Sprice8907 enters 2026 sitting 12th in the Vegas Stakes division and in the 11th percentile of the field, and the draft log explains exactly why. Four major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and not a good one. Mark Andrews, projected TE14, came off the board at pick 5.09 against an ADP of 8.12, a three-round overpay for a tight end who does not crack the position's top ten. Aaron Jones, projected RB38, was drafted nine full rounds before managers around the tournament considered him draftable at that price. Christian Kirk, projected WR100, was taken nearly five rounds early and projects as a fringe player on a starting lineup that needs real contributors. The one genuine value on the board, Josh Allen at QB1, was allowed to fall to 1.09, which means Sprice8907 identified the field's best quarterback correctly and then spent the rest of the draft treating late-round depth like it was top-shelf talent. A 19-percent win rate in 2025 suggested this roster needed an overhaul. The draft delivered one, just in the wrong direction.

Varga99 sits 11th in the Vegas Stakes division and in the 19th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly how they got there: five major reaches, three minor reaches, and zero steals. The most damning exhibit is Nicholas Singleton, a RB57 pulled off the board at pick 11.05 when his consensus home was round 18. That is seven rounds of draft capital vaporized on a player projected outside the top 50 at his position, a mistake large enough to haunt this roster all season. Skyler Bell, a WR103, got drafted in round 16 when the market had him sitting comfortably in round 24, and Elijah Sarratt, a WR98, went nearly five rounds early as well, which means Varga99 spent late-round picks on players the field was content to leave on the wire. Joe Burrow lands as a genuine value at QB4, and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 anchors the lineup, but when a manager reaches five times and steals zero times, the rest of the roster becomes an apology note written in waiver-wire ink.

There is something almost admirable about how No Loose Ends went about their draft, fourteen chalk picks and almost every selection landing at or after ADP, a patient, process-correct approach that should, in theory, produce a functional roster. It did not. The tight end group is genuinely elite, with Trey McBride, Colston Loveland, Harold Fannin, and Kyle Pitts all projecting as starters, but a positionless format rewards overall depth of talent, and that talent thins out fast everywhere else. The receiver corps is average, anchored by Garrett Wilson at WR17, while the quarterback situation is a collection of afterthoughts: Geno Smith at QB30, Deshaun Watson at QB34, Kirk Cousins at QB35. No Loose Ends played the value game with discipline and still landed at 30th percentile in the field, good for tenth in the Vegas Stakes division. That is the cruelest thing a draft can do to a manager, not punish their mistakes, but simply reveal that doing everything right was never going to be enough.

Jogagtou enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Vegas Stakes division and projected in just the 32nd percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to suggest a turnaround is coming. The headliner is Bijan Robinson at RB2, a genuinely elite asset, and the Herbert/McConkey stack gives the team a cheap source of connective tissue after Justin Herbert fell more than a round past his ADP. But that is roughly where the good news stops. The draft was overwhelmingly chalk, with no steals and two major reaches that now haunt the middle rounds: Rico Dowdle, projected RB32 and the team's weakest starter, was drafted nearly three rounds early, and James Conner, sitting at RB56, was yanked off the board more than five rounds before the market said to. That is a lot of draft capital spent chasing depth that is not projecting to carry its cost. Robinson can only do so much, and when your path to competitiveness runs entirely through one player while the rest of the roster is built on overpaid late contributors, the climb looks very steep.

Cpezo did almost everything right in the draft room and still landed at 7th in the Vegas Stakes division, which is the kind of outcome that should come with a formal apology from the universe. The value discipline was real: Jayden Daniels fell a round and a half into pick 4.01, Travis Etienne slid nearly two rounds before Cpezo scooped him at 8.01, and Jonathon Brooks dropped three full rounds to land at 16.01. Six values, one steal, and only two major reaches across the entire board. The problem is that the roster ceiling keeps running into the same wall. Romeo Doubs, projected WR53, is the weakest starter, which means the back end of this lineup is quietly bleeding points every week. The stacks with Drake Maye and A.J. Brown and Daniels and Terry McLaurin give this team genuine upside, but at 34th percentile, upside is doing a lot of heavy lifting. Cpezo bought correctly and got the wrong answer anyway, which is the draft equivalent of showing your work perfectly and still failing the test.

fredzinkie did almost everything right. Four values, fifteen chalk picks, and only one meaningful reach across the entire draft, which is the kind of discipline that usually produces something formidable. And yet here we are: eighth in the Vegas Stakes division and sitting at the 34th percentile. The foundation is genuinely strong, with James Cook at RB5 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 anchoring a lineup that has real upside, and the value on Jeremiyah Love, RJ Harvey, and Tyjae Spears was correctly identified when the board allowed it. The problem is the quarterback situation, which does not so much anchor the roster as haunt it. Baker Mayfield projects as QB18 and Kyler Murray as QB19, which means fredzinkie is essentially betting on a man who played five games last season before a lisfranc injury ended his year in Arizona, and who now enters a quarterback competition in Minnesota that everyone politely insists is real. Discipline without luck is just a well-organized disappointment.

