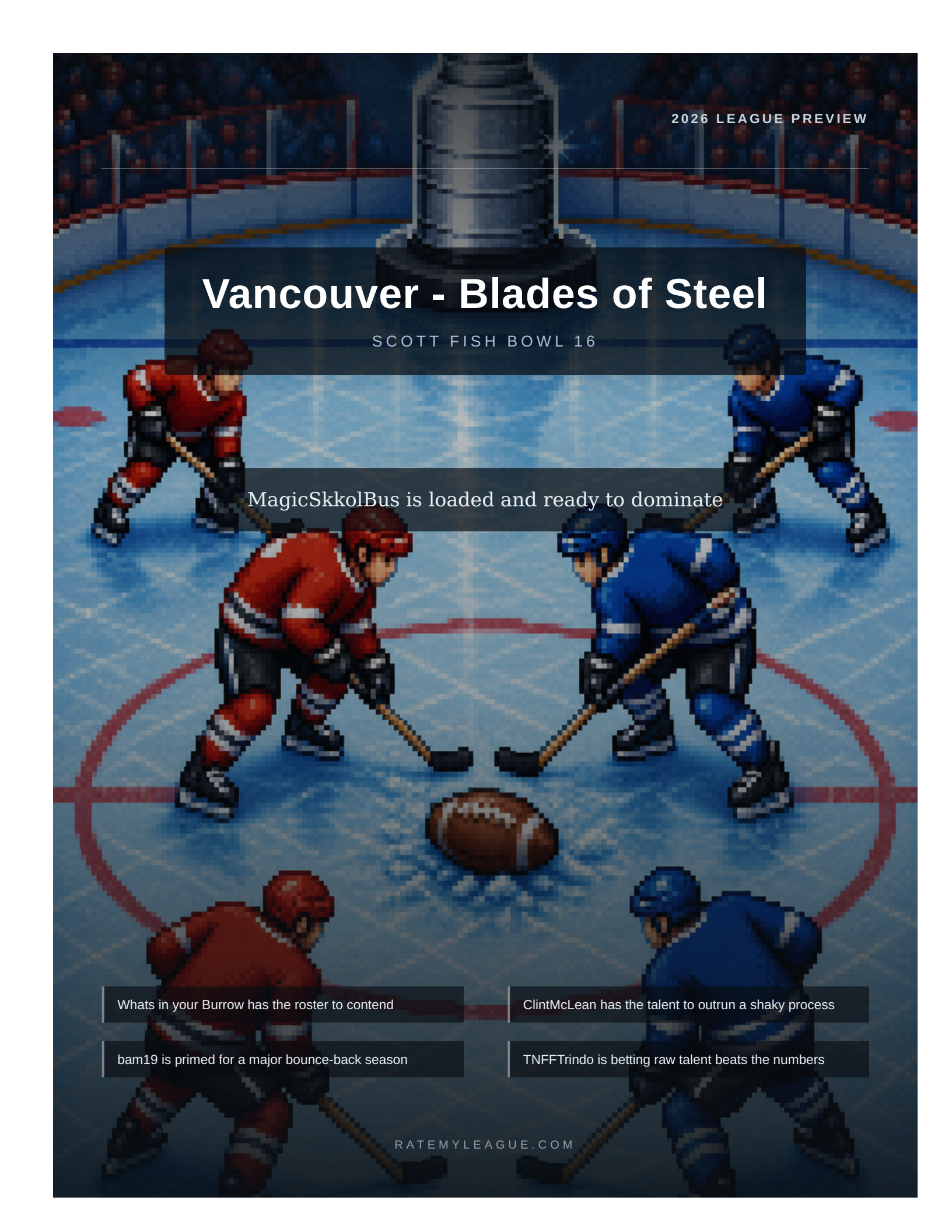

BigTDobbs finished 69th percentile in scoring last season and turned that into a 4th percentile roster entering 2026, which is the kind of regression arc that makes you want to look away. The receiving corps grades out weak, with Jordan Addison projected as the weakest projected starter at WR43, and the rest of the wideout depth chart trailing off into players ranked WR69 through WR97. The draft offers little comfort either: two major reaches headlined the board, with Matthew Stafford taken a full 2.3 rounds before his ADP and Patrick Mahomes grabbed 1.4 rounds early, both moves that cost BigTDobbs real draft capital to land quarterbacks who project at QB14 and QB12 respectively. The Stafford situation is particularly grim, a 38-year-old coming off an MVP season who already has his replacement waiting in the wings. Jonathan Taylor and De'Von Achane are genuinely strong pieces, but in a positionless format where roster quality is everything, sitting 12th in the Blades of Steel division, there is no obvious lever left to pull.

