As the 2025 fantasy football season looms for Team sday, hope seems like a distant memory. Last year's middling performance, landing them in the 52nd percentile for scoring, now feels like the halcyon days when compared to their current predicament. They're anchored at the bottom of their division and languishing in the bleak 6th percentile overall. While the team boasts the strongest running back corps among its peers—with Saquon Barkley leading the charge as RB2 and solid contributions from Chase Brown, Kenneth Walker III, James Conner, and Aaron Jones—their receiving options leave much to be desired. Calvin Ridley, Jayden Reed, Darnell Mooney, Keon Coleman, and Marvin Mims collectively form a brittle backbone for their passing attack, with Mooney unfortunately positioned as a starter despite being WR51. The team's decision to reach for players like Chase

Brown and James Conner, ahead of their average draft positions, could come back to haunt them. Even Dallas Goedert was snatched up earlier than anticipated, perhaps in a desperate attempt to patch up glaring gaps. As they enter the season, Team sday faces an uphill battle against stronger opponents, hoping their stable of running backs can carry them through while their fragile receiving lineup tries to hold the line.

As mdl86 gears up for the 2025 season, the shadows of last year's mediocrity loom large. With a division ranking of 11 and languishing in the 13th percentile overall, the team faces an uphill battle in a field teeming with talent. While their quarterback and running back positions offer little to write home about—Cam Ward, Jared Goff, and Matthew Stafford struggling to impress, and Breece Hall carrying the backfield burden alone—their wide receiver lineup emerges as a formidable force. Led by the electrifying Justin Jefferson and supported by stalwarts like Amon-Ra St. Brown and A.J. Brown, they boast a receiving corps that is the envy of their division. Yet, even this strength wavers at the margins with Tre Harris penciled in as a starter despite being the weakest link. Some draft decisions raised eyebrows—taking Jared Goff and Matthew Stafford earlier than anticipated, while

other selections like A.J. Brown and Cam Ward seem to be strokes of genius. The tight end position remains a sore spot, with Mike Gesicki doing little to inspire confidence. As they wade into another year of fierce competition, mdl86 hopes that their aerial arsenal can compensate for deficits elsewhere, but the path ahead looks daunting.

As the Ragmann team braces for the 2025 fantasy football season, the anticipation around maintaining their past dominance is dampened by some glaring weaknesses. Last year's impressive 93rd percentile finish and 89% win rate now seem more like distant memories than achievable goals. The quarterback duo of Lamar Jackson and Justin Fields promises to bring some firepower, but elsewhere the outlook is more concerning. The wide receiver corps, with Matthew Golden as a projected starter, is notably underwhelming, especially when compared to last season's stellar performances. Despite the strong tight end lineup featuring George Kittle, Travis Kelce, and others in this TE Premium setup, the overall balance appears skewed. Running backs Josh Jacobs and Isiah Pacheco face significant hurdles in carrying the load, while Najee Harris, acquired at a seemingly beneficial draft position, may struggle to deliver the needed punch. The team's tight positional

reaches for Zay Flowers and Jakobi Meyers overshadow the perceived value drafts, potentially underscoring the anxieties of their current 29th percentile ranking. While the small stack bonus with Lamar Jackson and Zay Flowers provides a glimmer of hope, a climb out of the bottom rungs of the division will require more than just strategic optimism—it will demand unexpected breakout performances from those often overlooked on the depth chart.
