SarahLewis32 didn't just have a rough draft, they built a case study in how to bleed value across nineteen rounds without ever stopping to ask why. The defining sin is the quarterback room: Caleb Williams, reached 0.8 rounds early at pick 2.09, is a reasonable gamble on his own, but then Jaxson Dart followed at 3.04 despite an ADP sitting more than two rounds later, and Ty Simpson got snagged in round 14 nearly five rounds ahead of schedule. Three quarterbacks, all reached, in a positionless format where that capital could have bought genuinely scarce contributors elsewhere. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is the roster's obvious anchor, and Breece Hall sliding to 6.09 was a legitimate find, but those two bright spots sit atop a structure built on chalk and wishful thinking, with Khalil Shakir projected as the weakest starter at WR51. The 2025 season landed in the 23rd percentile, and nothing about how this draft unfolded suggests the trajectory is bending upward. Division rank of 12th feels less like a projection and more like a destination.

There is not much here to argue about, and that is the problem. Joes Falafel sits 11th in The Sims 4 and in the 19th percentile of the field, and the roster itself explains why. The receiver group is the clearest drag, with Rome Odunze projecting as WR30 and Michael Wilson at WR39 leading a corps that offers depth in names but not in production. When your top projected starters at receiver are ranked outside the top 25, you are asking a lot from the rest of the roster to compensate. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Tucker Kraft at TE5 are genuine assets, but the draft board reveals a team that largely paid market rate, logging 15 chalk picks against just one steal. The one notable reach, Matthew Stafford taken two full rounds ahead of his ADP at a QB14 projection, bought a player who is more floor than ceiling. With Jadarian Price projected as RB26 penciled in as a starter, Joes Falafel is running out of rope before the season even begins.

There is something quietly deflating about watching a team that finished in the 80th percentile in scoring last year project to the 26th percentile this time around, and MorganHallam's 2026 roster makes that gap hard to argue with. The foundation is real: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this team a genuine elite core, and the depth behind them is legitimately useful in a positionless format. But the draft decisions that shaped the rest of the roster are doing real damage to the ceiling. Both quarterbacks were reached for significantly, Brock Purdy pulled 2.5 rounds before his ADP and C.J. Stroud pulled 2.4 rounds early, and neither projects as a difference-maker, with Stroud sitting at QB22 as the weakest projected starter on the board. That early QB investment compressed what MorganHallam could do elsewhere, and Jameson Williams at WR21 and Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 are fine but not the kind of names that close a 54-percentile gap. Last year's version of this team knew how to build. This version is living off that reputation.

Geekmill enters 2026 sitting ninth in The Sims 4 division and hovering around the 30th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer many reasons to argue with either number. The top end is real enough: James Cook projects as RB5, Amon-Ra St. Brown as WR4, and Rashee Rice as WR13, so there is a genuine core to build around. The problem is everything behind it. Jalen Coker, the projected weakest starter at WR55, is a shaky floor for a lineup that needs depth to matter. The draft did not help close the gap, producing zero steals and two major reaches, including Kenneth Gainwell burned 2.4 rounds early and Demond Claiborne taken nearly three rounds before the market agreed. That is not aggressive roster-building, that is paying a premium for players the field was content to leave on the board. Geekmill had a 36 percent win rate in 2025 and the 2026 construction does not yet suggest a correction is coming.

Last year benc03 went 31-5 and scored in the 100th percentile, which is the kind of season that buys a manager unlimited goodwill heading into the following year. The problem is that goodwill does not win games, and the 2026 roster is projected to finish 38th percentile and eighth in The Sims 4, a long way from where that reputation lives. The foundation is real: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a legitimate top-end, and Colston Loveland at TE3 adds another high-ceiling starter. But the depth behind those names gets thin in a hurry, and the draft did not help matters, producing zero steals and a major reach on Jared Goff, taken a full 1.4 rounds ahead of his ADP at QB16. Goff's projection does not justify that kind of early commitment. The 2025 version of benc03 was exceptional. The 2026 version looks like a team coasting on the memory of it, and memories do not score points.

Go Sports! enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Sims 4 division and just inside the 40th percentile of the field, and the roster grades suggest that gap is not closing anytime soon. The QB room looks like the brightest spot on paper, with Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 both projecting as starters, and the Daniels/Terry McLaurin stack adds a little connective tissue to the ceiling. The problem is that the draft did not generate much upside beyond that. Thirteen of the roster's picks landed right at chalk, with only three finishing in value territory and one genuinely costly reach on Daniels, who was snagged nearly a full round before his ADP. A team that needed to manufacture equity through the draft mostly just confirmed existing prices instead. Chigoziem Okonkwo projects as the weakest starter at TE19, which is fine until you need one of those chalk picks to outperform, and at 26th percentile in scoring a year ago, Go Sports! is still waiting on a sign that the overperformance is coming.

