BlakeM12 sits 12th in The Punisher division and in just the 14th percentile of the field, and nothing in this roster construction suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The draft tells the story plainly: zero steals, zero values, 13 chalk picks, and two major reaches that genuinely hurt. Taking Lamar Jackson at 1.07 when his ADP sat at 2.03 is defensible, barely, but reaching three full rounds early on Mike Washington Jr., a projected RB59, is the kind of draft capital mismanagement that quietly poisons a roster. The receiver group grades weak, with DeVonta Smith at WR14 as the lone genuine weapon and Rome Odunze at WR30 as a reach in his own right. Ashton Jeanty and Omarion Hampton give this team a real foundation, projecting RB7 and RB9 respectively, but in a positionless format where every manager fields their best regardless of position, a strong backfield only matters if the surrounding talent can compete. Here, it mostly cannot. BlakeM12 is not a rebuild waiting to happen, it is a rebuild already underway and slightly behind schedule.

The1Hudsonian had one job: build a competitive roster in the Scott Fish Bowl without lighting the draft capital on fire. Mission failed. The most damning evidence is the Saquon Barkley situation, where the manager reached nearly a full round early for an RB8 projection on a 29-year-old whose 2025 was a quiet alarm bell, declining production, offensive line carnage in Philadelphia, and now whispers of a reduced workload. That is not the kind of player you pay early for; that is the kind you pray falls to you. And yet the aggression did not stop there. De'Zhaun Stribling and Dontayvion Wicks, sitting at WR73 and WR96 respectively, were pulled off the board a combined eight rounds ahead of consensus, which is not bold drafting so much as it is burning late-round picks on speculation dressed up as conviction. Three major reaches, zero steals, and an 18th percentile tournament ranking tell the story cleanly. The1Hudsonian did not get unlucky. They just drafted this way.

byrnekate2 enters 2026 sitting 10th in The Punisher division and in just the 18th percentile of the field, and the roster offers little reason to expect a dramatic reversal. The foundation looks respectable enough on paper, Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1 and Caleb Williams slots in as QB6, but the draft process that built around them tells a cautionary tale. Williams came off the board nearly a full round early, and Harold Fannin was pulled two picks ahead of his ADP at TE6, meaning byrnekate2 paid a premium at two spots rather than accumulating equity. The rest of the roster grades out as filler, with Romeo Doubs projecting as the WR53 and serving as the weakest projected starter. Last season's 28th-percentile scoring finish was not a fluke of bad luck waiting to correct itself. It was a signal. When your best realistic outcome is a Gibbs breakout carrying dead weight every single week, you are not building toward a run, you are hoping one player delays the inevitable.

Eric Vanek did almost everything right on draft day. The value column is long: Jayden Daniels at QB5 fell a full round, Mark Andrews slid past his TE14 price tag, and Jordan Addison tumbled two rounds before Vanek scooped him at WR43. Five values, one steal, zero major reaches. That is a technically sound draft, the kind that gets cited in winner's circles. The problem is that draft-grade arithmetic and roster-grade arithmetic are not the same calculation. Addison is a projected WR43. Quentin Johnston, the weakest projected starter, sits at WR41. The wide receiver group that Vanek harvested at discount prices is, collectively, thin at the top, and in a positionless format where every lineup spot goes to your best available player, that ceiling matters more than the efficiency with which you assembled it. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and James Cook at RB5 give this team a genuine backbone, and the Daniels-Terry McLaurin stack adds a bonus layer. But ninth in the division and the 21st percentile of the field is

where the projections land, which is what happens when you play the value game correctly and the players themselves simply are not good enough.

brinkdogg enters 2026 sitting eighth in The Punisher division and in the 34th percentile of the field, and the roster construction gives little reason for optimism. The running back group is genuinely impressive on paper, with Chase Brown (RB11), Kyren Williams (RB15), Javonte Williams (RB17), and Cam Skattebo (RB20) all projecting as starters, and Brock Bowers (TE1) and Colston Loveland (TE3) give the team two elite options at tight end. The problem is everywhere else. The receiver group bottoms out at Tyreek Hill (WR77), Deebo Samuel (WR70), and Jauan Jennings (WR63), a trio of faded names projecting nowhere near their former ceilings, and the quarterback situation leans on Jaxson Dart (QB11) while carrying Ty Simpson (QB36) and J.J. McCarthy (QB37) as depth. The draft did not help matters either, producing zero steals or values against five minor reaches and two major ones. When your projected weakest starter is Rhamondre Stevenson (RB31) and your wideouts grade out this poorly, the ceiling has already been built.

