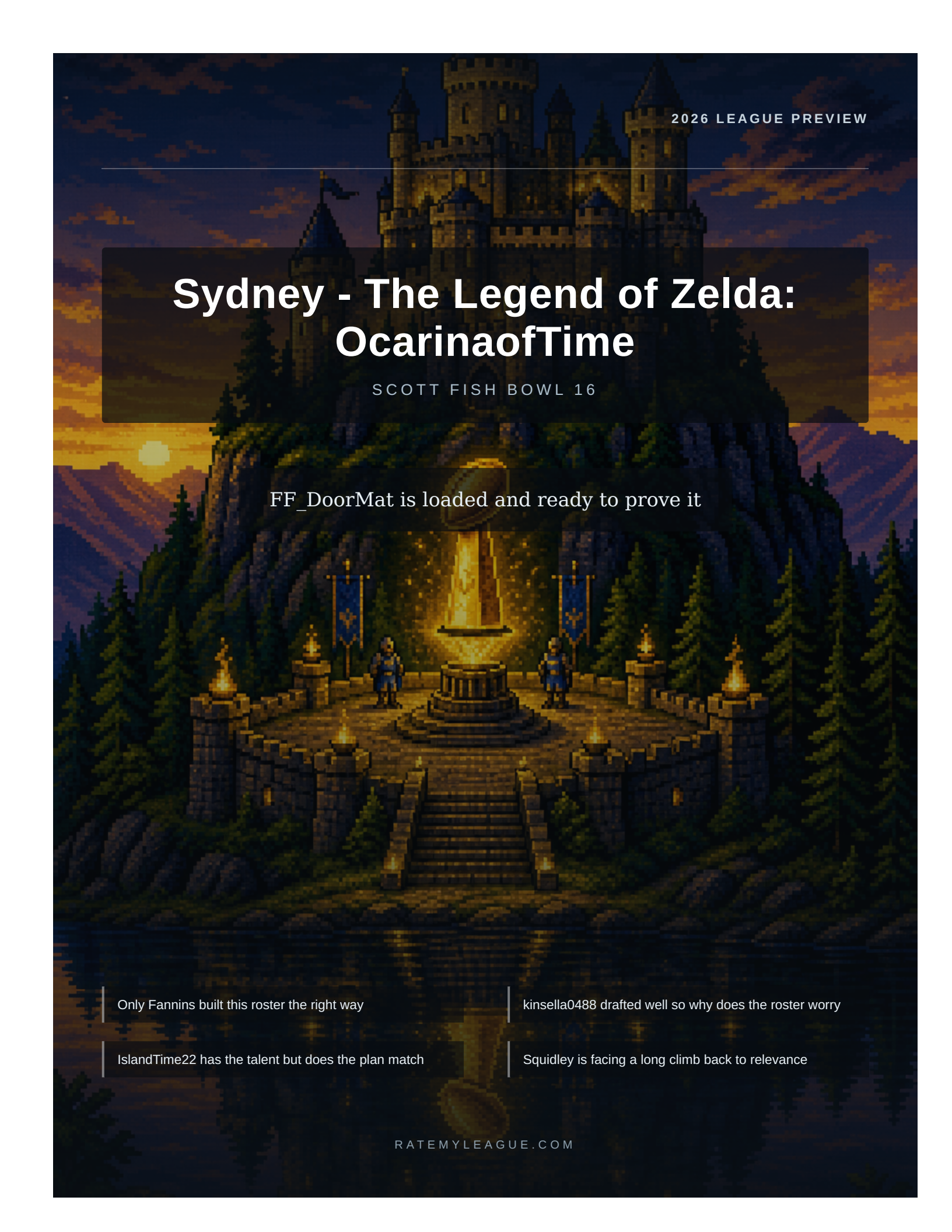

MaxQuinn sits 12th in the division and in the bottom fifth of the tournament field, and the roster grade makes it easy to see why. The quarterback group is legitimately strong, with Jayden Daniels as a QB5 and Jalen Hurts as a QB9, and Trey McBride anchors the tight end group as a TE2. But strength at quarterback and tight end only carries you so far when the receivers grading out behind that top line are Alec Pierce at WR32 and a cast that falls off a cliff after him, and Pierce himself is currently on the PUP list following offseason ankle surgery, meaning he could miss the first four games if he does not clear by late August. The running backs are a crowded middle-class block, with Josh Jacobs, Javonte Williams, and Travis Etienne all clustering between RB16 and RB18. There is no elite weekly difference-maker in that group, and no obvious move that fixes it. This roster is what it is, and what it is projects to finish near the bottom.

kinsella0488 played the value game about as well as a manager can play it, and the ledger still does not balance, which is the kind of outcome that makes you question the whole enterprise. Fifteen chalk picks, a steal in Brian Robinson at RB45 taken two-plus rounds after his ADP, and Josh Downs falling nearly two rounds into the lap at WR46, and yet the team sits 11th in the Ocarina of Time division and in the 22nd percentile of the field. The receiver corps is genuinely strong, CeeDee Lamb at WR5, Drake London at WR7, Malik Nabers at WR12, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 anchoring a projected starting group that most managers would not argue with. But Chimere Dike was taken 5.2 rounds early at pick 14.01, a reach so aggressive it consumed capital that could have shored up the back end. The 2025 finish of 18-18 and 52nd percentile in scoring suggests a team that competes without ever quite threatening, and nothing here dramatically changes that trajectory.

