There is no charitable read available for schiltbomb, and the draft board makes that case for you. Four major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and the philosophy here was panicked and expensive. Kyren Williams came off the board nearly two rounds early at pick 3.11, which is the kind of commitment to a RB15 that forecloses better options. Jalen McMillan was grabbed a full four rounds ahead of his ADP and projects as WR59, a player who in a positionless format needs to beat out your own starters to see the field and almost certainly will not. The one genuine value on the roster, Malik Willis at QB24, fell a round past his ADP and landed in schiltbomb's lap anyway, which is less a sign of shrewdness than a reminder that even a stopped clock is right twice a day. The team sits 12th in the division and in the bottom five percent of the tournament, and nothing in this draft suggests those projections are being pessimistic.

Last year, An Adventurer Like You carved through the Scott Fish Bowl at the 93rd percentile, and now they are sitting at 6th percentile in projections and 11th in the division, which is the kind of fall that deserves a moment of silence. The skeleton of what went right is still here: Jonathan Taylor at RB4, Saquon Barkley at RB8, Josh Jacobs at RB16 form a genuinely fearsome core, and the depth behind them is real. But this is a positionless format, and the players outside that backfield are doing the team no favors. Michael Wilson checks in at WR39, Jerry Jeudy at WR66, and Max Klare is unranked entirely, which means the manager is leaning hard on a single dimension to carry the load. The draft did not help close the gap either, with Barkley taken nearly a full round early and Jacobs pulled 1.5 rounds before consensus. The reputation of a 93rd-percentile season is a warm coat in a blizzard. The projections suggest this team will feel every bit of the cold.

J'zargo enters 2026 sitting at the 30th percentile of the field and dead last in the Skyrim division, and nothing in this draft log suggests a reversal is coming. The receiving corps looks genuinely promising on paper, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba projecting as WR3 and Ladd McConkey slotting in alongside stack partner Justin Herbert, but the draft process that built this roster should worry anyone betting on J'zargo's ceiling. Four major reaches include Herbert himself, taken 1.2 rounds early at pick 2.07, and both Brandon Aiyuk and Keon Coleman were pulled off the board well ahead of consensus, with Coleman arriving a full 3.5 rounds before his ADP. That is not aggressive draft strategy, that is paying a premium in a format where every slot costs you something else. Sam Darnold falling nearly three and a half rounds to become the lone steal of the day says more about the scarcity of J'zargo's wins than it does about any clever maneuvering. The upside is real but narrow, and the margin for error already looks exhausted before the season begins.

There is no gentle way to say this: Joe Buck Yourself is projecting near the bottom of the Skyrim division in 2026, and the draft did not leave much rope to climb back up. The receiver group is genuinely impressive, with CeeDee Lamb, Malik Nabers, and Tetairoa McMillan all projecting as starters and providing a real floor, but in a positionless format, ceiling matters just as much as depth, and that ceiling gets punched down hard by a quarterback situation that projects Fernando Mendoza at QB27, Geno Smith at QB30, and Mac Jones at QB39. That is not a competition for a starting job, that is a race to the bottom of the depth chart. The draft compounded the problem, producing two major reaches and zero steals, with Jordan James taken nearly four rounds ahead of his ADP and Jake Ferguson pulled six rounds into a draft where better value was still sitting on the board. Coming off a 76th-percentile scoring season in 2025, the talent erosion here is real, and right now there is no obvious lever left to pull.

kczat did everything right on draft day and ended up with a roster that somehow still lands in the bottom third of the field. That is the cruelest trick in fantasy football, and it is happening to this team in real time. The discipline was real: Tyler Warren at TE4 slipped past his ADP by nearly a full round, Tucker Kraft at TE5 fell a full round, and the board was worked with patience throughout. Three values, thirteen chalk picks, zero major reaches. The process was clean. The product is not. The top of this roster hinges on De'Von Achane and Drake London, both projected well enough but both taken as minor reaches, which means kczat paid a slight premium for the upside that was supposed to justify everything else. Jordan Love stacking with Kraft is a nice touch, but Love is a QB17 projection, and the stack only works if Love outperforms that number by a meaningful margin. kczat did not make bad decisions. The decisions just did not combine into a good team, and at 36th percentile, the draft board does not care about your process.

Ruins Edge sits at the 49th percentile, which is exactly as precarious as it sounds. The ceiling is real: Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Brock Bowers at TE1 are genuine difference-makers, and Chase Brown at RB11 and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 give this roster a credible scoring floor. The problem is what happens when the margins tighten, because they will. Rhamondre Stevenson projects as the weakest starter at RB31, which is fine until Jefferson or Bowers has a quiet week and Stevenson's ceiling becomes the story. The draft was mostly chalk, 15 picks in line with consensus, and the one major reach, Pat Bryant at WR86 taken nearly four rounds early, is the kind of decision that looks bold in August and quietly costs a manager wins in November. Ruins Edge went 26-10 last season and scored in the 92nd percentile, so the pedigree is legitimate. But pedigree does not automatically survive a roster where the distance between the stars and the depth is this pronounced. Seventh in the division feels right. So does the argument that a few bounces could move them in either direction.

