Heading into the 2025 season, the otownbucs are staring down a challenging road ahead. Despite the presence of strong quarterbacks like Josh Allen and Justin Herbert, their ranking as 11th in the division and in the 9th percentile overall suggests that they face significant hurdles. While their wide receiver corps is somewhat respectable with Amon-Ra St. Brown and Mike Evans leading the pack, the glaring weakness at running back with Rhamondre Stevenson as a projected starter could severely hamper their ability to compete effectively. As they navigate both division play

against teams like the UCF Knights and a broader competitive landscape, the otownbucs will need more than just solid quarterback play to avoid another disappointing season.
