KatfishBilly sits fifth percentile in the tournament field, and honestly, the roster explains why. The headliner is Saquon Barkley, a projected RB8 who should anchor this lineup, but Barkley at 29 is a complicated sell: coming off a down year in which the Eagles' offensive line crumbled around him, with Philadelphia now reportedly looking to lighten his workload, the gap between the player he was and the player he projects to be is real and shrinking. That is a tough foundation to build on when the rest of the roster offers so little cushion. The QB situation grades out weak, with Jayden Daniels as a projected QB5 who was a major reach at 1.09 despite an ADP closer to the third round, and the receiving corps tops out at Tetairoa McMillan at WR15, a fine piece but not a difference-maker. KatfishBilly went to the well on Barkley, paid up for Daniels, and is now sitting twelfth in the division with no obvious move left to change the math.

Keep Pounding Tight Ends sit 11th in the Call of Duty: Modern Warfare 2 division and in the 15th percentile of the field, and the roster tells you exactly why. The bright spots are real: Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) give this team a genuinely elite top end, and a Matthew Stafford / Davante Adams stack adds connective tissue that can pay off in a big week. But the draft history undermines the optimism. Stafford was the most glaring misfire, pulled off the board 2.2 rounds ahead of his ADP at a time when that capital could have shored up other areas. And the weakest projected starter, RJ Harvey (RB28), is a player whose outlook keeps narrowing: JK Dobbins is back in Denver, the Broncos added Jonah Coleman in the 2026 draft, and Harvey has done little to separate himself in what is shaping into a genuine committee. When your floor depends on a player fighting for touches in a three-way backfield, the ceiling those top receivers offer may not be enough to save you.

There is no kind way to frame Igilbertff's situation in the Call of Duty: Modern Warfare 2 division: this roster grades out in the 15th percentile of the field and sits 10th in the division, and the draft offers little reason to believe the construction process will bail anyone out. The clearest problem is at receiver, where Alec Pierce (WR32) and Parker Washington (WR35) are the projected starters, a duo that ranks near the league median at best. Neither player was a bargain, either, with Pierce taken 1.4 rounds early. Meanwhile, the draft was riddled with cost overruns elsewhere: Dylan Sampson (RB53) was taken 5.6 rounds before consensus, and Isiah Pacheco (RB52) cost three full rounds of premium. Those are the kinds of misallocations that leave a roster looking busy on paper and thin where it counts. Trey McBride (TE2) is a genuine anchor, but one elite player cannot redistribute the weight of a roster this stretched. The levers have been pulled, and the numbers still don't move.

There is no sugarcoating the situation in the Call of Duty: Modern Warfare 2 division, where ShueyFF sits ninth and projects at just the 24th percentile of the field. The wide receiver group is legitimately good, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3 and Nico Collins at WR9, and Omarion Hampton at RB9 gives the roster a credible centerpiece. But past those names, the floor drops out fast, and the draft did little to shore things up. Fourteen chalk picks and two major reaches define a board that never really generated a surprise, and those reaches landed on Tyler Allgeier at RB46 and Jaylen Wright at RB68, taken a combined eight rounds ahead of where the market had them, neither of whom grades as a reliable contributor. The quarterback situation, with Sam Darnold and C.J. Stroud projecting as QB21 and QB22, is the kind of depth that feels reassuring until you remember that reassuring is not the same as good. A 15-21 record in 2025 set the tone, and nothing in this construction suggests 2026 will feel meaningfully different.

texndc enters 2026 with a roster that looks better on paper than it probably will on the field, and the draft decisions made to build it are a big reason why. The backfield is genuinely impressive, anchored by Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and Jonathan Taylor (RB4), and that core alone should keep texndc competitive week to week. But the receiver group is where this team runs out of runway, with Jordyn Tyson (WR34) and Makai Lemon (WR40) leading the way after texndc reached two full rounds early for Tyson and nearly two for Lemon, paying premium prices for players who grade out as fringe contributors at best. The draft tells the fuller story: zero steals, two major reaches, and four minor reaches across the board, meaning texndc consistently overpaid rather than finding value. Sitting eighth in the division and at just the 25th tournament percentile, there is no obvious fix coming from the waiver wire or a trade partner feeling generous. The top of this roster can win matchups, but the roster as a whole is not built to win a tournament.

A-aron and the U30s sit at 44th percentile heading into 2026, and that number feels exactly right, which is both the comfort and the problem. The foundation is real: Josh Allen at QB1 anchors the roster, and the Jalen Hurts and DeVonta Smith stack gives this team a genuine ceiling when Philadelphia clicks. Ashton Jeanty at RB7 adds another projected starter worth building around. But last season's 22 percent win rate and 12th-percentile scoring leave a shadow, and nothing in this construction screams "fixed." The draft was mostly chalk, ten picks at or near ADP, and while Jeanty and Hurts both fell into value territory, reaching for Hurts 1.4 rounds early in the second round suggests a manager who knew what he wanted but paid for the privilege. The margins that decide this season are thin in both directions. Allen carries a high floor, Jeanty and Etienne give the lineup real punch, and yet Kyle Monangai projecting as the weakest starter is a reminder of how quickly a bad week can unravel a team living this close to the middle.