FireTheCannonsKR did almost everything right in the draft room and has very little to show for it. Justin Jefferson at WR6 slid to 2.05 when his ADP was 1.12, Chase Brown at RB11 fell nearly a full round, and Baker Mayfield came in two rounds late as the tournament's QB18. That is three legitimate gifts from a patient, disciplined approach. And yet the roster sits at 25th percentile and 11th in the Blades of Steel, which is what happens when the values are real but the ceiling they build toward is modest. Jefferson is a genuine anchor, but the next tier drops quickly, and Tony Pollard at RB30 is the projected weakest starter. The cruelest part is the process deserves a better grade than the product. Reaching 2.6 rounds early on Jakobi Meyers at WR45 did not help, and the tight end situation offers nothing meaningful. Last season produced a 9th percentile scoring finish. The draft was smarter this time. The roster does not feel like it was.

OliFantasy did almost everything right in the draft. Travis Etienne fell a round and a half before being scooped up, Mark Andrews came a full round late, and Travis Hunter tumbled nearly four rounds past his ADP before this team claimed him. Fourteen of eighteen picks landed at or after ADP, which is the kind of disciplined draft board that fantasy writers praise in August. The cruelty is that the reward for all that patience is a roster sitting 10th in the Blades of Steel division and in the 26th percentile of the field, a projection that echoes last season's 15th-percentile scoring performance. The receiver group projects as weak, and the projected starters lean on names like Ladd McConkey at WR20 and Jordyn Tyson at WR34, players who are fine and no more than fine. OliFantasy did not draft recklessly. The market simply handed them correct prices on players who do not add up to a winning total, and there is no lesson to learn from that, no adjustment to make. That is just the draft being unkind to someone who deserved better.

The Savior sits 9th in the Blades of Steel division and in the 29th percentile of the field, and the draft board tells you exactly why. This roster produced zero steals and zero values across the entire draft, which is a genuinely difficult thing to accomplish in a format this deep. What makes it worse is where the misses landed. Caleb Williams, a QB6, was pulled nearly a full round early, meaning The Savior paid a premium for a quarterback who does not even crack the elite tier. Then, as if to double down on the philosophy, Christian Kirk, a WR100, was yanked 4.3 rounds ahead of his ADP, burning late capital on a receiver who ranks outside the top 90 at his position. The receiver group as a whole is a parade of WR55s and beyond, and while Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Breece Hall at RB14 give this team a real foundation, no format rewards you for hoarding strength in one area while your starters elsewhere answer to names like Juwan Johnson, a TE20. The Savior drafted like a team trying to win on vibes. The projections suggest that is not going well.

Jrue Detective enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Blades of Steel and projected at just the 34th percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to suggest a turnaround is coming. The foundation looks legitimate enough: Christian McCaffrey at RB3, James Cook at RB5, and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give this roster a powerful core, and McCaffrey and Barkley were both genuine values relative to their ADPs. The problem is that the manager spent precious late capital chasing that depth rather than shoring up the receiver room, reaching nearly six full rounds early on Elijah Sarratt, who projects all the way down at WR98 and will not be starting. Meanwhile the projected starting receiver group tops out at Rome Odunze at WR30, with Xavier Worthy at WR49 as the weakest projected starter on the entire team. Justin Herbert grading out as a QB8 helps, but this roster is built like a house with a beautiful foundation and a leaky roof. The path from 34th percentile to contention is not obvious from here.

TNFFTrindo finished 24-12 last year and somehow came out of this draft looking even more dangerous, which is a little unsettling for the rest of the Blades of Steel division. The method, though, raises eyebrows. Six minor reaches and two major reaches scattered across the board suggest a manager who was not exactly waiting for value to fall into their lap. And yet. Malik Nabers at WR12 and Garrett Wilson at WR17 headline a receiver group that projects to start multiple genuinely good players, and the tight end depth anchored by Trey McBride at TE2 and Colston Loveland at TE3 is legitimately elite. The one player who earned the "steal" label, Jaxson Dart, is the most complicated piece of the puzzle. He is a QB11 with a real stack to Nabers, but his history of concussion scares and a passing game that has never fully delivered on its promise means this roster's ceiling depends heavily on which version of Dart shows up. The board said reach. The roster says it worked. The season decides who was right.