TheKetaKid did almost everything right at the draft table, and the roster still lands 10th in the Ocarina of Time division, which is the kind of outcome that makes you want to stare at the ceiling. The values are real: Chris Rodriguez, Jonah Coleman, and Antonio Williams all fell past their ADPs, and Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Chris Olave (WR11), and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) give this team a legitimate top-end receiving corps. The problem is not how the draft was managed, it is what the market gave back. Discount running backs are only bargains if the discounts compound into something useful, and Rodriguez at RB48, Kamara at RB50, and Coleman at RB51 are three versions of the same modest ceiling. The receiver depth is genuinely impressive on paper, but depth does not score points and the players who will actually drive this team's floor, the quarterbacks and tight ends, project as afterthoughts. TheKetaKid squeezed value out of a draft and still ended up with a roster that feels perpetually one tier short of dangerous.

JSN Lives enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Ocarina of Time division and at just the 34th tournament percentile, and nothing about how this roster was built suggests those numbers are about to improve. The one undeniable weapon is Jaxon Smith-Njigba, a WR3 projection that gives the team a genuine star to build around, but the supporting cast fades fast. Jameson Williams projects as WR21 and pairs nicely with a Jared Goff stack, yet that stack only matters if Goff delivers on a QB16 projection that has disappointed managers before. The deeper problem is the draft process itself: the manager found two values across the entire board but also burned capital on reaches, most painfully Hunter Henry, taken three full rounds ahead of his ADP for a TE18 projection that simply does not justify the cost. Tyler Warren at TE4 anchors the tight end group, but reaching nearly a round early for him compounded the problem. When a roster grades this far down the field and the draft offered almost no surplus value to work with, the margin for error disappears entirely.

Depth Perception enters 2026 sitting eighth in the division and projected at just the 37th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet does not offer much reason for optimism. The top of the roster is genuinely appealing, Josh Allen at QB1 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 give this team a real ceiling, but the floor collapses fast. The wide receiver group grades out weak, and the projected weakest starter is Khalil Shakir at WR51, a player the manager actually had to reach for, taking him 1.6 rounds before his ADP suggested anyone else cared. That is the kind of move you make when you are patching gaps, not building depth. The draft as a whole leaned heavily on chalk, with 12 straight-ADP selections and two major reaches, including Jalen Coker at WR55 grabbed more than two rounds early. When a roster grades near the bottom and the draft decisions trend toward overpaying rather than uncovering value, there is no obvious lever left to pull. Depth Perception is not a team with hidden upside waiting to bloom, it is a team hoping Allen carries them somewhere the rest of the roster cannot.

Squidley enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Ocarina of Time division and projected at just the 39th percentile of the field, and the roster does not hide why. The tight end group is genuinely elite, with Brock Bowers at TE1, Travis Kelce at TE10, and Jake Ferguson at TE12 all projected to start, but elite at one position only buys so many wins in a positionless format when the rest of the lineup is scraping. Rashee Rice, Zay Flowers, and Garrett Wilson give the receiver corps a respectable core, though James Conner at RB56 is doing no favors at the bottom of the depth chart. The draft offered no relief: zero steals, zero values, and a roster built almost entirely on chalk, capped by pulling Brandon Aiyuk at WR81 nearly three and a half rounds before his ADP suggested anyone else wanted him. With no undervalued assets quietly waiting to outperform and no obvious trade chip to convert the tight end surplus into a missing piece elsewhere, Squidley looks like a team that built its house on one very solid corner and hoped the rest of the foundation would figure itself out.

