There is no spin available for tonys56, and trying to find one would only embarrass both of us. The top of this roster is genuinely good, Justin Jefferson at WR6 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 giving the team a real foundation, but the draft surrounding that foundation was a slow-motion disaster. Bo Nix went at 3.10 despite an ADP of 6.03, a QB15 projection taken nearly two and a half rounds early in a positionless format where quarterback scarcity barely exists, and that kind of aggressive misread set the tone for everything that followed. AJ Barner, a TE24, cost a 10th-round pick that belonged to a player who might actually start. The team landed zero steals, zero values, and four major reaches across a draft that read less like a strategy and more like a series of impulses. Last season ended at the 13th percentile in scoring, and with Khalil Shakir projected as the weakest starter at WR51, the 2026 version is currently sitting fourth percentile in the field. Jefferson and St. Brown deserve better management. They are not getting it here.

Last year, CH_Herms finished in the 93rd percentile and looked like a team that knew exactly what it was doing. This year's roster sits at the 9th percentile, and the draft tells most of the story. Four major reaches litter the sheet, headlined by Javonte Williams, taken 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP, and Kaytron Allen, yanked off the board a staggering 4.4 rounds early. Those are not bold conviction calls, those are the moves of a drafter chasing last year's feeling. The saving grace is a genuine anchor: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 stacked with Dak Prescott gives the roster a pairing that can carry a week by itself. But when your projected weakest starter is Kenneth Gainwell at RB34, and your supporting cast is padded with late-round names like Tyrone Tracy and Rachaad White rather than difference-makers, the gap between reputation and reality becomes impossible to ignore. The 93rd percentile was real. The 9th percentile projection is where CH_Herms reports for duty in 2026.

There is not much that laurenjump can do to talk you out of 11th place in the Tony Hawks Underground division, and the numbers back that up with quiet cruelty. The foundation looks fine on the surface, Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Jalen Hurts at QB9 are legitimate cornerstones, but Hurts cost a second-round pick when his ADP sat closer to a third, and that overpayment echoes through the rest of the roster. Drop below the top names and the floor falls fast, with projected starters like Hunter Henry at TE18 representing the kind of depth that does not win tight weeks. Last year's 9-27 record and 8th-percentile scoring were not a fluke or bad luck begging for regression, they were a signal, and the 2026 construction does not send a different one. Sitting in the 9th percentile of the field heading into the season, laurenjump is not a roster with one bold move away from contention. It is a roster that needed several bold moves in the draft and largely settled for chalk instead.

PhatMatt10 played this draft the right way and still landed at 45th percentile, which tells you something ugly about how the cards fell. The value was real: Joe Burrow slipped half a round, C.J. Stroud fell a round and a half, and the Burrow-Tee Higgins stack gives this roster a genuine ceiling on big weeks. But the draft produced 15 chalk picks and only three values total, and the roster reflects that arithmetic. Bijan Robinson projects as RB2 and Saquon Barkley as RB8, two names that look great on paper, yet the projected weakest starter is Jaylen Warren at RB27, which means the gap between the stars and the depth is steep enough to be dangerous. Sam Darnold, reached two full rounds early, projects as QB21, a number that does not justify the cost. PhatMatt10 bought the right things at slightly wrong prices and the right things at exactly right prices, and somehow the sum is a team sitting ninth in the Tony Hawks Underground division, close enough to relevance to sting, far enough away to matter.

OGMANZFAN69 drafted with genuine discipline, landing Caleb Williams a full round past his ADP, Tony Pollard nearly a round and a half late, and Keaton Mitchell later still, four values spread across a draft that, on paper, should have produced something dangerous. The problem is that patience without payoff is just waiting. Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Kenneth Walker III at RB10, and Josh Jacobs at RB16 give this roster a legitimate foundation, and the Jayden Daniels and Terry McLaurin stack adds the kind of correlated upside that wins weeks outright. But the receiver corps projects weak, and the one place OGMANZFAN69 abandoned the value philosophy entirely, Darnell Washington pulled seven and a half rounds before his ADP, produced a TE38. That is a brutal trade: give up draft capital early, get below-average production back. Sitting 47th percentile in the tournament and eighth in the Tony Hawks Underground division, this is a team that earned every pick it made and still cannot quite close the gap between smart drafting and a genuinely scary roster.

bhaar024 is the kind of team that wins a playoff spot on tiebreakers or misses it the same way, and everything about this roster confirms it. The receiver group is genuinely elite at the top, with Ja'Marr Chase (WR2), Drake London (WR7), and Malik Nabers (WR12) projecting as three of the better options in the tournament, and that trio alone keeps the floor elevated. But the margins are where this gets complicated. Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) is a projected starter whose value hinges on a connection with Trevor Lawrence (QB10) that has quietly looked shakier than advertised, and a disappointing 2025 clouded by injuries and chemistry questions makes him a real week-to-week variable rather than a quiet lock. The draft board tells a similar middle-of-the-road story: three major reaches, including Stefon Diggs (WR56) taken more than two rounds early and Theo Johnson (TE37) pulled nearly three rounds ahead of consensus. None of those are catastrophic, but in a season decided by thin margins, paying early for uncertain production is exactly the kind of quiet tax that separates 7th place from 4th.

