McCarthy and Sam Darnold might present risks. With the league offering fierce competition, Jeanty and the Boys need to harness their strengths and address any vulnerabilities to climb higher both within their division and on the broader stage. The journey may not be straightforward, but a combination of strategic plays and standout individual performances could turn the tide as the season unfolds.

The decision to draft Zack Moss significantly ahead of his average draft position could be a gamble that may or may not pay off. Overall, tjunco07's season could teeter between the familiar struggles of last year or a surprising rise if key players deliver beyond expectations. Their strategy will need to be as sharp as ever to navigate the competitive landscape.
