There is being optimistic in a draft, and then there is what HemiOrange did. Seven major reaches across the board is not a drafting philosophy, it is a confession, and the roster reflects the terms of that confession clearly. The most damning exhibit is RJ Harvey, the team's weakest projected starter, who arrives carrying the baggage of a Denver backfield that already has Derrick Henry's former peer JK Dobbins back and Jonah Coleman now added to the room, leaving Harvey's path to relevance somewhere between narrow and imaginary. Meanwhile, Alvin Kamara materialized four rounds ahead of his ADP, Cooper Kupp showed up nearly four rounds early, and Javonte Williams cost a pick that should have bought something considerably more reliable. The foundation under the good stuff, and there is good stuff, De'Von Achane at RB6 and Derrick Henry at RB12 are genuinely valuable, was paid for in currency that should have built depth instead of desperation. HemiOrange sits last in the division and in the sixth percentile of the field, and nothing in this draft construction argues against either number.

There is no spin available for CsTaN53, a team sitting at 6th percentile in the field and 11th in the division that reads less like a draft strategy and more like a series of increasingly confident mistakes. Josh Allen at QB1 is the one unimpeachable truth here, and pairing him with D.J. Moore as a stack is a reasonable instinct, but the goodwill ends there fast. The draft logged five major reaches and four minor ones against zero steals, a distribution that suggests someone fell in love with players rather than value. Malik Nabers at WR12 is a fine piece, but pulling him nearly a full round early set off a chain reaction that forced compensations elsewhere. Those compensations included Michael Wilson, a WR39 taken 2.3 rounds before the market agreed, and Juwan Johnson, a TE20 grabbed two rounds ahead of his price. The net result is a roster where the best players are real, the price paid for them was wrong, and the depth propping everything up is led by Rico Dowdle as the projected weakest starter. Pity is the only appropriate response.

GuiiGianni sits at 9th percentile in the field and dead last in the division, and the roster doesn't offer much reason to argue with those numbers. The wide receiver group is legitimately good, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and bolstered by Chris Olave, Jaylen Waddle, and Mike Evans, all projected starters. But that strength only matters if the rest of the roster can hold up its end, and it can't. The running back group grades out weak, topped by Bhayshul Tuten at RB25, which is not exactly a cornerstone to build around. The draft didn't help matters. Jalen Hurts went two rounds early as a major reach at 2.06, and then GuiiGianni burned a late pick on Keenan Allen, a WR99 projection taken more than five rounds before his ADP. That's not finding value at the margins, that's paying premium prices for players the market had already written off. Coming off a 28-percent win rate in 2025, there is no obvious lever left to pull here.

The math is ugly and the draft didn't help. daman1799 lands at the 20th percentile in the field entering 2026, sitting ninth in the division, and the roster construction choices that got them here are hard to defend. The most glaring problem is at the top: Trevor Lawrence, projected QB10, was pulled at pick 3.02, nearly two full rounds ahead of his ADP, and then Bryce Young, projected QB26, followed at 8.11, another 2.8 rounds early. Burning premium capital on two quarterbacks, one of whom projects as a clear afterthought, in a positionless format where you can simply play your best players regardless of position, is the kind of draft philosophy that requires everything else to break right. It hasn't. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is a genuine foundation, and A.J. Brown at WR8 gives the lineup real teeth, but the projected starters thin out quickly after that, with Chuba Hubbard grading as the weakest. There is no obvious trade target to fix this, no buried value to unearth. The ceiling exists; the margin for error does not.

Section700 drafted like someone who woke up late, panicked, and started hoarding running backs before the fire alarm went off. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 look impressive on paper, but Jeanty was taken nearly a full round early, and the aggressive posture that defined this draft produced six major reaches overall, a figure that quietly poisons everything downstream. The receiver group is where the damage becomes undeniable: Jaylin Noel and Christian Kirk were each grabbed more than five rounds ahead of their respective ADPs, burning late capital on players ranked WR83 and WR100 when that currency could have addressed something real. Meanwhile the quarterback situation, Kyler Murray at QB19 and Cam Ward at QB23, is charitably described as thin and uncharitably described as the natural consequence of spending round eight on Malik Willis when the market didn't agree with that valuation until round eleven. The 2025 campaign finished in the 21st percentile, and nothing about this construction suggests the trajectory is pointing anywhere but flat.

Two Pint Conversion sits at the 49th percentile, which is another way of saying the tournament is basically a coin flip from here. The receiver group is the clearest reason for optimism: Drake London (WR7), George Pickens (WR10), and Emeka Egbuka (WR18) give this roster a ceiling that most teams in the middle of the field cannot match. But the margins that decide a season like this tend to live elsewhere, and that is where the questions pile up. Matthew Stafford is projected QB14, which is workable, but the manager spent a fourth-round pick on a 38-year-old who is already sharing a depth chart with his own handpicked successor. Four major reaches in one draft rarely all pay off, and committing premium draft capital to Stafford and Sam Darnold at QB21 means the receiver talent up top has to carry more weight than it should. Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1) keeps the floor from caving in entirely. This team is not short on talent, but it is very short on margin for error.

