Triforce Grants the Ship drafted like someone who showed up to a charity auction determined to overpay for everything in the room. The clearest evidence sits at the top of the board: Colston Loveland and Tyler Warren, projected TE3 and TE4, were taken 0.7 and 1.2 rounds ahead of their ADPs respectively, burning premium capital to secure a position that rewards patience. The rest of the draft didn't tighten up from there. Parker Washington, a WR35, was yanked 2.4 rounds early in the sixth, a reach so aggressive it distorted everything downstream. The roster that resulted features four major reaches and zero steals against a backdrop of genuinely thin projected production, with the team sitting third in the division and in just the third percentile of the field. Justin Herbert pairs with Ladd McConkey for a stack, which is fine, but Herbert projects as QB8 and McConkey as WR20, meaning the team leaned into a moderately upside pairing while consistently overpaying for everyone else. This draft didn't just go sideways. It went sideways on purpose.

The McCringleberry Pumps enter 2026 sitting third in the Legend of Zelda division and in the bottom ten percent of the field, which tracks, because this draft reads like a man who had one good idea and then repeated it twice more before anyone could stop him. Sam LaPorta, taken at pick 2.05 against an ADP of 6.01, is a TE8 projection, which is fine. Harold Fannin, reached 1.7 rounds early for a TE6 projection, is also fine. Jake Ferguson, reached 2.0 rounds early for a TE12 projection, is where fine quietly becomes a cry for help. The manager burned the heart of this draft on tight ends while the wide receiver group settled into a long, gray corridor of WR46-through-WR87 depth that would be perfectly acceptable behind a transcendent top end and is instead carrying the freight itself. Josh Allen is genuinely great, and the Allen / D.J. Moore stack gives this team a real ceiling, but zero steals and three major reaches on one position is not a philosophy. It is an apology waiting to happen.

Sitting 10th in the Legend of Zelda division and hovering around the 44th percentile of the field, bthomas518 enters 2026 without a clear path to contention. The roster has pieces, sure, but the gaps at the top are hard to paper over. Bo Nix projects as QB15, which is serviceable, and Brock Bowers at TE1 is a genuine anchor, but beyond De'Von Achane at RB6 the backfield falls off a cliff to Jordan Mason at RB41 and Demond Claiborne at RB63. The receiving corps has volume but not enough pop, with Tetairoa McMillan projecting WR15 and Luther Burden at WR22 as the headliners and KC Concepcion at WR50 projected as the weakest starter. The draft did not generate the upside needed to change the story either, producing zero steals and leaning heavily on chalk while burning a significant reach on Jameson Williams, pulled nearly two rounds ahead of his WR21 projection. Last year's 61-percent win rate built something worth protecting. This roster, as currently constituted, looks more likely to erode it.

BusterJacoby drafted almost perfectly by the numbers and still landed at ninth in the Legend of Zelda division, projecting out at just the 48th percentile of the field. That is the draft equivalent of following every rule of the road and still missing your exit. The receiver group looks genuinely dangerous, with Ceedee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) anchoring a group that also includes Malik Nabers (WR12), and Davante Adams (WR25) arrived as the one player who actually fell past his ADP. But that's roughly where the optimism runs dry. The quarterback situation leans heavily on Jalen Hurts (QB9) and Jaxson Dart (QB11), with Dart stacked alongside Nabers as a floor-raising hedge. The running back group projects with RJ Harvey as the weakest projected starter at RB28, and the tight end options top out at Hunter Henry (TE18). Eighteen chalk picks and one mild value does not build upside, it builds median, and median finished 25th percentile last season. The value game was played correctly. The ceiling just wasn't there to find.

Bear Force One enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Legend of Zelda division, and the roster offers very little reason for optimism. The draft is the clearest culprit: three major reaches in a single draft is the kind of aggressiveness that only looks smart in hindsight, and hindsight is not being kind here. Zach Charbonnet at RB42 was taken nearly three rounds early, Jaydon Blue at RB70 came off the board more than seven rounds ahead of consensus, and Skyler Bell at WR103 was grabbed six rounds before the market agreed he was worth a pick. That is a lot of draft capital spent chasing upside that has not materialized in the projections. Joe Burrow and Jaxon Smith-Njigba give the team a legitimate foundation at the top, and Travis Kelce and George Kittle form a credible TE group, but the supporting cast grades out thin enough that Bear Force One is projected at just the 50th percentile of the field. There is no obvious lever left to pull, and the standings are likely to reflect that.

TopDynastyTakes sits at the 57th percentile and ranks seventh in the Legend of Zelda division, which is about as median as it gets, the kind of team that wins the matchups it should and drops the ones it shouldn't. The ceiling here is real: Drake London at WR7, Trey McBride at TE2, and Chris Olave at WR11 give this roster genuine top-end pop, and Jeremiyah Love projecting as RB13 after sliding 1.4 rounds past his ADP is the kind of quiet value that can quietly swing a playoff race. The problem is the floor. Garrett Wilson, taken nearly a full round early, is projecting as WR17, so the reach has to hold up. Brock Purdy and C.J. Stroud anchor the quarterback spots, and Stroud at QB22 is the weakest projected starter on the roster, a number that is fine until it suddenly isn't. No steals, mostly chalk, a couple of minor overreaches. TopDynastyTakes is not built to run away from anyone in this division. It is built to survive thin margins, and that is exactly the kind of team that either sneaks into the money or loses by a point and stares at the ceiling for a week.

