There is no kind way to say this: MCP is projected to finish last in the Tron division and in just the 6th percentile of the entire field, and nothing about the roster construction suggests that math is wrong. The saving grace, such as it is, is a receiver group headlined by Justin Jefferson (WR6) and Nico Collins (WR9), a genuinely elite top end that keeps this team from being a total write-off. But the draft that built this thing was almost entirely chalk, 15 of 19 picks landing right where the board expected, which means there are no hidden undervalued contributors waiting to outperform. Worse, the quarterback situation is a quiet catastrophe: Bo Nix (QB15) and Kyler Murray (QB19) are both projected starters, and neither grades as a weapon so much as a passenger. The Murray/Jefferson stack is a cute narrative, but when your floor and ceiling are both defined by a QB19, cute narratives do not cash. MCP has the feel of a team that drafted safely, avoided mistakes, and still ended up somewhere no one wants to be.

BlooMig did almost everything right in the draft room. Fourteen chalk picks, only three minor reaches, and a genuine steal in Jaylen Warren, who slid more than two rounds past his ADP and landed as a projected starter. The process was sound. The outcome is quietly brutal. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Colston Loveland at TE3 give this roster a real foundation, and the starting receiver group is legitimately deep, with Jameson Williams, Christian Watson, and Jordyn Tyson all projecting as contributors. But the QB room sits at the bottom of the bracket, Trevor Lawrence at QB10 is the best option available, and the rest of the depth behind him offers no meaningful upside. When your draft grade looks clean and your tournament percentile still lands at 16th, it is not a failure of process, it is a failure of ceiling. BlooMig shopped the discount rack carefully, found genuine value, and still walked out with a roster that projects 11th in the Tron division. Sometimes the math just does not forgive you.

FromThe12Spot sits 10th in the Tron division and in just the 20th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer much reason to argue with either number. The top end is genuinely good: Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and A.J. Brown at WR8 give this team a pair of projected starters who can carry a lineup on any given week. The problem is that the rest of the roster grades out as filler, and the draft did not generate the kind of surplus value that might compensate. The sheet shows zero steals, three major reaches, and only two values across the entire board. Reaching 2.9 rounds early on Darnell Mooney, a WR82, is the kind of move that haunts a manager deep in a tournament, and leaning on Chuba Hubbard, the projected weakest starter at RB29, to round out a starting lineup is a thin margin for error. Brown and St. Brown give this team a pulse, but a pulse is not a plan.

BearFan37 enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Tron division and in just the 21st percentile of the field, and nothing about this roster suggests those numbers are about to move in a flattering direction. The WR group is genuinely impressive on paper, with Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), Malik Nabers (WR12), and Rashee Rice (WR13) among the projected starters, but a fantasy roster lives and dies by its weakest links, and the weakest link here is doing some load-bearing work. Michael Pittman (WR44) projects as the floor of the starting group, now tasked with producing alongside DK Metcalf for a Pittsburgh offense still searching for an identity under a new coaching staff, throwing to a 43-year-old Aaron Rodgers. That is a lot of uncertainty to be projecting into your lineup. Last season BearFan37 finished in the 15th percentile in scoring, and with Kenneth Gainwell (RB34) and Emanuel Wilson (RB69) as the backfield options, the path to a different outcome is genuinely hard to draw.

Sethffl finished in the 95th percentile last year, and the 2026 roster carries that reputation into the Tron division like a faded championship banner, impressive until you look closely. The projection has them at the 30th percentile and eighth in the division, which is a gap worth taking seriously. The bones of the team are real: Tyler Warren at TE4 and Harold Fannin at TE6 give the lineup a legitimate premium anchor, and Puka Nacua projects as WR1. But the draft did not add much cushion around those pillars. Twelve of the team's picks landed right at chalk, there are no steals, and Fannin was the most aggressive move of the draft, taken 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP. That is a bet on upside, not a hedge. Justin Herbert slides in as a value at QB8, which helps, but the projected floor beyond the top names gets thin fast, with Jakobi Meyers sitting as the weakest projected starter at WR45. The reputation is real. The roster, right now, is working to catch up to it.

MaxTobes enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Tron division and projected at just the 33rd percentile of the field, and the roster offers little reason for optimism. The backfield anchors look strong on paper, with Bijan Robinson (RB2) and Saquon Barkley (RB8) providing a genuine top-end foundation, but the receiver group grades out weak across the board, with Brian Thomas Jr. (WR31) and Alec Pierce (WR32) as the projected starters at a position that needed more. The draft did nothing to close that gap. MaxTobes managed zero steals, only two values, and committed the kind of draft capital mistakes that haunt a team by season's end, most notably reaching 2.3 rounds early for Stefon Diggs (WR56), a player projected well outside the top half of his position. That is not a calculated gamble, that is burning a mid-round pick on a prayer. Robinson and Barkley give this roster a pulse, but a weak receiver group projected this low, propped up by a draft that added cost without adding upside, leaves MaxTobes with very little runway to climb.

