Pavel Bure #10 sits dead last in the NHL94 division and in the bottom ten percent of the entire field, and the draft record explains why. Of 19 picks, not one qualifies as a steal, and the reaches pile up like unpaid bills: six minor, two major, zero mercy. The most damaging is Travis Kelce, pulled at 4.09 when his ADP sat at 7.05, a two-plus round overpay for a TE10 projection that cost real draft capital at a moment when the board was still loaded. Rhamondre Stevenson, taken two rounds early at 9.04 and projected RB31, slots in as the weakest projected starter, which is a brutal sentence to type about someone who cost a ninth-round pick. Josh Allen and Saquon Barkley are genuinely excellent anchors, and Kyren Williams at RB15 represents the one moment the manager let value come to them rather than chasing it. But two good players and one good pick do not paper over a draft that spent its ammunition on the wrong targets at the wrong times.

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes not from effort but from math, and Boom Boom is deep in it. The team checks in at 11th in the NHL94 division and the 16th percentile of the field, and the roster does not offer an obvious way out. De'Von Achane at RB6 and Rashee Rice at WR13 are legitimate weapons, and Tetairoa McMillan at WR15 and Luther Burden at WR22 give the lineup real upside behind them. But the floor drops off quickly: the projected tenth starter is KC Concepcion at WR50, and Drake Maye, the best quarterback on the roster, grades out as a QB2 in a format where starting him is optional. The draft did not help the cause either, producing zero steals and zero values across 20 picks, just 16 chalk selections and four minor reaches, the steepest of which was Jake Ferguson taken nearly two rounds before his ADP. Boom Boom went 50 percent last year and scored in the 72nd percentile, which means the points were there but the wins were not. This year, the points look harder to come by.

Jeremy Roenick sits tenth in the NHL94 division and projects in just the 20th percentile of the field, and nothing in this roster construction suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The anchor is real: Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this team a genuinely elite backfield foundation, and Tyler Warren at TE4 is the kind of difference-maker most managers would trade a minor organ to acquire. But the draft did this team no favors. Fourteen chalk picks in a single draft is a strategy that works when your ADP read is perfect and the gods are kind, and Roenick got neither. The one confirmed value on the board was Jerry Jeudy at WR66, which tells you everything about where the surplus ended up. Meanwhile, the projected weakest starter is Michael Pittman at WR44, a ceiling that would embarrass a middle-of-the-pack roster and is quietly devastating for one trying to climb out of the division basement. Robinson and Jeanty will do their jobs. The rest of this roster has to hope the projections are wrong.

Alexander Mogilny sits ninth in the NHL94 division and around the 40th percentile of the field, and the roster makes it hard to argue with either number. Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and James Cook (RB5) are genuine difference-makers, and Patrick Mahomes (QB12) keeps the quarterback room from becoming a disaster, but the draft chart tells a quiet story of a manager paddling against the current: thirteen chalk picks, five minor reaches, and one major reach in Justin Fields (QB38), taken four and a half rounds before his ADP suggests anyone else wanted him. That kind of draft capital spent on a QB38 is the sort of decision that echoes all season. The supporting cast does little to absorb the blow. Malik Nabers (WR12) and Zay Flowers (WR16) provide real upside at receiver, but the depth falls off sharply to Davante Adams (WR25), and the lone identified value on the entire board is Adams himself. When your best bargain is a player who slid barely a round and a half past his ADP, the margin for error is already gone.

SalPal2 ran a disciplined draft, taking 15 players at chalk and nabbing two genuine values in Jeremiyah Love and Tank Dell, both of whom fell past their ADP by more than a round. The problem is that patience and precision are not the same thing as upside, and this roster keeps reminding you of that distinction. Joe Burrow projects as QB4 and Amon-Ra St. Brown as WR4, so the ceiling pieces are real. But the depth behind them gets thin in a hurry: Kenneth Gainwell projects as RB34 and is penciled in as a starter, the tight end group is a minor league audition with David Njoku at TE29, and Dell sits all the way down at WR74. Finishing 75th percentile in scoring last year with a 27-9 record is a legitimately strong foundation, but the 2026 construction feels like a team that did everything right in the draft room and still left without quite enough. The gap between following the process and winning the result is exactly this wide, and SalPal2 is living in it at 44th percentile.

Scott Stevens finished 2025 at 99th percentile in scoring and promptly drafted his way to 47th percentile in 2026 projections, which tells you everything about how fine the margins are here. The core is real: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1, Nico Collins at WR9, and Tee Higgins and Ladd McConkey both projected as starters give this roster genuine upside at the top. The question is whether that ceiling gets reached, and that depends heavily on Caleb Williams, who was taken half a round early and needs to validate the faith. Jordan Love is the wilder card, a quarterback who wins real games and loses fantasy weeks, projected at QB17 on a team that still lacks a true alpha receiver and is waiting to see if Tucker Kraft's ACL recovery holds. Williams goes cold, Love disappoints again, and suddenly the margin between 7th in the NHL94 division and something better evaporates. Stevens is not a pretender and not a contender. He is exactly the kind of team that either catches a few breaks or quietly watches the playoffs from the outside.

