Last year's 86th percentile finish from TexasTrojanFF feels like a long time ago. Sitting 12th in the Tidus division and in just the 9th percentile of the field, this roster is what happens when a draft goes sideways from round three and never finds its footing. The headline problem is the draft board itself: zero steals, zero values, and three major reaches that each cost two or more rounds of positional equity. Blake Corum lands at RB35 despite being taken at 10.01, Dylan Sampson arrives as RB53 despite being pulled 3.2 rounds early, and Tank Dell comes in as WR74 despite costing a 14th round pick. The top of the roster is real, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and James Cook at RB5 give this team a genuine floor, and the Caleb Williams and Luther Burden stack adds some upside. But Williams projects as QB6 and Burden as WR22, which is a fine stack, not a great one, and it cannot compensate for a draft that spent equity on late-round names as if scarcity were closing in. The 2026 season looks like a long ride down.

JustinBonnemaFBG sits 11th in the Tidus division and in the bottom 10 percent of the field, and the draft log does not offer much hope for a turnaround. Three major reaches define the session: Chase Brown at RB11 cost a round-and-change of surplus value, Javonte Williams at RB17 cost two full rounds, and Christian Kirk at WR100 cost nearly five rounds in a pick that feels less like a calculated bet and more like a man who really needed to go to the grocery store but wandered into a casino instead. The receiver group grades out weak across the board, with Alec Pierce at WR32, Courtland Sutton at WR37, and Michael Wilson at WR39 headlining a unit that offers volume but little ceiling. Brock Bowers at TE1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are genuinely elite anchors, and they are the only reason this roster is not a complete teardown, but when Malik Willis, a QB24 who parlayed backup cameos in Green Bay into a starting gig in Miami, is among your projected contributors, the margin for error is already spent.

There is no spin available for danielhaight's 2026 Scott Fish Bowl roster, no angle that makes the evidence look better than it is. The draft was a slow-motion disaster, producing zero steals, two major reaches, and six minor ones across the board, which means this manager repeatedly paid tomorrow's prices for today's question marks. The most damning exhibits are Tyquan Thornton, reached for 5.5 rounds early, and Rashod Bateman, pulled two-plus rounds ahead of schedule, two depth receivers who cost real draft capital and project as WR97 and WR92 respectively. Meanwhile the receiver group as a whole grades weak, and the projected weakest starter is Chuba Hubbard at RB29. There are bright spots: Josh Allen is a legitimate QB1, and Drake Maye, coming off an MVP-runner-up campaign with a new alpha wideout now in town in AJ Brown, could push even higher. But a team sitting at 17th percentile in the tournament does not get saved by its quarterback depth. It gets exposed by everything else.

SturnNBurn walked into the Scott Fish Bowl draft, apparently decided that reaching early and often was a personality, and produced a roster that lands in the 22nd percentile of the field. The indictment is not spread evenly. CeeDee Lamb, Justin Jefferson, and Tyler Warren are genuinely elite, and the receiver group behind them has enough projected starters to carry real weight. But then you get to the draft capital spent on the running back side, and the wheels come off. Jordan James was taken 4.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, MarShawn Lloyd 3.8 rounds ahead, and Jonah Coleman another two rounds early for good measure, producing a group projected no better than RB51 across the board. That is not aggressive drafting, that is paying full price for a car with a salvage title. Three major reaches in a single draft class is a pattern, not a mistake, and when the reaches cluster at the same positions and produce the weakest projected contributors on the roster, the only available verdict is that SturnNBurn outsmarted itself into ninth place in the Tidus division.

ArmandoMarsal sits at eighth in the Tidus Division and the 26th percentile of the field, and the draft record offers little reason for optimism: zero steals, zero values, and four major reaches scattered across the later rounds. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, Nico Collins at WR9, and DeVonta Smith at WR14 give the team a genuinely strong top of the roster, but below that tier the floor drops fast, and the draft capital spent propping it up was largely squandered on reaches like Jaylin Noel at WR83 and Keon Coleman at WR91, both taken nearly five rounds ahead of their ADPs. The projected starter pool bottoms out at RJ Harvey as a projected RB28, and the quarterback situation, with Brock Purdy projecting as a QB13 and Tyler Shough as a QB20, offers more adequacy than upside. St. Brown and Collins can carry a week, but in a format this competitive, a roster that grades out near the bottom with no obvious lever left to pull is less a project than a prayer.