Hyrule Happy Hour did not build this roster on one flashy swing, and that restraint is exactly what makes it interesting. The backbone here is a receiving corps that would make most managers in this tournament envious, anchored by Puka Nacua at WR1 and Nico Collins at WR9, with George Pickens at WR10 right behind them. That is three projected top-ten receivers before you even get to Emeka Egbuka at WR18 or Christian Watson at WR28, and the depth keeps coming. The draft itself was almost aggressively undramatic, 16 chalk picks out of 19 total, which sounds boring until you realize that boring drafts built around good players tend to win leagues. The one genuine reach worth flagging is Keon Coleman at WR91, taken three rounds before his ADP suggested he would be available, but a manager this methodical everywhere else has probably earned the benefit of the doubt on one conviction play. Last year's 67-percent win rate and 63rd-percentile scoring say this organization knows how to convert a well-constructed roster into actual results, and the 2026 version looks built to do it again.

Ganons Demise did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and missing. They built it by consistently getting slightly more than they paid for, round after round. Drake Maye landing at QB2 while slipping to 2.07 is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a season, and Kyle Monangai falling nearly a round and a half past his ADP in the thirteenth round is the sort of depth padding that separates teams when injuries hit. The receiving corps deserves credit too: Rashee Rice at WR13, Tee Higgins at WR19, and Rome Odunze at WR30 give this team a projected starting group that most managers would not argue with. The three minor reaches, including DK Metcalf and Quentin Johnston, are debatable but none of them were dramatic overpays. The result is a team sitting at 61st percentile with a real path upward, not because of one splashy move, but because the draft simply went well more often than it did not. That is harder to do than it looks.

ChrisHenrysGhost sits at 73rd percentile in this field and fourth in the Legend of Zelda division, and the honest version of that story starts with Christian McCaffrey and Jonathan Taylor anchoring the lineup as RB3 and RB4. Taylor was a good value, sliding to pick 2.06 against an ADP of 2.01, but the draft chart gets messier from there. Jordan James went at pick 17.07 when his ADP sat at 22.02, a 4.6-round reach that looks like a manager falling in love. Tory Horton cost four rounds of premium against his ADP. Michael Mayer cost nearly four more. Three major reaches in one draft is the kind of thing that gets a manager raked across Twitter. And yet the roster does not look broken. McCaffrey and Taylor are legitimate cornerstones, Travis Etienne and Kyren Williams give this team real depth behind them, and DeVonta Smith leads a serviceable receiving group. The reaches may haunt them, or they may be the moves everyone looks back on as ahead of the curve. Right now, ChrisHenrysGhost has earned the benefit of the doubt.

TheKimmyDHawks sit third in the division and at the 76th percentile tournament-wide, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. Manager KimmyD went to the board with a plan and executed it, landing five good values and a genuine steal in Quinshon Judkins, who fell two full rounds past his ADP before KimmyD quietly scooped him at RB22. Chase Brown at RB11 and Javonte Williams at RB17 arrived at similar discounts, and Mark Andrews slid a round and a half before landing at TE14. The lone reach on the board is A.J. Brown at WR8, and half a round early for a receiver of that caliber is the kind of reach you accept without apology. Anchor that corps with Omarion Hampton at RB9 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, stack Goff with St. Brown for the bonus upside, and you have a lineup that is not just talented but deliberately assembled. Twelve chalk picks keep the foundation sound, the values build on top of it, and there is almost nothing here to argue with.

The Legend of F6P didn't win the draft with one flashy pick, they won it by consistently getting players a little later than they should have been available. Patrick Mahomes at QB12 slid more than a round past his ADP, James Cook at RB5 was still on the board half a round after he had no business being there, and Baker Mayfield at QB18 quietly fell into the same pattern. Five values against zero steals and zero minor reaches is a draft that reads like a manager who simply trusted the board and let impatience elsewhere do the work. The result is a starting lineup that projects legitimately well: Cook and Saquon Barkley form a backfield core that most managers would envy, Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 anchors the receiving side, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 is an asset at a position where most rosters are hoping for scraps. The 2025 campaign already showed what this operation looks like when it runs cleanly, 81st percentile in scoring and a 67 percent win rate. The 2026 roster looks like more of the same, and that is not faint praise.

Mrlke arrives in the Legend of Zelda division sitting at 92nd percentile in the field, and the draft ledger tells you exactly why: not a single major reach across the entire board, and a steal hiding in plain sight in the middle rounds. Kenneth Walker III, projected RB10, was still available at pick 4.11 when his ADP sat at 3.05, a round and a half of free equity that most managers watched slip by. Pair that with Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchoring the top of the roster, and Mrlke assembled something genuinely difficult to beat on a weekly basis. Lamar Jackson, projected QB3, came at a similar discount, slipping nearly a full round past his ADP before Mrlke grabbed him at 3.02. The receiver corps is thinner by comparison, with Xavier Worthy projected WR49 as the weakest projected starter, but in a positionless format that depth at the top end simply does not care. This roster did not need one transcendent swing. It just needed seventeen good decisions, and Mrlke came pretty close.