Saintspelicans23 didn't just build a team, they built a theory. The entire ceiling rests on two pairings: Joe Burrow with Ja'Marr Chase, and Tyler Shough with Chris Olave. Burrow projects as QB4 and Chase as WR2, which means when that stack runs hot, it doesn't trickle points onto the board, it floods them. The Shough-Olave connection adds a second layer, giving the manager two separate detonators rather than one. What makes this construction interesting is how deliberately it was assembled. Burrow was the lone real value in the draft, sliding slightly past his ADP, and the manager protected both quarterback slots by reaching for Fernando Mendoza at pick 11.01. Zay Flowers at WR16 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 provide legitimate supporting production if the stacks need reinforcement. Sitting 7th in The Punisher division and at the 51st percentile, this roster is not impressive on average, but average was never the goal. If Burrow and Chase are cooking on the same week, Saintspelicans23 has a roster capable of punching well above that rank.

djb359 didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept hitting singles that found the gaps. The foundation is genuinely hard to argue with: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a top-end that most managers in The Punisher division would trade for without hesitation, and Tyler Warren at TE4 is the kind of positional advantage that quietly inflates a lineup's floor week after week. The Baker Mayfield and Emeka Egbuka stack adds a layer of upside coordination that makes the WR18 projection feel conservative on the right Sunday. Yes, the quarterback situation is thin on paper, but Malik Willis landed a real contract in Miami and brings enough dual-threat juice to remain relevant even if the Dolphins don't win pretty. Sitting at the 55th percentile and sixth in the division, this team isn't the story of the tournament yet, but the draft was clean, the top of the roster is legitimate, and clean drafts have a way of looking smarter as the season unfolds.

Bernthals Commanders didn't force anything in the draft, and the results show it. Landing CeeDee Lamb at WR5 at pick 2.03, a full round after his ADP suggested he'd be gone, is the kind of quiet win that separates careful drafters from lucky ones, and it set the tone for a board that kept delivering. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 anchors the top of the lineup, and the value picks accumulated through the middle and late rounds, six players taken meaningfully past their ADP, give this roster real depth behind those headliners. The one variable worth watching is Rashee Rice, who projects as a WR13 starter when available but carries a stack of off-field and physical concerns heading into 2026 that make his snaps genuinely hard to count on. The team finished 56th percentile in scoring in 2025 and currently projects fifth in the division, so there's real ground to make up. But a roster built on consistent draft execution, with Kyle Pitts at TE7 and Sam LaPorta at TE8 giving the lineup elite optionality at the position, has the pieces to outperform that projection if the breaks fall right.

CoachBruce1 did not build this roster with one flashy swing. It was constructed pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team sitting at the 73rd percentile with a real case to climb higher. The anchor is Josh Allen, a QB1 who also stacks with D.J. Moore, projected WR26, giving this roster a connected ceiling that activates in the same game. Around that core, Drake London landed at WR7 after sliding two rounds past his ADP, which is exactly the kind of quiet advantage that separates good drafts from great ones. Add Garrett Wilson at WR17 and Carnell Tate at WR29 as projected starters, and CoachBruce1 has genuine firepower across the lineup. The 2025 campaign produced an 80th-percentile scoring season, so the output is not theoretical. The one place to watch is J.K. Dobbins, the projected weakest starter at RB36 and a mild reach, but in a positionless format, a strong enough top end covers for plenty. This team looks built for a long run in The Punisher.

cortezjomar1 is sitting third in the division and 79th percentile in the field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why. Five values, zero reaches, zero regrets. The headliner is the Drake Maye and A.J. Brown stack, which looks like free money on paper and might actually be. Brown landed in New England after four productive seasons in Philadelphia, and pairing his talent with an offense coming off an MVP runner-up season from Maye turns a good stack into a genuinely exciting one. The catch, as always with Brown, is durability, but when he's on the field the expectation is fireworks. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Malik Nabers at WR12 round out a receiving group that projects as the strongest part of this roster, and both were acquired at or below their draft-day value. The weakest projected starter is RJ Harvey at RB28, a player who himself came at a discount. When your ceiling is that high and your floor is a value pick, that is a clean draft by any measure.

TheBestLife didn't win the draft with one flashy moment, they won it by being right more often than wrong. The receiver group is the clearest evidence: Puka Nacua checks in at WR1 and was still available six picks past his ADP, Nico Collins projects as WR9, and George Pickens sits at WR10, both projected starters alongside Jameson Williams at WR21. That is not luck, that is a manager who did the homework. The tight end depth tells a similar story, with Tucker Kraft at TE5 and George Kittle at TE9 both in the projected lineup, and the Purdy-Kittle and Jordan Love-Kraft stacks add a layer of week-to-week upside that scoreboard-watchers will notice quickly. The 89th percentile projection and second-place division standing are outputs of a process, not a fluke. Tony Pollard is the projected weak link at RB30, but in a positionless format where the receiver and tight end talent runs this deep, that is a footnote, not a problem.

Sitting first in The Punisher division and at the 93rd percentile of the entire field, ffgoatball is what happens when a manager trusts the board and lets value come to them. The cornerstone of this thing is the receiver group: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this roster two legitimately elite options, and Jefferson himself was a good value, sliding to pick 2.04 despite an ADP of 1.12. That kind of patience early sets the tone for the whole draft, and ffgoatball kept it up, logging seven good values and one outright steal across the roster with only one minor reach in the books. Kenneth Walker III landing at RB10 a full round after his ADP and Tee Higgins coming in at WR19 give the lineup real depth behind those top receivers. Xavier Worthy is the weakest projected starter on paper, but when your floor looks like this, that is a quibble, not a concern. The 2026 version of ffgoatball is clean, disciplined, and built to contend.
