CarpentierNFL drafted three tight ends in the first four rounds, which tells you almost everything you need to know about how this went. Tyler Warren, Harold Fannin, and Kyle Pitts are all fine players, but reaching 1.3, 3.2, and 1.6 rounds early on them respectively means real value bled out of every surrounding pick, and what filled those gaps is grim. Blake Corum, the team's projected weakest starter at RB35, was taken 2.4 rounds ahead of his ADP. Demond Claiborne, sitting at RB63, was grabbed nearly five rounds early. Trey Benson at RB64 came off the board 3.4 rounds before the market thought he should. That is not aggressive drafting, that is a manager chasing players the consensus had already priced out of those slots. The 2025 season landed CarpentierNFL in the 26th percentile of scoring, and nothing about this draft suggests a correction is coming. Last in the division, first percentile in the tournament, and nothing in the construction argues against either number.

Gspot111 sits 11th in the Tiger Woods PGA Tour division and checks in at just the 26th percentile of the field, and nothing about this roster suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The foundation looks fine on the surface, Brock Bowers at TE1 is the kind of anchor most managers would kill for, and De'Von Achane projects as RB6, but the supporting cast fades quickly. Brian Thomas Jr. checks in at WR31, a ranking that reflects a genuinely concerning situation: he looked like a star in his first season, then battled injuries and reportedly never found the same chemistry with Trevor Lawrence that he'd flashed previously, leaving real questions about his ceiling. The draft process did not help matters either. Gspot111 logged two major reaches and four minor ones against zero steals, meaning the manager consistently paid early-round prices for late-round players rather than finding hidden value. When your best draft win is Juwan Johnson slipping a round and a half, you are not building from a position of

strength. The arrow here is pointing sideways at best, and sideways at 26th percentile is just a slower way of going nowhere.

There is a version of Team Hamish McGregor that looks genuinely exciting on paper, and then there is the version that shows up in the standings. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and George Pickens at WR10 give this roster a legitimate elite core, and Jayden Daniels at QB5 is not nothing. But the optimism stops somewhere around the sixth player on the depth chart, and the draft didn't do much to fix that. Hamish made four major reaches, burning real draft capital to land players like Kimani Vidal at RB60 and Sean Tucker at RB65, whose projected ranks suggest the manager was paying premium prices for deeply discounted goods. The most alarming detail may be Jaxson Dart, a quarterback who crossed 250 passing yards in a game exactly once last season and made regular visits to the medical tent along the way. Daniels gets hurt, and Dart is the plan. For a team already sitting tenth in the division and projected in just the 29th percentile of the field, that is a thin margin for error dressed up as a backup plan.

Parker Pickles sits 9th in the Tiger Woods PGA Tour division and at just the 30th percentile of the field, and the draft offers little reason to expect a climb. The roster's carrying power rests almost entirely on a backfield anchored by James Cook (RB5), Chase Brown (RB11), and Derrick Henry (RB12), a genuinely impressive collection of talent. But the receiver corps is where this team quietly bleeds out, with Jaylen Waddle (WR23) as the top option and Xavier Worthy (WR49) projected as the weakest starter. That is a thin ceiling at a position that tends to separate contenders from also-rans. The draft did nothing to mask the problem. Malik Willis was pulled at pick 8.03 despite an ADP of 10.10, a 2.6-round reach for a QB24 with Patrick Mahomes already on the roster. Michael Mayer was scooped up 4.1 rounds ahead of his ADP and projects as TE39. Two major reaches, zero steals, and no obvious path to relevance. Parker Pickles is not rebuilding. It is simply running out of road.

sportsbarbelle played the 2026 draft with admirable discipline. The board did the work: Drake Maye fell five spots to round 2, Kyren Williams slid nearly two full rounds before being claimed at pick 7.06, and Tyler Allgeier arrived even later at a similar discount. Fifteen chalk picks, one steal, three values, zero minor reaches. The process was clean. The problem is the product. Christian McCaffrey projects as RB3, Malik Nabers as WR12, and the rest of the projected starters form a serviceable but uninspiring middle tier, with Chuba Hubbard, the projected weakest starter at RB29, doing nothing to raise the floor. Baker Mayfield was the one place sportsbarbelle overrode the board, reaching 2.2 rounds early for a QB18 projection, and the Mayfield-Emeka Egbuka stack is real upside insurance, but upside insurance pays out only when the base policy already covers the losses. A roster built this carefully should not land at 43rd percentile. That gap between process and outcome is the whole story here.

GETSCHMUCKED70 finished 2025 at the 96th percentile in scoring, which makes their current 46th-percentile projection feel like a demotion they haven't fully earned yet, and that gap is exactly where the season lives. The top end here is genuinely dangerous: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 are projected starters who would anchor almost any roster in this field, and the Jared Goff stacks layered on top of St. Brown and Sam LaPorta give this lineup a ceiling most managers at pick 7 in the Tiger Woods PGA Tour division cannot match. But the margins cut both ways. Three major reaches in the draft, including Tyreek Hill taken 3.3 rounds ahead of his ADP and Skyler Bell grabbed 7.2 rounds early, burned capital that could have shored up depth behind the stars. When St. Brown and Jefferson are cooking, GETSCHMUCKED70 looks like a problem. When they aren't, the falloff to names like Stefon Diggs at WR56 and Sam Darnold at QB21 is the kind of quiet slide that ends seasons without anyone noticing until it's too late.