Cream of Some Monangai sits at 58th percentile and seventh in the Blades of Steel division, which is about as middle-of-the-road as it gets, and the roster itself tells the same story. The top end is genuinely good: Puka Nacua projects as WR1, Ashton Jeanty comes in at RB7, and Dak Prescott lands at QB7, so the foundation is there. The problem is that the margins around that foundation feel a little soft. The draft leaned heavily chalk, with ten picks at or near consensus and a major reach on Emanuel Wilson, pulled five-plus rounds ahead of his ADP to land a RB69 projection. That kind of aggressive departure from consensus only pays off if Wilson dramatically outperforms expectations, and betting on a late-roster dart to do the heavy lifting is exactly the wrong way to build cushion. Kyle Monangai projects as the weakest starter on this roster, and in a format where every week is a chess match, a soft floor at RB33 means Nacua and Jeanty have to carry a heavier load than a contender would want to ask of them.

ClintMcLean's draft board looks like someone kept jumping the line, and the finished roster looks like it worked. The numbers say four minor reaches and two major ones, including Kaelon Black taken nearly nine rounds early and Greg Dulcich pulled almost three rounds ahead of schedule. Most managers who draft that aggressively are punished by the market. ClintMcLean got away with it, in part because the board delivered where it mattered most. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed in the second round, the kind of gift that papers over a lot of late-round gambling. Add Josh Allen at QB1 stacking with both D.J. Moore and Dalton Kincaid, and the ceiling on this roster is legitimately hard to argue with. A 59th percentile tournament projection and fifth in the Blades of Steel division feel conservative given that core. Whether ClintMcLean is a bold drafter or just someone who caught Lamb sliding, the result is the same: a team built around conviction that the standings might soon validate.

Last year bam19 finished with a 3-33 record and scored in the third percentile of the entire field, a performance so bleak it almost defied statistical possibility. The 2026 roster reads like a direct repudiation of that misery. Jahmyr Gibbs projects as the RB1 in the tournament, and the receiving corps around him is genuinely impressive, with Drake London at WR7 and Nico Collins at WR9 both projecting as starters. Then there is Tucker Kraft, the most intriguing piece of the whole operation. Kraft was pacing toward 1,000 yards before a November ACL injury ended his 2025 season, and while a preseason PUP stint raised eyebrows, he cleared it before August. With the Packers losing more receivers than they added in the offseason, Kraft steps back into a role that was turning into something special, and he projects at TE5. Jalen Hurts, acquired past his ADP at a full round of value, rounds out a lineup that lands bam19 at the 74th percentile. The rebound is not just plausible here. It looks inevitable.

Whats in your Burrow? sits third in the division and in the 79th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet tells you exactly why: this roster was built with patience and precision. Joe Burrow landed at QB4 half a round past his ADP, and the Burrow-Tee Higgins stack gives the lineup a connected upside that compounds as the season deepens. Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 was a minor reach at 1.02, but paying a slight premium for a projected top-three receiver is the kind of reach that ages well. The real discipline showed up in the middle rounds, where Tyler Shough fell more than two full rounds to 11.02 and Alvin Kamara slipped nearly three rounds to 18.11, both landing as genuine steals. Across the full board, the team logged more values and steals than reaches, which is exactly what clean drafting looks like on paper. Trevor Lawrence was the one meaningful overpay, but with Burrow projecting at QB4, Lawrence is depth most teams would envy.

Save Me, Manny didn't win the draft with one thunderous pick. They won it by being right, over and over again. The foundation is a receiver corps that reads like a fever dream: Ja'Marr Chase (WR2), A.J. Brown (WR8), and George Pickens (WR10) as projected starters, each capable of carrying a week on his own. Brown is the thread worth pulling here. His move to New England pairs him with a quarterback coming off an MVP runner-up campaign in Drake Maye, and the expectation is fireworks as long as Brown can stay on the field, which has been the perennial asterisk on an otherwise elite profile. Then there is Harold Fannin (TE6), who fell more than a round past his ADP at pick 6.09, a quiet coup that the final standings may not even bother to explain. The draft log shows 14 chalk picks and three values against zero major reaches, the signature of a manager who respected the board and let it reward them. Division rank of second and an 83rd-percentile tournament projection suggest it already has.

The headliner is Amon-Ra St. Brown, a WR4 projection snagged at 2.06 when his ADP sat at 1.10, a steal that anchors the whole operation. Pair him with Jared Goff, a quarterback who has quietly finished as a top-10 fantasy option four straight years and brings a full supporting cast back in Detroit, and that stack becomes one of the cleaner sources of weekly floor in this tournament. Then consider that Brock Bowers projects as TE1 and Tyler Warren comes in at TE4, with Warren himself arriving as a value taken more than a round past his ADP. Three values, one steal, and a single minor reach across the entire board tells you this manager was patient, disciplined, and never panicked. The weakest projected starter is Michael Pittman at WR44, which is the kind of complaint that sounds like bragging. This roster was built the right way.