PhirmHandshake is sitting at 49th percentile and sixth in the Tron division, which sounds underwhelming until you look at where the talent is actually concentrated. De'Von Achane (RB6), Derrick Henry (RB12), and Kyren Williams (RB15) give this roster three projected starters who rank among the best at their position, and in a positionless format, that kind of top-end quality is the whole game. Trey McBride (TE2) adds another blue-chip piece, and Dak Prescott (QB7) arrived at a discount, falling nearly a full round past his ADP to land at 4.06. The draft was largely chalk, but the values that did surface were meaningful: Oronde Gadsden (TE16) fell a round, Colby Parkinson (TE31) fell two, and the back of the tight end group quietly became a real asset. The receiver corps is thin by ranking, but the ceiling here was never going to be built at wideout. When Achane, Henry, Williams, and McBride are all putting up numbers, PhirmHandshake does not need the receivers to carry anything.

AaronSchuiteman didn't swing for the fences and whiff, and didn't play it so safe the roster ended up forgettable. This team just kept coming out ahead, pick after pick. Caleb Williams at QB6 slipped nearly a full round past his ADP and landed in the fourth, and Breece Hall at RB14 fell a similar distance in the sixth, two quiet moments that add up loud. The top of the roster is where this team really makes its case: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, Drake London at WR7, and a tight end group anchored by Kyle Pitts at TE7 and Travis Kelce at TE10. Pitts in particular is worth lingering on. After years of not-quite moments in Atlanta, he broke through last season as a true top-five option at the position, and the ongoing quarterback uncertainty there seems unlikely to slow him down. Fourteen chalk picks out of twenty suggests a manager who trusted the board rather than forcing the action, and at 60th percentile across the tournament field, that discipline has produced a team that genuinely belongs in the conversation.

fftommyb drafted like someone who showed up with a plan and never deviated from it. The proof is in the receipts: five good values, two outright steals, and not a single major reach across twenty rounds. Drake Maye falling nearly a full round past his ADP to land as a projected QB2 is the kind of gift that changes a roster's ceiling, and fftommyb was sitting there ready to take it. Brock Bowers at TE1 was the one place fftommyb paid a slight premium, going about half a round early, but when the player is the top tight end in the field, that is not a mistake worth losing sleep over. Luther Burden is the wild card worth watching. Ben Johnson is already drawing Amon-Ra St. Brown comparisons in camp, and after Burden averaged a 53 percent snap share down the stretch last season, the WR22 projection feels like it has room to run. At the 70th percentile overall and sitting fourth in the Tron division, this team is not at the top yet, but the draft foundation is clean enough to get there.

The maskholes landed in the top 30 percent of the Scott Fish Bowl field and sit third in the Tron division, and the draft sheet explains both why that feels surprising and why it probably shouldn't. Four major reaches and three minor ones litter this roster, the kind of draft behavior that usually signals a manager chasing names instead of value. But here is the thing: the names they chased keep checking out. Brandon Aiyuk came off the board 3.1 rounds before his ADP, Aaron Rodgers nearly 2.2 rounds early, Jack Bech 3.2 rounds ahead of consensus. Reaches, all of them, and yet the lineup that emerged features Josh Allen at QB1, Jonathan Taylor at RB4, and a starting corps that includes Chris Olave, Jaylen Waddle, and Marvin Harrison Jr. You do not build that roster by accident. What maskholes proved is that conviction and luck look identical from the outside when the board fills in correctly, and right now the board looks very correct indeed.

After finishing in the bottom 17 percent of the field in 2026 scoring, SKOL_Scott_Fish arrives in 2026 looking like a completely different operation, and the roster backs that up. The engine here is a backfield anchored by Jahmyr Gibbs (RB1), James Cook (RB5), and Kenneth Walker III (RB10), three projected starters who give this team a ceiling most managers in the Tron division cannot match, and Cook and Walker were both good values on draft day, slipping past their ADPs by more than a round combined. Cam Skattebo (RB20) and Bhayshul Tuten (RB25) add further depth at the position, each also falling to SKOL_Scott_Fish later than the market expected. The one legitimate concern worth noting is Josh Jacobs (RB16), a projected starter whose offseason legal situation remains unresolved and could affect his availability. Even accounting for that uncertainty, this roster projects to the 88th percentile of the field and second in the division, a rebound so steep it looks less like a correction and more like a completely different team wearing the same name.

Czar2014 sits first in the Tron division and in the 91st percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. There are no reaches anywhere on this roster, zero minor and zero major, while four picks landed ahead of their market price, including two genuine steals. Jaxson Dart fell a full 1.3 rounds past his ADP and slots in as a projected QB11 starter, real QB1 upside at a discount. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Omarion Hampton at RB9 give this team a backfield foundation that most managers would build an entire draft around, and Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 sitting behind them is almost unfair. Bucky Irving fell 1.6 rounds and landed as a projected RB21 starter. Even Mike Evans, coming off an injury-shortened season and a fresh start with San Francisco, projects as a WR27 contributor with something to prove. This is what disciplined drafting looks like from top to bottom, a team built on patience and process with virtually nothing to criticize.