NTL1983 sits at the 51st percentile and sixth in the Tiger Woods PGA Tour division, which is essentially the fantasy equivalent of a scratch golfer who keeps finishing even par: technically fine, contextually forgettable. The margins decide everything here, and the margins are genuinely close. The top end is real, with Jonathan Taylor (RB4), CeeDee Lamb (WR5), and George Kittle (TE9) forming a core that demands respect, and the Matthew Stafford / Davante Adams stack gives this roster a ceiling-raising correlation play on weeks it fires. But the bottom of the starting lineup is where the season gets negotiated. Jadarian Price projects as the weakest projected starter at RB26, and that is a number that can quietly sink a week when Taylor or Lamb goes quiet. The draft showed six values and zero steals, which is the work of a careful manager who played it mostly safe, then reached 4.6 rounds early on Tory Horton and hoped nobody noticed. Someone noticed. NTL1983 won 78 percent of games in 2025. Repeating that demands the margins break right.

RNoonan5 didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by repeatedly not losing. The receiver group is the engine here, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), Drake London (WR7), Rashee Rice (WR13), and Tetairoa McMillan (WR15) all projecting as starters, and Rice arriving as a genuine value after sliding more than a full round past his ADP. That kind of patient accumulation is how rosters get built in the middle rounds, where most managers are guessing and the smart ones are just picking up what falls. Ryan Flourney (WR69) added another layer of upside after dropping two and a half rounds from his ADP. The TE group draws some scrutiny, as three of the four picks there came before ADP, including Darnell Washington (TE38) at nearly five rounds early, which is the kind of aggressive commitment that can feel prescient or painful depending on how the season unfolds. At 58th percentile entering 2026, this roster projects as a legitimate threat to climb, not a pretender hoping to get lucky.

RussellClay didn't swing for the fences and miss. They just kept hitting singles that turned into doubles, and the scoreboard at the end of the draft looked very good. The backbone of this roster is a running back group that would make any manager in the field quietly envious: Bijan Robinson (RB2), Ashton Jeanty (RB7), and Saquon Barkley (RB8) are all projected starters, and Josh Jacobs (RB16) arrived as genuine value, slipping nearly a round and a half past his ADP at pick 7.02. At quarterback, Justin Herbert (QB8) was similarly patient, falling over a round past his market price before RussellClay scooped him up in the fourth. That's the through line here: no dramatic steals, but three legitimate values across the draft, paired with mostly disciplined chalk. The 2025 campaign, a 75 percent win rate and a finish in the 80th percentile in scoring, suggests this roster construction approach is not a coincidence. At 69th percentile entering 2026, RussellClay looks like a team quietly built to go deeper than that.

MattyKiwoom didn't win the draft with one flashy move. They won it by being right more often than not, and the Josh Allen situation captures that perfectly: a QB1 sliding to 2.04 while the rest of the field apparently found better things to do is the kind of quiet advantage that compounds over a full season. Pair Allen with Trey McBride at TE2 and Travis Kelce at TE10, and MattyKiwoom enters 2026 with a ceiling that most managers in this field can't touch at those positions. Then there's Carnell Tate, a WR29 projection who landed 1.4 rounds after his ADP, stepping into Tennessee as the clear top target for Cam Ward, a pairing the Titans are counting on to work at scale. None of these picks required a miracle, just a manager who stayed patient and let the board come to them. Sitting third in the division and in the top 10 percent of the field, MattyKiwoom looks like exactly what they are: a team built quietly and correctly.

After finishing in the bottom fifth of the field in 2026 scoring, tmrtn looked like a team that needed more than a fresh coat of paint, and this roster suggests the renovation is real. The anchor of the rebuild is a receiver corps headlined by Puka Nacua at WR1 and A.J. Brown at WR8, two projected starters who would be the envy of most managers in this field, with Tee Higgins at WR19 adding genuine depth behind them. The draft was where tmrtn really sharpened the blade: Lamar Jackson, projected QB3, slid nearly a full round past his ADP before tmrtn scooped him at 2.12, and Dak Prescott at QB7 fell even further, dropping 1.4 rounds before landing at 4.12. That kind of patience and opportunism at the draft table translates directly into roster quality. The result is a team sitting second in the Tiger Woods PGA Tour division and in the 91st percentile of the entire field, which, after what 2025 looked like, is not a small thing.

PeteyFF sits first in the Tiger Woods PGA Tour division and in the 96th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly why: four good values, one steal, and just a single minor reach across the whole board. That is not luck, that is discipline. The foundation is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Colston Loveland at TE3, two projected starters who would anchor any serious contender, but what separates this roster is the value layered underneath them. Breece Hall fell nearly two rounds past his ADP into the sixth round, and Jalen Nailor dropped almost three full rounds before PeteyFF scooped him in the sixteenth. When a manager consistently lets the board come to them rather than chasing names, the depth takes care of itself, and that is precisely what happened here. The weakest projected starter on this roster is Michael Pittman at WR44, which is less a criticism than a testament to how well the top of this lineup was constructed. Clean from top to bottom.