joewandy is the team that beats you when you sleep on them and loses to you when you take them seriously, which is precisely the problem. The upper tier of this roster is genuinely strong: Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, Nico Collins at WR9, and Tucker Kraft at TE5 give joewandy the kind of weekly floor that keeps a team competitive deep into the schedule. Kraft is the player worth watching closely, coming off a November ACL tear after a season that had him pacing toward 1,000 yards, and with the Packers losing more receivers than they added this offseason, his path back to a starring role looks clear if he returns to pre-injury form. The concern is at the margins. Shedeur Sanders sitting at QB32 is a quiet drain on a roster that needs every edge it can find, and the draft carried two major reaches, Jameson Williams taken 1.6 rounds early and Darnell Washington pulled nearly five rounds

before his ADP, which is the kind of draft capital inefficiency that shows up in the standings. Sitting 6th in the Vegas Stakes at the 38th percentile, joewandy is not broken, just balanced on a knife's edge.

Erick45071 is the team that beats you when you overlook them and loses when they can't afford to. Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is a genuine difference-maker at the top of this roster, and pairing Caleb Williams with Rome Odunze while also stacking Brock Purdy with Mike Evans gives this team two live wires to pull from on any given week. The problem is that the margins this team lives by can cut both ways. Purdy is a walking injury report even before you factor in that his supporting cast in San Francisco is a mess, with Kittle recovering from a torn Achilles and Ricky Pearsall's 2026 availability in question. Meanwhile, the draft board tells a story in the later rounds: Mike Washington Jr., Kaytron Allen, and Dontayvion Wicks were all taken five or more rounds ahead of consensus, the kind of aggressive late-round swings that look brilliant in one universe and cost you wins in this one. At 43rd percentile entering 2026, this roster is built exactly on the margins, and the margins have a way of not caring about good intentions.

JAXCOMMISH enters 2026 sitting 64th percentile in the field, and the draft record explains exactly why: two steals, three values, and only one major reach across the entire roster. That is a draft built on discipline, not luck. The headliners are real, Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 giving this team a pair of projected difference-makers who anchor whatever lineup construction the week demands. But the deeper story is how JAXCOMMISH kept finding value in the middle rounds, landing Trevor Lawrence at QB10 a full round-plus after his ADP and picking up Tyler Shough at QB20 even later than that. The one blemish is Brenton Strange, reached two full rounds early and projected as the weakest starter at TE17, but in a positionless format one uncomfortable pick at that tier is hardly a death sentence. This roster did not spike one round and crater the next. It just quietly came out ahead, pick after pick, and that kind of draft tends to age well.

Bighowie79 didn't win any rounds on draft day so much as they quietly won every round. Six values across the roster, zero major reaches, and a top-three finish in the division that looks entirely earned when you trace how it was built. Lamar Jackson at QB3 slid to pick 2.10, nearly a full round past his ADP, and Jalen Hurts at QB9 fell even further to 4.10, meaning Bighowie79 essentially got two legitimate starting quarterbacks for the price of one and a half. That kind of patience compounds. Brock Bowers at TE1 was the one moment Bighowie79 went early, grabbing him at 1.03 when ADP said 1.07, and in a positionless format where the top tight end scores just like the top running back, that is hardly a concession. The one real asterisk on this roster belongs to Josh Jacobs, a projected starter whose off-field situation is still unresolved and could scramble the back end of this depth chart. Even accounting for that uncertainty, the 68th percentile projection feels conservative for a manager who consistently found value where the board left it.

BoJacky did not build this roster by swinging for the fences on one splashy pick and hoping for the best. This is a draft built on quiet, compounding advantages, the kind that only look boring until you add them up. Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 came off the board five picks after his ADP suggested he would, and Cam Skattebo at RB20 slid more than a round past where he had any business still sitting. That is not luck, that is positioning. The QB situation adds an interesting wrinkle: Patrick Mahomes, recovering from a torn ACL and LCL suffered late in 2025, is reportedly ahead of schedule, and if he takes the field in 2026 at anything close to his historical level, pairing him alongside Jaxson Dart at QB11 gives BoJacky genuine optionality at the position. Sitting second in the Vegas Stakes division and in the 81st percentile of the field, this team earned its standing the unglamorous way, by consistently getting more than they paid for, round after round after round.

Ychaikovsky isn't hoping stacks fall into place; they drafted specifically to make them the load-bearing structure of this roster. The centerpiece is a dual-QB architecture built for ceiling: Dak Prescott, a QB7 projection snagged at pick 4.12 when his ADP sat a full round and a half earlier, is paired with George Pickens, a WR10 who turns that value into something exponential when the two connect on the same big day. Matthew Stafford runs the same logic in the other direction, paired with Puka Nacua, a WR1 projection who makes Stafford relevant in any week he shows up. When both stacks fire simultaneously, this team doesn't just score, it laps the field. The honest caveat is correlation cuts both ways: a quiet week from Prescott doesn't just hurt the QB slot, it pulls Pickens down with it. That risk explains why Ychaikovsky drafted so aggressively for value elsewhere, landing Breece Hall at pick 7.01 when his ADP was 5.02 and De'Von Achane similarly late, building enough floor to survive the weeks the stacks go quiet.