The Sweetroll Thieves finished 2025 in the 12th percentile and came into this draft with something to prove, then spent it like a manager who had already made up their mind. Four major reaches, four minor reaches, zero steals. On paper that is a pattern. On the roster it looks like a plan. Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, Joe Burrow projects as QB4, and the two stack together in a way that turns one good decision into two good decisions every week the offense hums. The rest of the wide receiver corps runs deep enough that Quentin Johnston, the projected weakest starter at WR41, is still a credible starting option. Harold Fannin projects as TE6, and while the Browns' quarterback situation gives reasonable pause, Fannin's target share is his own after outperforming David Njoku last year and watching Njoku depart in free agency. The reaches that felt reckless on draft night, including Jack

Bech pulled six full rounds ahead of consensus, will either look like conviction by October or quietly disappear into the footnotes. Right now the roster says conviction.

The Winterholds High Elves didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by being right more often than everyone else in the room. The foundation is genuinely elite: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this roster a level of top-end production that most managers in this field would trade their late rounds to acquire, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 only deepens the advantage. The real craftwork, though, shows up in the later rounds, where the manager turned late-round patience into legitimate assets. Kyler Murray fell nearly three rounds past his ADP before landing here at pick 11.03, and Cam Ward came along two picks later in round 12, each projecting as a viable starter at QB19 and QB23 respectively. Thirteen chalk picks and zero major reaches across the whole board suggest a manager who trusted their board and didn't panic, which is the quietest way to build a winning roster. Sitting at the 56th percentile with a 64 percent win rate last year, the High Elves aren't a story about one audacious swing. They're a story about not making mistakes.

The Greybeards landed at 67th percentile and fourth in their division, which sounds modest until you look at how the roster was actually built. This was not a team defined by one splashy pick but by a draft that kept finding market inefficiencies throughout. Chris Olave fell nearly a full round past his ADP and came back as a projected WR11 starter. Courtland Sutton slid almost two rounds and still projects as a starter. Khalil Shakir was available a round and a half late. Four values across the draft, each one marginal in isolation, stack up into a roster that quietly outpaced expectations at multiple spots. Add Josh Allen at QB1 as a projected starter and a tight end group headlined by Colston Loveland at TE3 and George Kittle at TE9, and the Greybeards have legitimate difference-makers at positions that tend to separate winning rosters from the middle of the pack. Nobody here won the draft in one pick. They just kept winning it a little, over and over, and that adds up.

Ulfric's Stormcloaks finished 2026 sitting at the 83rd percentile of the field, and the draft record tells you exactly how they got there: fourteen chalk picks, two values, one steal, and almost nothing wasted. The philosophy was patient and precise. Patrick Mahomes at QB12 slipped a full round past his ADP, and Bo Nix at QB15 fell an extraordinary two and a half rounds before this team snapped him up, giving the Stormcloaks one of the more quietly loaded quarterback situations in the division. Pair Mahomes with Rashee Rice, who projects at WR13, and you have a stack that can carry a week by itself. Meanwhile, Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 gives the roster an elite anchor, and Nico Collins at WR9 and Luther Burden at WR22 round out a starting group with genuine upside throughout. The two major reaches in the late rounds are real, but they are also the kind of low-cost gambles that barely register when the foundation is this solid. Third in the division and deserving of every bit of it.

The Riften Stealers arrived at the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft looking like a team that had done its homework the night before and actually understood it. Landing Drake Maye at QB2 a full nine-tenths of a round past his market price is the kind of quiet coup that wins championships in February, and pairing him with a receiver corps anchored by Puka Nacua at WR1 and George Pickens at WR10 means the Stealers are not hoping to contend, they are built to. David Montgomery, plucked more than a round late, slots in as a reliable projected starter and represents exactly the kind of unsexy, high-floor value that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. Seventeen chalk picks tell you this manager knew the board and trusted it, never chasing, never panicking. The 2025 campaign produced an 89 percent win rate and a 100th percentile scoring finish, and nothing about this construction suggests a regression is coming. Second in the division, 95th percentile in the field, and almost nothing to argue with.

The Winterhold Wizards sit atop the Elder Scrolls V: Skyrim division and in the 97th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly why: one steal, five values, and only a handful of reaches across the whole board. That kind of consistent execution is harder than it looks, and the results show up at the top of the roster. Dak Prescott, a QB7 projection, slid more than two full rounds past his ADP before the Wizards scooped him at 5.10, and Trey McBride, a TE2, came off the board nearly a round late at 2.03. Those two picks alone set a foundation most managers would build an entire strategy around. Jalen Hurts at QB9 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 stack behind them, and Amon-Ra St. Brown projects as WR4. The 2025 campaign was a rough one at 33rd percentile scoring, but this roster looks nothing like that squad. When a manager drafts this efficiently this often, the record tends to follow eventually.
