As the CarpentierNFL team gears up for the 2025 fantasy football season, they find themselves in a familiar position, aiming to claw their way back from last year's disappointing performance. some savvy draft picks, they also gambled with early reaches, particularly with Michael Penix Jr., which could either invigorate or undermine their season. Entering the tournament and division play with cautious optimism, CarpentierNFL is hopeful for improvement, yet aware of the hard work needed to ascend from their current standings.

team's only saving grace, even if Jayden Higgins' inclusion as a starter feels more like a desperate attempt to win an obscure game of bingo. Meanwhile, the tight end situation remains so weak it might as well be a black hole on the roster. As gingernash embarks on this season, their strategic player reaches and stack bonuses will need to work miracles if they hope to rise above their current status of merely filling space in the fantasy landscape.