TheCammer Neely sits at 49th percentile heading into 2026, which is exactly as uncomfortable as it sounds: close enough to contention to believe, far enough from it to worry. The foundation is real. Trey McBride at TE2 and Kyle Pitts at TE7 give this roster a legitimate upper-tier anchor, and Drake London at WR7 provides a reliable high-end option to build around. The problem is that the floor drops off quickly after those names. Quentin Johnston projects as the weakest projected starter at WR41, and a 2025 campaign that produced a 36 percent win rate suggests this manager already knows what it feels like when the margins turn the wrong way. The draft was mostly chalk, 15 of 20 picks landing right at ADP, which is fine when your top-end talent carries you and quietly damaging when it doesn't. TheCammer Neely is the team that finishes 7-7 and spends the last three weeks doing math. McBride and London either elevate the whole thing or they don't, and right now that question has no clean answer.

Joel Otto didn't swing for the fences and miss, he just kept connecting. The clearest example is Justin Jefferson, snagged at WR6 in a spot where most managers had already moved on, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 slipping a full round past his ADP before Otto quietly picked him up. Neither move looks flashy on a draft recap, but both represent the kind of quiet market inefficiency that separates good drafts from great ones. Layer in Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and D.J. Moore at WR26, also taken after his ADP, and this starting group has genuine top-end punch. The concerns are real but minor: only three picks qualify as values against ADP, and last season's 53rd-percentile scoring finish is a reminder that projection and production don't always shake hands. Still, a 67th-percentile tournament standing paired with a starting core this strong suggests the floor is solid. Otto enters 2026 not as a dark horse, but as a team that did the work early so the season can speak for itself.

Tie Domi did not build this roster by hunting for a unicorn pick that would carry the whole operation. They built it by simply not losing rounds. The foundation is legitimate: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and Jonathan Taylor at RB4 give this team a pair of projected starters who anchor any lineup conversation, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 arriving four tenths of a round past his ADP means Domi essentially found a top-ten back at a discount. The value thread runs further. Cam Ward fell nearly a full round and a half past his ADP before Domi grabbed him, and Parker Washington slipped similarly before getting scooped in the ninth. None of these are lottery tickets. They are players who were simply available later than they should have been, and Domi was paying close enough attention to take them. Finishing 71st percentile in the tournament and fourth in the NHL94 division, with a projected starting lineup that touches WR5, RB4, TE6, and TE9, this is not a team built on hope. It is a team built on repetition.

Calex didn't hunt for lightning in a bottle in 2026, just kept making smart, quiet decisions that added up. The receiver group is the clearest evidence: Puka Nacua at WR1, George Pickens at WR10, Garrett Wilson at WR17, and Jaylen Waddle at WR23 are all projected starters, and that kind of sustained quality across a position group doesn't happen by accident. Carnell Tate at WR29 and Jordyn Tyson at WR34 round out a starting core that gives Calex genuine options every single week. The one real blemish is Emanuel Wilson, a reach of 5.2 rounds that stands out on an otherwise disciplined sheet, but one overreach is a footnote when the rest of the board was managed this cleanly. Baker Mayfield coming in 1.2 rounds after his ADP looks modest, but adding a projected starter at value while the rest of the field reached is exactly the kind of small edge that compounds. A 90th percentile scoring season in 2025 and a current projection of 75th percentile and third in the division suggests a team built to be around for a while.

Bob Probert did not win the Scott Fish Bowl draft with one thunderbolt pick. He won it the way good teams are usually built, by consistently coming out ahead on deal after deal. The anchor is a quarterback situation that most managers would trade their best pick to own: Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jayden Daniels at QB5, both projected starters, both acquired in the second round after their ADPs had already passed. Jackson alone, slipping to pick 2.08 when his ADP sat at 2.03, is the kind of small edge that separates organized drafters from lucky ones. The receiving end of that passing attack is fronted by Brock Bowers at TE1 and Tucker Kraft at TE5, a starter combination at the position that essentially functions as a cheat code at the top of the lineup. Makai Lemon falling more than a round past his ADP rounds out the value column quietly. The 2025 campaign landed in the 48th percentile, and this roster is clearly built to leave that finish well behind. Sitting second in the NHL94 division and in the 76th tournament percentile, Probert looks like a team that got its reps in and came back sharper.

Big Dirty Steamer #12 sits atop the NHL94 division and in the 88th percentile of the field, and the draft log tells you exactly why: no single flashy heist, just a steady accumulation of edges that added up to something real. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 came off the board four spots later than his ADP suggested he would, which is the kind of quiet gift that sets a roster's ceiling before the second round even arrives. Then the manager went back to that well late, landing TreVeyon Henderson at RB19 a full round and a half past his ADP and Jaylen Warren at RB27 even deeper into the draft than the market expected. Pair those value acquisitions with a starting corps that includes Jalen Hurts at QB9 and A.J. Brown at WR8, and the picture gets clearer. Brown's move to New England alongside Drake Maye is the kind of pairing that makes a WR8 projection feel conservative if he can stay healthy. This is a team that won the draft quietly, then handed you a roster that does its talking on the field.