TexAg99 didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. They won it by never losing it. The foundation is Puka Nacua at WR1 paired with George Kittle at TE9, Tucker Kraft at TE5, and Sam LaPorta at TE8, a tier of talent that most managers would consider a strong draft on its own. Layer in James Cook at RB5, grabbed at 2.10 when his ADP sat at 2.04, and the early rounds were close to clean. The one eyebrow-raiser is Jared Goff, taken 1.5 rounds ahead of his ADP, but the logic holds: Goff has finished as a top-10 quarterback four straight years in six-point passing leagues, the Detroit offense is fully intact around him, and his Goff-LaPorta stack gives TexAg99 a bonus pairing with real upside. A 72 percent win rate and 75th-percentile scoring in 2025 suggest this manager knows how to convert draft capital into weekly results. Sitting 67th percentile entering 2026, there's no reason to think that pattern breaks.

Link McFly did not build this roster with one splashy move. They built it by being right, repeatedly, in the middle and late rounds. The foundation is genuinely strong: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 give this team a ceiling most managers would trade for without blinking, and Breece Hall at RB14 and Chase Brown at RB11 mean that ceiling does not evaporate if something goes sideways. But the draft story is really about the values. Jake Ferguson landed at TE12 more than a round after his ADP suggested he would, Jayden Reed came a round late at WR48, and Jaylen Warren slipped to RB27 with similar patience rewarded. None of those alone reshapes a roster, but four value picks across a draft with zero reaches is the fingerprint of a manager who never panicked and never overpaid. The 2025 numbers back the approach: 78 percent wins and an 87th-percentile

scoring season. This team sits fifth in its division and 68th percentile in the field, which feels like a floor more than a ceiling.

After finishing in the 17th percentile in scoring last season, @RyanClifford has rebuilt into an 85th-percentile squad, and the engine driving that turnaround is hard to miss. Joe Burrow at QB4 and Trey McBride at TE2 give this roster two genuinely elite anchors, the kind of foundational pieces that turn a lottery ticket into a real contender. The backfield adds serious juice: Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Jeremiyah Love (RB13), TreVeyon Henderson (RB19), and Quinshon Judkins (RB22) form a projected-starter group that few managers in the field can match at that depth of quality. Henderson himself was a draft-day gift, sliding nearly a full round and a half past his ADP, and Dalton Kincaid at TE11 came even cheaper, falling almost two rounds before Clifford scooped him at 9.09. The receiver group is the quietest part of this roster, but Luther Burden at WR22 carries it. A year after getting buried in the basement, Clifford has constructed something that looks genuinely dangerous, and that swing from 17th percentile to 85th is the whole story.

Biggoron Style didn't win the draft with one thunderous pick. They won it on accumulation, round after round coming out slightly ahead, and that discipline is exactly why this roster projects at the 86th percentile heading into 2026. The receiver group anchors everything: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 form a foundation most managers would auction their lunch money to field, and Jefferson's situation genuinely excites, with Kyler Murray arriving in Minnesota to replace the quarterback who seemed to hold him back a year ago. Omarion Hampton at RB9 came at a Round 4 price despite a Round 3 valuation, and Justin Jefferson himself slid past his ADP by nearly a full round, small advantages that compound into something real when you tally six value picks against zero steals and only two reaches across the whole board. Third in the division and sitting on a roster that finished the previous season in the 92nd percentile in scoring, Biggoron Style looks less like a pretender to a throne and more like someone who has quietly been measuring the room for curtains.

SammyReid finished 2025 in the 10th percentile, and this draft reads like someone who spent the offseason with a highlighter and a grudge. The foundation is immaculate: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Colston Loveland at TE3 were both taken at value, and pairing them with Jayden Daniels at QB5 gives this roster a ceiling that most managers in the field cannot match. What separates a good SFB draft from a great one is discipline in the middle rounds, and SammyReid delivered, landing nine values against zero major reaches across the whole board. Bucky Irving, D'Andre Swift, DeVonta Smith, and Davante Adams were all taken past their ADP, and Denzel Boston fell nearly three rounds before SammyReid scooped him late. The projected 94th-percentile finish and second-place division standing are not accidents. They are the predictable result of a manager who understood the market, waited out the board, and did not panic. This team is built to win.

Wildcats192 sits atop the Legend of Zelda: A Link to the Past division and in the 95th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The defining move came in round two, where CeeDee Lamb, projected WR5, slid all the way to pick 2.07 against an ADP of 1.11, a full 0.7 rounds of free value handed to a manager disciplined enough to wait. Pair that with Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 taken in the first round at solid value, and Wildcats192 secured two of the best receivers in the tournament before the draft even found its footing. From there, the board kept giving: Zay Flowers, Brian Thomas Jr., and Mark Andrews all fell at least a round past their ADPs, pushing the roster to six values and one outright steal across 24 picks with zero reaches anywhere on the sheet. Last season's 72 percent win rate and 83rd-percentile scoring already told you this manager knows what they are doing. The 2026 draft confirmed it all over again.