gdula13 didn't build this roster with one splashy move. They built it by being right, over and over. The backfield alone reads like a greatest-hits collection of the draft board's overlooked middle: Omarion Hampton at RB9 slipped nearly a full round before gdula13 grabbed him at 3.12, D'Andre Swift fell almost two rounds before landing at 9.12, and Tyjae Spears tumbled more than two rounds to close out the draft. None of those are lottery tickets. They're just good players acquired at honest discounts. James Cook at RB5 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchor the top of the lineup with genuine upside, and the quarterback situation is steadier than it looks, with Jaxson Dart projected at QB11 and Brock Purdy at QB13 giving this team two functional options under center. The 2025 numbers back the philosophy: a 78 percent win rate and 96th-percentile scoring. Sitting 6th in the Tony Hawks Underground division at the 61st tournament percentile, gdula13 has the pieces to climb.

ffShaneB came out of the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl draft looking like someone who ignored the consensus sheet entirely, and the wild part is it mostly worked. The most glaring example is Calvin Ridley, taken nearly six rounds ahead of his ADP at WR78, a bet on a guy the market had largely written off. That is a reach that can haunt a roster for rounds. And yet the foundation underneath it is genuinely hard to argue with: Brock Bowers at TE1 and Trey McBride at TE2 were both values relative to ADP, and pairing them with Chase Brown, Breece Hall, and Travis Etienne gives this team a ceiling most managers in the Tony Hawks Underground division would envy. The 2025 season ended at the 16th percentile, which is the kind of number that demands an explanation, and this draft reads like ffShaneB's answer. The 61st percentile projection says the answer was good enough to matter. Whether Ridley justifies the conviction behind that pick, or quietly confirms it was never conviction at all, probably decides how far this team actually goes.

MeLlamoMoron didn't win the draft on one flashy pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead on value, and the clearest example sits at the top of the board: Lamar Jackson, projected QB3, slid a full round and a half past his ADP and landed at 3.07. Pair him with Zay Flowers at WR16 and you have a functional stack built into the foundation rather than bolted on as an afterthought. Drake Maye at QB2 adds genuine upside a few picks after his ADP, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as a WR3 who can carry a lineup on his own. The rest of the receiver group runs deep, with Flowers, Christian Watson, and Jordyn Tyson all projecting as starters. Kyle Monangai is the weakest projected starter on paper, but in a positionless format the floor gets propped up by everything around him. Fourth in the Tony Hawks Underground and 66th percentile overall, MeLlamoMoron built something that should outperform both numbers before the season ends.

DraftShack didn't win the draft on one spectacular swing. They won it pick by pick, building a receiver corps that reads like a fever dream for a positionless format: A.J. Brown (WR8), Nico Collins (WR9), Rashee Rice (WR13), D.J. Moore (WR26), Rome Odunze (WR30), and Marvin Harrison Jr. (WR33) are all projected starters, and every one of them landed at or near their number. Pair that with Josh Allen (QB1) running the whole operation with a Moore stack attached, and DraftShack has a weekly ceiling that most rosters in this tournament can only envy. The tight end depth is quietly doing real work too: Sam LaPorta (TE8) came as a genuine value, falling more than a round past his ADP, and Isaiah Likely (TE13) arrives in New York with a thin room ahead of him and a new offensive system under John Harbaugh that figures to keep him involved. This roster didn't need a lottery ticket. It just needed a competent hand at every turn, and it got one.

Nunnelly13 sits second in the Tony Hawks Underground division and in the 94th percentile of the entire field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. The foundation is Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and a tight end group anchored by Colston Loveland (TE3), Tyler Warren (TE4), and Kyle Pitts (TE7), three projected starters who collectively make this one of the most punishing positional advantages in the tournament. What elevates the roster from good to genuinely impressive is the discipline behind it. Nunnelly13 posted two steals and three values against just one minor reach across the entire draft, and the values are real ones: TreVeyon Henderson fell nearly two rounds to pick 8.10, Quinshon Judkins slipped a round and a half to pick 9.03, and Pitts himself arrived more than a round late. This is not luck. This is a manager who knew the board, trusted it, and let the market come to them. The weakest projected starter is Tyler Shough at QB20, which is about the only thing to pick apart, and even that feels like nitpicking a near-masterpiece.

CodySchmitt sits atop the Tony Hawks Underground division and in the 95th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly why: 15 chalk picks, two steals, two values, and just one minor reach on the whole board. That discipline compounds fast when the chalk includes a receiving corps anchored by Puka Nacua at WR1, George Pickens at WR10, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Jameson Williams at WR21, four projected starters who were all taken at or near their fair price. The real craftsmanship shows in the margins, though. Tucker Kraft fell more than two full rounds past his ADP and landed at pick 7.01, giving Schmitt a TE5 at a price that should have been impossible. Jonah Coleman fell nearly three rounds past his ADP and arrived as a late-round insurance policy that already looks like a bargain. One minor reach on Jordan Addison, zero major reaches, and a roster that

earned a 61 percent win rate and 68th-percentile scoring last year with a leaner build than this. There is not much to argue with here.