Michael00014 finished 2026 exactly where the numbers pointed: somewhere in the middle, alive but not dangerous, a team that lived and died by thin margins. The top of the roster is genuinely good, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 giving the lineup a foundation that most teams in the Ocarina of Time division would trade for, and the Caleb Williams to Rome Odunze stack adds a ceiling play that can win a week outright. But the margins get uncomfortable fast. Jerry Jeudy, reached three-plus rounds early, projects as WR66. Tyreek Hill, reached three-and-a-half rounds early, lands at WR77. Those picks represent real cost at the back of the draft, slots that could have shored up depth instead of chasing names past their expiration dates. Ladd McConkey at WR20 and Bucky Irving at RB21 were genuine values that soften the blow, but the draft chart still leans chalk, and

a 42nd-percentile tournament rank is the honest verdict on what that produced: a team that needs everything to break right, because almost nothing breaks obviously wrong.

marc01 didn't find one needle in a haystack and ride it to glory. This roster was built pick by pick, and the results show it. The foundation is genuinely difficult to argue with: Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give marc01 a top-tier backfield presence before you even get to Kyren Williams at RB15 and TreVeyon Henderson at RB19. Layer Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 on top of that and the core of this lineup is the kind that makes opponents check the waiver wire out of anxiety. The draft was mostly chalk, which sounds boring until you realize chalk means not missing, and marc01 largely didn't miss. The one reach worth discussing is Jack Bech, taken nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP, a gamble on upside that could either look prescient or quietly drain a late-round slot. Sitting fifth in the division and at the 46th percentile tournament-wide, marc01 has the talent to climb, and a starting group headlined by Jeanty, Barkley, and Chase gives every reason to believe that climb is coming.

IslandTime22 finished last season at the 12th percentile and came back swinging, and the draft board suggests they swung recklessly. Three major reaches, two minor ones, zero steals. And yet the roster that came out the other side is sitting at the 67th percentile in the field, which means either IslandTime22 knows something the algorithm doesn't, or they got away with something. The crown jewel is Bijan Robinson at RB2, who somehow slid four picks past his ADP and landed in their lap. That kind of fortune can paper over a lot of sins. Then there is Bhayshul Tuten, a reach at RB25 on the surface, but with Travis Etienne now in New Orleans and Jacksonville's backfield genuinely open, that pick starts to look like conviction rather than chaos. Lamar Jackson stacking with Mark Andrews gives the team a high floor on any given week. The wide receiver group is thin by projection, but in a positionless format, Bijan Robinson and Omarion Hampton at RB9 can carry a lineup before the receivers even

dress. IslandTime22 reached repeatedly and landed anyway. That is either a philosophy or a miracle, and both are worth watching.

FF_DoorMat sits third in the Ocarina of Time division and lands in the 78th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly why: zero reaches, two steals, two values, and a roster that reads like a clinic in patience and preparation. The headliners are real, Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 anchoring a top-end group that would make most managers envious, but the discipline shows up deepest in the late rounds. Jordan Mason, projected RB41, fell over three full rounds past his ADP before FF_DoorMat scooped him at 16.10, and Kenneth Gainwell, projected RB34, slipped nearly three rounds before landing at 15.03. Neither pick required a gamble, just attention. Patrick Mahomes and Dallas Goedert round out the projected starters as passable contributors, and Nico Collins at WR9 gives the receiving corps genuine upside. After a rough 2025 at the 10th percentile in scoring, FF_DoorMat built a 2026 roster that looks nothing like a team running from a bad memory. It looks like a team that did its homework.

samtaclaus didn't win the draft with one thunderbolt pick. They won it by finding the edge over and over again. Drake Maye lands as QB2 after sliding nearly a full round past his ADP, and he comes paired with A.J. Brown, a WR8 projection that turns the stack into one of the more dangerous QB-receiver combinations in the field. Puka Nacua checks in at WR1, giving this roster a genuine top-of-the-board anchor, and Emeka Egbuka at WR18 and Carnell Tate at WR29 keep the quality from falling off the moment you go one name deeper. The draft wasn't flawless, Jacoby Brissett cost nearly three rounds of draft capital before his ADP, which stings on a QB28 projection, but the rest of the board more than absorbs that. Thirteen chalk picks sounds like a passive draft until you notice where the other picks landed, three values against one major reach is a favorable ledger in any room. The 88th-percentile scoring from 2025 wasn't luck. This team is built to do it again.

Only Fannins sat at 89th percentile and first in the division not because of one splashy pick but because the draft kept coming out ahead. Jaxson Dart is the clearest example: a QB11 projection sitting there at 7.11, nearly two and a half rounds past his ADP, and this team simply walked up and took him. That kind of disciplined patience, repeated across a roster, is how you build a lead before the season starts. The tight end group quietly anchors everything, with Colston Loveland (TE3), Harold Fannin (TE6), and Sam LaPorta (TE8) all projected as starters. Fannin is the most interesting of the three: he outplayed veteran David Njoku last season, the Browns cut Njoku in free agency, and while Cleveland's quarterback situation remains genuinely ugly, any offensive improvement at all opens the door to more red zone work for a TE6 who has already proven he belongs. Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and Kenneth Walker III (RB10) give the backfield a similar ceiling. The two major reaches at the back end of the draft are the lone blemishes, but they barely dent a roster this consistently built.
