There is a particular kind of draft heartbreak reserved for the manager who did everything right and still ended up here. Q executed a patient, disciplined draft, landing players at or after ADP on nearly every selection, and yet the Wario division has them projected dead last, sitting in the fourth percentile of the entire field. The cruelest evidence is at the top of the roster: CeeDee Lamb at WR5 and De'Von Achane at RB6 are genuinely elite assets, the kind of names that anchor contenders. But the depth behind them collapses fast, and the projected weakest starter tells the whole story. RJ Harvey arrives in Denver as RB28 on paper, but with JK Dobbins back and the Broncos adding Jonah Coleman in the fourth round, Harvey is walking into a three-way committee with no clear path to a featured role. Q found value, stayed disciplined, avoided catastrophic reaches, and still assembled a roster where the margin for error at the starter level is essentially zero. The math was correct. The answers were not.

ffpeebleschamp drafted like someone who showed up to the board with a plan and then immediately abandoned it at the worst possible moments. The signature move here is the Bucky Irving pick, a WR21-level reach taken 2.8 rounds early, which would be forgivable exactly once if the rest of the draft hadn't also featured Jayden Daniels going 1.4 rounds before his ADP and Keon Coleman, a projected WR91, somehow getting drafted 4.5 rounds ahead of schedule. That is not a draft strategy, that is a panic attack formatted as a spreadsheet. The bitter irony is that patience would have paid off: Jalen Hurts fell 2.5 full rounds past his ADP and landed at 6.06, a genuine windfall, and the team still managed to finish with more major reaches than values. The result is a roster sitting at 8th percentile in the field, propped up by a Hurts and Dallas Goedert stack that was earned accidentally, and dragged down by a series of decisions that no charitable interpretation can rescue.

There is no polite way to say this: LouGarou is staring down a long season from the 8th percentile of the field, sitting last in the Wario division, and the draft did not give them much reason to feel otherwise. The roster leans heavily on its top end, where A.J. Brown at WR8 and Colston Loveland at TE3 are legitimate difference-makers, but both cost a premium, and reaching early for premium pieces only helps if the rest of the roster can hold the floor. It cannot, not convincingly. The weakest projected starter is KC Concepcion at WR50, and the quarterback situation is quietly grim: Jaxson Dart projects as QB11, which is fine, but Baker Mayfield sits at QB18 after a 2025 regression, and with Mike Evans now gone in free agency, the ceiling Mayfield showed in 2024 looks further away rather than closer. Dart may well be the answer, but leaning on an unproven QB1 while your depth grades this thin is less a plan than a hope, and hope is not a strategy LouGarou can afford this year.

FFStalder went into the Scott Fish Bowl draft and somehow turned a 2025 season that finished in the 82nd percentile of scoring into this. Four major reaches, four minor reaches, zero steals, and one solitary value pick: that is the draft ledger, and it does not lie. The lone bright spot is Patrick Mahomes at QB12, who at least fell to round seven and softened the damage slightly. But the construction around him is where things collapse. Jeremiyah Love looks fine on paper at RB13, except FFStalder reached a full 1.3 rounds early to get him, which means the board was already bent before the draft hit its stride. Puka Nacua projects as WR1 and is the genuine anchor here, and the Bo Nix and Jaylen Waddle stack carries real intrigue now that Waddle lands in a Denver offense that actually functions. That is about where the charitable read runs out. Omar Cooper Jr. at WR60 was taken three full rounds early. Michael Mayer projects as TE39 and cost a fifth-round premium over his market price. The 20th percentile projection feels less like a verdict and more like a confession.

At the Death enters the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl sitting eighth in the Wario Division and in just the 33rd percentile of the field, and the roster construction does not suggest a dramatic reversal is coming. The two pillars worth celebrating are real: Brock Bowers (TE1) and Tyler Warren (TE4) anchor a genuinely elite group at the position, and Drake London (WR7) gives the team a credible top-end weapon. The problem is that the floor drops fast after that. Geno Smith (QB30) is a liability at a position where being merely average costs you, and the draft board tells a story the final standings will likely confirm. The manager burned 13 early selections on chalk, logged three major reaches including Michael Wilson at WR39 taken nearly three rounds before his market value and Gunnar Helm at TE26 grabbed more than two rounds early, and found only a single genuine value in Khalil Shakir (WR51). When your biggest drafting wins are modest and your mistakes are expensive, Bowers and London have to carry an awful lot of weight.

DevButt44 finished 6-30 last season and ranked in the 6th percentile in scoring, and the 2026 projections offer almost no reason to believe the floor is higher than the basement. The roster leans almost entirely on a wide receiver group headlined by Ja'Marr Chase (WR2) and Rashee Rice (WR13), but that strength evaporates the moment you move past the top names, with Xavier Worthy projected at WR49 as the weakest projected starter. Worse, the draft did nothing to shore up the vulnerabilities, producing zero steals against three major reaches, including Rice taken nearly a full round and a half before consensus had him valued. Jared Goff and Kyler Murray project at QB16 and QB19 respectively, which is functional but not the kind of upside that papers over problems elsewhere. Sitting 7th in the Wario division and in just the 35th tournament percentile, DevButt44 is the team that arrives with good intentions and leaves wondering why none of it added up.

