There is no kind way to frame what jybarra did on draft day, and the standings are not going to be kind either. The team sits at the 6th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains why: zero steals, zero values, and five major reaches across a single draft. Five. The most damaging of those may be Elic Ayomanor, taken WR95 a staggering 5.2 rounds before his ADP, which is the kind of move that poisons a late-round strategy at its roots. Meanwhile, jybarra burned a round 13 pick on Jacory Croskey-Merritt, a reach of 3.5 rounds for a player ranked RB40, and spent two additional picks stockpiling quarterbacks in Michael Penix Jr. and J.J. McCarthy, neither of whom cracks QB33 in projections. The receiver group, where Jayden Higgins projects as the weakest projected starter at WR54, suggests the cost of all that overvaluing at other spots is now visible in the starting lineup. Coming off a 5-31 campaign, jybarra needed a reset. This was not one.

CorruptEbony sits 11th in the Toad Division and in just the 7th percentile of the entire field, and the roster offers precious little reason for optimism. The positional anchors are real enough, Jayden Daniels projects as QB5 and Colston Loveland as TE3, but both were pulled early, with Daniels taken nearly a full round before his ADP and Loveland taken nearly a full round before his, meaning the manager paid a steep price to lock in the upside that already existed at the top. Beneath that pair, the floor drops fast. Rhamondre Stevenson projects as RB31 and grades out as the weakest projected starter on the roster, the kind of player who can eat up a starting spot without ever tilting a week in your favor. Chris Olave at WR11 and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 give the receiver group a respectable look, but zero steals across the entire draft means there is no hidden value waiting to emerge. This roster is largely what it appears to be, and what it appears to be is a long climb.

BadLuckBill enters 2026 sitting 10th in the Toad division and in just the 25th percentile of the field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The foundation looks promising enough on paper: Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Brock Bowers at TE1 are genuine difference-makers, and Rashee Rice at WR13 gives this team real upside at the top of the lineup. But the draft that built this thing is where the trouble starts. Jared Goff, projected QB16, was drafted nearly two rounds early, eating premium capital on a quarterback who barely grades as startable. Malik Washington, projected WR71, was pulled four rounds ahead of his ADP, which is the kind of reach that haunts a roster the way a bad preseason injury haunts a fan. Those misfires matter because there is no obvious correction available. The depth that should cushion bad luck, like James Conner at RB56 or Jacoby Brissett at QB28, offers

no real upside. Jefferson and Bowers can carry a week, but they cannot carry a season, and in 2026, that may be exactly what BadLuckBill is asking them to do.

Last year's Wild Stallions went 29-7 and scored in the 98th percentile, which is the kind of season that earns a manager a reputation. The 2026 roster is here to complicate that reputation. The backfield is genuinely strong, with James Cook (RB5), Kenneth Walker III (RB10), Josh Jacobs (RB16), and Bucky Irving (RB21) all projected as starters, but in a positionless format the ceiling gets set by your weakest projected starter, and that player is Romeo Doubs at WR53. Drake Maye carries real upside at QB2, but the manager reached slightly to get him and spent the draft leaning heavily on chalk, logging 13 chalk picks against just one steal. The draft also features a significant early commitment to David Njoku, a TE29 projection taken 2.7 rounds ahead of schedule. None of these are catastrophic decisions in isolation, but they accumulate into a portrait of a team that is projecting 34th percentile and sitting ninth in the Toad division. The championship banner is not nothing. It just isn't a projection.

Sitting eighth in the Toad division and projected at just the 44th percentile of the field, rossadam is the kind of team that looks busier than it actually is. The foundational pieces are real: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6 give this roster a legitimate top end, and Gibbs alone can carry a week. But beyond that premium tier, the drop-off is steep and the draft did little to disguise it. Rossadam posted zero steals and five reaches against just two values, meaning the late rounds absorbed the most cost while returning the least upside. The quarterback situation compounds things: Dak Prescott at QB7 would be fine if he were healthy history, but Matthew Stafford at QB14 is a 38-year-old playing under a cloud, with the Rams already drafting his replacement in this past spring's draft. That Stafford-Davante Adams stack adds a floor, but a floor is not a ceiling. With the weakest projected starter grading out at TE21 and no obvious high-upside dart throw anywhere on the board, rossadam looks like a roster hoping for luck more than engineering it.

TheOtherFFGuy sits at 55th percentile heading into 2026, and that number tells the whole story: good enough to make noise, not good enough to coast. The ceiling here runs through Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3) and Lamar Jackson (QB3), two legitimate difference-makers who also connect as a stack, giving this roster a weekly floor that most middling rosters can't match. But the margins are where seasons like this get decided, and the margins are genuinely uncertain. Zay Flowers projects as a WR16 starter and Luther Burden as a WR22, which is real depth, yet the supporting cast thins fast after that, with RJ Harvey projected as a RB28 and identified as the weakest projected starter on the board. A draft built almost entirely on chalk, with 15 straight-value selections and no steals, means there's no hidden upside quietly waiting to surface. Jackson and Smith-Njigba can carry weeks, but in a format where small edges compound over a long season, TheOtherFFGuy needs everything to break right, and right now that feels like a coin flip.