RGkicks is a team that lives and dies by the margins, which is either a comfort or a slow-burning anxiety depending on your constitution. Puka Nacua at WR1 is the clearest asset on the roster, and the fact that he fell a full four picks past his ADP means RGkicks got him at a slight discount, a small edge that compounds over a long season. Tee Higgins, Davante Adams, and DK Metcalf round out a genuinely strong receiver group that keeps this team competitive week to week regardless of what else goes sideways. What could go sideways is the quarterback situation. Jordan Love and Kyler Murray were both reached for, Love by a full two rounds, and neither inspires confidence as a weekly difference-maker. Murray's path to the field runs through a quarterback competition in Minnesota that is, by all accounts, real enough to sweat over, and a lisfranc injury that cut his last season to five games adds another layer of doubt. This team finishes sixth in the division not because it collapses but because the margins keep breaking the wrong direction.

ffballblast finished 2025 in the 21st percentile and came back with something to prove, drafting with the kind of conviction that either looks brilliant in January or gets you roasted in the group chat. The board says this roster was built on reaches, and that is technically true. But look at what those reaches bought: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, George Pickens at WR10, Emeka Egbuka at WR18, all projected starters, all acquired with a manager who clearly decided the conventional price was wrong. Joe Burrow at QB4 anchors the whole thing. The reaches that invite real scrutiny are the late-round swings on Chimere Dike and Elic Ayomanor, taken 3.8 and 2.8 rounds ahead of their respective ADPs, the kind of bets that scream either deep film study or wishful thinking. David Montgomery, now pushing for carries in Houston after getting squeezed in Detroit, adds genuine uncertainty to the running back group. The 56th percentile projection is a polite way of saying the field is not convinced. The roster itself makes a decent counter-argument.

BestBallBruni didn't need a miracle pick to build something worth watching in 2026, just a draft that kept quietly winning exchanges. The foundation is legitimate: Trey McBride at TE2, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and Drake London at WR7 give this roster a top end that most managers in the field would trade for without blinking. Josh Jacobs at RB16 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 extend that quality further, and Wilson arriving a full round past his ADP made an already good roster marginally better. The 2025 campaign, a 31 percent win rate and a 43rd-percentile scoring finish, gives Bruni genuine incentive to prove that result was noise. The pieces here suggest it was. The draft skewed heavily toward chalk, which is not a flaw so much as a philosophy, and that philosophy produced a starting group anchored by five players ranked inside the top 25 at their positions. This isn't a boom-or-bust roster betting everything on upside. It's a steady, well-constructed lineup sitting at 64th percentile with room to climb.

After a 2025 season that bottomed out at the 5th percentile in scoring, CPLANT1 is back with a roster that looks nothing like last year's disaster. The centerpiece is Brock Bowers at TE1, taken first overall and just a half-round ahead of his ADP, a negligible premium for the best tight end in the field. Pair Bowers with Nico Collins at WR9 and Malik Nabers at WR12, both projected starters, and the top of this lineup carries genuine elite-tier weight. Nabers was a standout value, slipping more than a round past his ADP to land at pick 4.12. Jalen Hurts comes in at QB9, giving CPLANT1 a capable quarterback anchor whenever the matchup calls for it. The floor here is the real story: Jeremiyah Love at RB13 and Bucky Irving at RB21 round out a starting group that simply did not exist last season. Third in The Sims 4 division and 69th percentile in the tournament, this team has climbed from the basement to a position where competing is no longer a punchline, it is a reasonable expectation.

SleezBomb sits at 87th percentile in the field heading into 2026, and the argument for this team begins and ends with the concentration of elite talent at the skill positions that matter most. Josh Allen is a QB1, and pairing him with CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Tyler Warren at TE4 means three of SleezBomb's projected starters are top-five players at their respective positions. That is not luck, that is architecture. The draft history adds a layer of credibility: Lamb was taken at 2.05 despite an ADP of 1.11, and Ladd McConkey fell nearly two rounds before SleezBomb scooped him up at WR20. DeVonta Smith at WR14 and Harold Fannin at TE6 round out a starting group where the weakest projected starter, Michael Pittman, comes in at WR44, a number that would anchor most rosters but barely registers here. SleezBomb finished 24-12 a season ago, and with this much firepower locked in at the positions that generate the biggest point ceilings, the case for another deep run writes itself.

Game Over did not build this roster on one flashy swing. They built it by being right, repeatedly, in the middle rounds, where most drafts are actually won. Saquon Barkley at RB8 slipped nearly a full round past his ADP and landed on this team. Zay Flowers at WR16 fell a round and a half. D.J. Moore dropped over a round. None of those alone reshapes a roster, but five values across the draft, against zero steals needed, means Game Over consistently came out ahead of the board without gambling for it. The Jaylen Waddle piece adds a quieter kind of upside: a WR23 projection who spent last year in a dysfunctional Miami offense and now catches passes from a quarterback, Bo Nix, who led the league in pass attempts. That context matters. Sitting first in The Sims 4 division and in the 94th percentile of the field coming off an 87th-percentile scoring season, Game Over looks less like a team that got lucky and more like a team that simply drafts well.