Josh ADHD didn't win the draft with a single knockout pick. They won it by consistently finding the right player at the right price, and the cumulative effect lands them at the 62nd percentile entering 2026. The backfield alone makes a case: Ashton Jeanty at RB7 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 are both projected starters, and Jeanty technically cost a slight premium over ADP, but taking him at 2.05 when consensus had him sliding to 2.09 is the kind of minor overpay that looks smart in November. Caleb Williams, meanwhile, fell nearly a full round past his ADP before this team grabbed him at 4.05, which is the sort of quiet market inefficiency that compounds over a season. Add projected starters Kyle Pitts at TE7 and George Kittle at TE9, and the top of this roster has real teeth. The floor is set by Jadarian Price at RB26, which is not alarming for a projected starter. Fifth in the Wario Division is an honest assessment of a team that did nearly everything right without doing anything flashy.

Gold Rush Kid didn't need a moment of lottery-ticket genius to build this roster. The draft was a steady accumulation of edges, four players taken at genuine value and no catastrophic misses. James Cook landing at RB5 a half-round after his ADP is the kind of quiet win that compounds over a season, and Terry McLaurin falling a full round and a half to land as a projected starter at WR24 is exactly the sort of inefficiency that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. Marvin Harrison Jr. at WR33, taken nearly a round and a half past his expected price, adds another starter acquired below market. The one blemish worth noting is Kyle Monangai, a three-round reach who shows up as a non-starter at RB33, meaning Gold Rush Kid paid a significant premium for depth that may never see the field. Still, sitting at the 61st percentile of the field with a starting core anchored by Cook, Derrick Henry at RB12, and Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, this team earned its standing one quiet advantage at a time.

dibari22 didn't try to be clever. This roster was built through consistent execution, and the results speak for themselves: a 75th percentile finish projected for 2026, built almost entirely on disciplined drafting rather than lottery-ticket swings. The foundation is hard to argue with. Bijan Robinson at RB2 anchors the whole operation, and Joe Burrow at QB4 gives this team a genuine difference-maker at the position. What makes the draft stand out, though, is how often dibari22 let the board come to them. Mark Andrews fell more than two full rounds past his ADP before landing at pick 11.05, and Dak Prescott slid more than a round to give this team real depth at quarterback. That's three values and a steal across the draft, against just two minor reaches and zero major ones. The 2025 campaign ended at the 36th percentile, which makes 2026 feel like a correction waiting to happen. The pieces are better, the draft was cleaner, and the Wario Division should take notice.

Sillynannies didn't swing for the fences and miss, they just kept making the right call, round after round, and the 88th percentile standing in the field reflects exactly that. The cornerstone of the whole operation is the quarterback situation, where Josh Allen, a QB1, slid all the way to pick 2.02 despite an ADP of 1.05, and then Lamar Jackson, a QB3, fell another 1.7 rounds past his expected range to land at 3.11. Getting two quarterbacks of that caliber at a collective discount is not luck, it is the draft rewarding patience and preparation. From there, Justin Jefferson at WR6 anchors a receiver group that includes Brian Thomas Jr. at WR31 and Rome Odunze at WR30 among the projected starters, and Chase Brown at RB11 and Kyren Williams at RB15 give the backfield real teeth. This roster was not built on one thunderbolt moment, it was built the way good drafts always are: pick by pick, edge by edge, until the sum becomes something that belongs in the conversation.

SFCARNAGE didn't win the draft with one flashy moment, they won it by being right over and over again. The clearest example is Drake Maye, a QB2 projection snagged at pick 4.07 when his ADP sat at 2.02, meaning the board handed over a near-elite quarterback at a two-round discount. Jonathan Taylor tells a similar story, a RB4 who slid just enough past his ADP for SFCARNAGE to pounce in round two. Layer in Tucker Kraft at TE5 and Travis Kelce at TE10 as projected starters, and the team carries real upside at the top of its roster on multiple fronts. The draft chart backs the eye test: one steal, three values, and only two minor reaches across the entire board, with zero major reaches. That kind of discipline is what lands a team at 97th percentile in the tournament field. Division Wario has a legitimate contender sitting at second in the standings before a game is played, and SFCARNAGE looks like the team that earned it pick by pick.

Doobiedoobiedo didn't win the draft with one splashy pick; they won it by consistently coming out ahead on value, round after round. Justin Herbert landing at 5.09 when his ADP sat at 3.09 is the kind of two-round gift that quietly reshapes a roster, and Christian McCaffrey slipping to 2.04 as the projected RB3 is exactly the sort of discount that compounds over a season. Those two picks alone would justify the headline, but the depth of the value list is what puts this team in the 98th percentile of the field. DeVonta Smith, projected WR14, is worth watching closely: after years operating alongside A.J. Brown in Philadelphia, Smith finally gets to prove he can carry a receiving corps as the unquestioned top option, and this roster is built to capitalize if he does. George Pickens as a projected WR10 starter rounds out a group of contributors that simply outperforms most of what the Wario division has to offer. Division-leading for a reason.