Razorback12 sits at 54th percentile in this field, and that number is so perfectly median it almost feels engineered. The roster has genuine firepower at the top, Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Lamar Jackson at QB3 are the kind of projected starters that keep a manager's blood pressure reasonable, and Malik Nabers at WR12 gives this lineup a real second gear. But the margins are where things get interesting, and the margins are not obviously kind. The weakest projected starter is Rashid Shaheed at WR57, which means the difference between a good week and a frustrating one lives and dies on a player hovering outside the top 50 at his position. The draft was almost aggressively cautious, 15 chalk picks against zero steals, and the one move that breaks the pattern is Deebo Samuel, a major reach taken nearly four rounds early. Samuel is WR70. Razorback12 is not a team anyone circles as dangerous, but they are also not a team anyone circles as a layup. In a tournament decided by margins, that is either a comfort or a warning.

tomhank didn't win the draft with one flashy pick. This team was built pick by pick, round by round, with a quiet consistency that adds up to something real. The clearest evidence is the receiver group: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, George Pickens at WR10, and Chris Olave at WR11 are all projected starters, and tomhank grabbed Olave nearly a full round after his ADP, turning patience into a discount. Pickens was the one minor concession to aggression, taken about half a round early, but that's a small price for a WR10. Meanwhile, the tight end corps is anchored by Harold Fannin at TE6, Dalton Kincaid at TE11, and Jake Ferguson at TE12, giving this roster genuine upside at a position that routinely separates the field. Toss in Omarion Hampton projecting at RB9 and you have a team sitting at 59th percentile that could easily outperform that number if the projections bend even slightly in its favor. This is what a well-executed draft looks like, not loud, just correct.

FantasyFlurry did not build this roster on one splashy pick. They built it by consistently getting more than they paid for, and the standings reflect it. Josh Jacobs fell nearly two full rounds past his ADP before this team scooped him up as an RB16 projected starter. Dak Prescott slid almost a round further than he should have and landed here as the QB7. Neither move looks like a lottery ticket; both look like a manager who came to the draft prepared and waited for the market to come to them. Layer in De'Von Achane at RB6 and Trey McBride at TE2 anchoring the projected starters, and Rashee Rice at WR13 providing a genuine upside piece, and you have a team where the floor is already high before the depth even enters the conversation. The 2025 result, a 99th percentile scoring season, suggests this is not a lucky draw. FantasyFlurry projects at 62nd percentile entering the Tidus Division, and that number looks conservative given how quietly well this roster was assembled.

RomexJockey sits at 71st percentile in the field and fourth in the Tidus Division, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: five values, ten chalk, and a willingness to let the board come to them rather than force anything. Jalen Hurts landed at 5.04 when his ADP suggested he'd be gone more than a round earlier, and Dallas Goedert followed the same pattern, slipping to 10.09 against a 9.03 ADP. That Hurts-Goedert stack now anchors the roster at no premium cost, which is the kind of quiet efficiency that compounds across a season. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a legitimate top-end floor, and Derrick Henry and Tetairoa McMillan round out the projected starters with their own upside. The two major reaches, Bryce Young and Jack Bech, are real blemishes, but they showed up late enough in the draft that the damage is contained. This is a roster built the right way, pick by pick, value by value.

cheyannarach didn't win the draft with one flashy pick, they won it by refusing to lose any individual round. The backfield is the obvious anchor: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 are both projected starters, and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 gives this roster a third option that most managers would happily start. That kind of sustained quality at the top of a positionless lineup compounds quickly. The receiver group keeps pace, with Drake London projecting as a WR7 starter alongside Jaylen Waddle at WR23. Then factor in the draft efficiency: cheyannarach didn't need to gamble to build this, logging three legitimate values and zero reaches across the entire board. Mark Andrews fell a full round past his ADP and landed at pick 10.03, a quiet win that shored up the TE14 slot without disrupting anything else. The result is a team sitting third in the Tidus division and projecting into the 77th percentile of the field, built not on one brilliant swing but on a draft that simply never handed anything back.

Elavien's 2026 roster reads like a masterclass in patience and board awareness, and the results back it up: 87th percentile in the tournament, second in the Tidus division, and not a single reach on the sheet. The foundation is legitimate. Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, Jayden Daniels projects as QB5, and Colston Loveland projects as TE3, three projected starters who each rank near the top of their positions. What makes this roster genuinely impressive, though, is the discipline layered underneath those names. Justin Herbert fell 1.2 rounds, Jordan Love fell 1.7, and Aaron Rodgers dropped nearly 3.5 rounds before Elavien quietly collected him at 17.02. That is not luck, that is a manager who stayed calm while other drafters chased. Six players came in below ADP, none above it. Last season produced a 61 percent win rate and 86th percentile scoring, so this is not a team reinventing itself. It is a team that knew what it was doing and did it again, cleaner.

CyMort11 doesn't just look like a contender, they look like a team that did their homework and then did it again. Sitting first in the Tidus Division and in the 95th percentile of the entire field, this roster was built with the kind of patience and precision that most managers only pretend to have. The foundation is Joe Burrow, a QB4 projection who costs nothing in worry until you remember his injury history, because when Burrow gets hurt, he doesn't miss a week, he misses months. CyMort11 absorbs that risk intelligently by also holding Patrick Mahomes at QB12, meaning the floor here stays well above the waterline no matter what happens in Cincinnati. Beyond the quarterbacks, the draft itself tells the story: four values, one steal, zero reaches across the entire board. Cam Ward sliding to pick 12.12 when his ADP sat at 10.06 is the kind of windfall that happens when a manager trusts the process and waits. Puka Nacua anchors the skill positions as a projected WR1. This roster was built correctly.