Tom Fink didn't swing for the fences and miss, he just kept connecting. The clearest example is CeeDee Lamb, a WR5 who slid half a round past his ADP and landed at 2.05, a quiet gift that anchors the entire roster. From there, Fink layered in Garrett Wilson (WR17), Emeka Egbuka (WR18), and Jaylen Waddle (WR23) to build a receiving corps that looks genuinely dangerous at the top, then added Trey McBride (TE2) and George Kittle (TE9) to give himself elite options at tight end without having to gamble for them. The quarterback situation is the one soft spot, with Tyler Shough (QB20) leading a room that includes Malik Willis (QB24) and Aaron Rodgers (QB29), though Shough does operate with legitimate weapons in New Orleans. Fink sits sixth in the Toad Division and at the 64th percentile for now, but this is a roster built with enough sustained quality that a run feels like a realistic outcome rather than a hopeful one.

PowderPuffPrincess lands at 70th percentile in the field, and the draft log tells you exactly why: not a single steal on the sheet, but round after round of chalk picks that just kept hitting. The core is legitimately scary. Bijan Robinson at RB2 is the kind of pick that anchors a contender, and the receiving corps built around A.J. Brown (WR8), Nico Collins (WR9), and Tee Higgins (WR19) gives this roster three projected starters who can take over a week. Tony Pollard landing at RB30 after slipping nearly two rounds past his ADP qualifies as the one moment the draft broke in PowderPuffPrincess's favor. The only blemishes are a pair of late-round reaches, Rashod Bateman and Keenan Allen, both taken four-plus rounds ahead of their ADPs in a range of the draft where the market usually rewards patience. Those picks nudge the needle toward cautious optimism rather than full confidence, but the top of this roster is built to compete in Toad division and then some.

There was no single moment in this draft where 1rollinthunder1 reached into the hat and pulled out a rabbit. What happened instead was quieter and more impressive: a sustained accumulation of correct decisions that compounded into something formidable. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 was taken at pick 2.01, just barely ahead of his ADP, which means the manager simply knew what McCaffrey was worth and paid it without flinching. Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 anchors a receiving group that grades out as average by the numbers but looks considerably better when you trace the depth, with Alec Pierce and Michael Pittman extending a starting lineup that should be competitive week to week. Pittman is the x-factor worth watching: a veteran receiver now operating inside a Pittsburgh offense built around a 43-year-old Aaron Rodgers and a new coaching staff still searching for an identity, which means his WR44 projection could land anywhere on either side of that number. Sitting at 74th

percentile in the field and 4th in the Toad Division, 1rollinthunder1 did not win the draft on one pick. They won it on sixteen of them.

Last year Adeiko finished in the 9th percentile in scoring, a genuinely painful number, and the 2026 roster reads like a direct response to that misery. The foundation starts at the top: Josh Allen comes in at QB1, a slight reach at 1.01 but the kind of reach that ages well, and he pairs with D.J. Moore in a Bills stack that gives this team a high-powered ceiling play every single week. Malik Nabers lands at WR12 despite slipping more than a full round past his ADP, which is exactly the kind of quiet value that separates rebuilding rosters from genuinely competitive ones. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 anchor the rest of the lineup with real production, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 keeps the quality from dropping off at the back end. The result is a team projecting at the 76th percentile, third in the Toad division, and miles removed from the version that limped through 2025. The rebound looks real.

The SFB Gremlins landed at the 81st percentile and second in the Toad Division not by swinging for the fences but by simply refusing to lose a pick. The clearest example is Caleb Williams, a QB6 projection taken at 4.09 when his ADP sat at 3.06, a full round of free value on a quarterback who also comes stacked with projected starter Rome Odunze. That pairing alone gives the Gremlins a built-in weekly floor that most rosters have to chase. Add Puka Nacua projecting as WR1 and Saquon Barkley as RB8 anchoring the skill positions, and the question was never whether the Gremlins had talent, it was whether the draft would hold up around it. It did. Four values against one minor reach and one major reach is the kind of ledger that describes a manager who was patient, attentive, and largely right. This roster did not get built on one lucky fall. It got built one correct decision at a time.

lisahipp did not try to be clever. The draft was steady, deliberate, and it worked. The anchor is Ja'Marr Chase at WR2, but what separates this roster from the field is the depth behind him: Drake London (WR7), George Pickens (WR10), and DeVonta Smith (WR14) are all projected starters, and that group was largely built on chalk, picks that landed close to consensus value without overpaying or gambling. Where lisahipp did find extra ground was in the late rounds, picking up Jordan Addison at WR43 roughly a round and a half after his ADP, David Montgomery at RB23, and Rachaad White at RB39 in similar fashion. Those small wins compound. Yes, there are reaches in the back end, Ryan Flounoy and Michael Mayer taken well before the board suggested, but the starters are too well-positioned for late-round speculation to matter much. After a difficult 2025, lisahipp is now sitting first in the Toad division and in the 89th percentile of the field, and the roster explains exactly why.