Da Price is Wrong, Pitts sits at the 45th percentile in a tournament where the difference between advancing and watching from the couch is usually one or two roster decisions a week. The pillars are real: Lamar Jackson at QB3 gives the lineup a ceiling most managers would trade for, and CeeDee Lamb at WR5 is the kind of anchor that holds a lineup together on the weeks everything else goes sideways. The worry is what happens when you get past those two. Kyle Pitts at TE7 and Dallas Goedert at TE15 give the manager genuine flexibility at the position, but the running back tier drops off quickly, with Jadarian Price projected as the weakest starter at RB26. A draft that logged 16 chalk calls and zero steals tells you this roster is exactly what it looks like, no hidden upside waiting to be unlocked. Last season's 36 percent win rate was a warning. Jackson and Lamb can carry weeks, but in a format where margins decide everything, "can carry weeks" and "can carry a season" are two very different promises.

Gcarmi21 didn't swing for the fences and whiff, didn't load up on upside and pray. This roster was built pick by pick, and the cumulative effect is a team that quietly belongs in the conversation. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs projects as RB1, James Cook slots in at RB5, and Gcarmi21 grabbed Cook a half-round after his ADP, which is the kind of small, repeatable advantage that separates disciplined drafters from lucky ones. The receiver group adds genuine depth, with Zay Flowers (WR16), Tee Higgins (WR19), and Terry McLaurin (WR24) all projecting as starters. George Kittle at TE9 would be a real asset if healthy, though his Achilles recovery makes "if" do a lot of work in that sentence. The one blemish is Chris Brazzell II, a major reach taken more than six rounds ahead of his ADP who projects all the way down at WR101. One late-draft gamble doesn't undo what came before it, though. Sitting fifth in the Call of Duty: Modern Warfare 2 division and at the 56th percentile, this team has the ceiling to climb.

Chicken Banana landed at 78th percentile in the Scott Fish Bowl field and fourth in the Call of Duty: Modern Warfare 2 division, and the draft sheet looks like a manager who was guessing and got away with it. Three major reaches on the board, thirteen chalk picks, one legitimate steal. The reaches are hard to ignore: Carson Beck taken nearly ten rounds ahead of his ADP, Brian Robinson pulled almost three rounds early, Mike Washington Jr. grabbed nearly three rounds before the field thought he was worth touching. By the numbers, this is someone who either had information nobody else had or simply panicked and got lucky. The roster argues for information. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Drake London at WR7 give this team a legitimate top-line punch, Rashee Rice at WR13 runs as a Mahomes stack that compounds both players' value, and Tyler Warren at TE4 paired with Sam LaPorta at TE8 means the position everyone else is scraping for is where Chicken Banana has genuine depth to deploy. The board says reckless. The roster says right.

Last year was ugly for FantasyFernando, a 10-26 record and a scoring line that landed in the 16th percentile, the kind of season that makes a manager question every decision they made from August onward. The 2026 roster looks like a genuine course correction. The receiver group is the engine here, with Ja'Marr Chase (WR2), A.J. Brown (WR8), and George Pickens (WR10) all projecting as starters, and Garrett Wilson (WR17) and Ladd McConkey (WR20) waiting behind them. That is not depth for depth's sake, that is a top of the roster that most managers in this field simply cannot match, and it is the primary reason FantasyFernando sits at 87th percentile and third in the division. Harold Fannin (TE6) adds a complementary punch at a position where elite options are scarce, and the fact that he was drafted past his ADP makes him one of the two genuine values on this sheet. A brutal 2025 has a way of sharpening a manager's focus, and this roster suggests FantasyFernando came back with a plan.

Soap lands at 89th percentile in the field and second in the Call of Duty: Modern Warfare 2 division, and the case for this team is almost embarrassingly simple: Joe Burrow, Puka Nacua, and Tucker Kraft are all projected starters, and Burrow checks in at QB4, Nacua at WR1, and Kraft at TE5. That is a murderers' row of top-end talent, and in a positionless format where you field whoever scores the most points regardless of what they are called on the depth chart, concentrating that much quality at the top of the roster is exactly the strategy that wins tournaments. The draft execution backs up the vision, too. Burrow fell nearly a full round past his ADP, Travis Kelce slid 1.7 rounds to land at TE10, and Marvin Harrison Jr. came a round late at WR33, all without a single major reach anywhere on the board. Jameson Williams, Christian Watson, and Rome Odunze round out a projected starting group that gives Soap multiple ways to win on any given week. This roster is not built on hope.

Ghost sits first in the Call of Duty: ModernWarfare2 division and in the 99th percentile of the entire field, and the draft record explains exactly why. Eight values against zero steals and zero major reaches, give or take one late flier on Michael Mayer, tells you this manager knows how to sit on their hands and let the board come to them. The receiver group is the centerpiece: Chris Olave, Malik Nabers, Jaylen Waddle, and Brian Thomas Jr. all project as starters, and every single one of them fell past their ADP, Nabers by a full round and a half. That kind of patience at the position compounds fast. Then you get Brock Bowers at TE1 and Colston Loveland at TE3 anchoring the tight end corps, both projecting as starters, both taken at genuine value. Drake Maye checking in as QB2 rounds out a lineup where the projected weakness, Jordan Addison at WR43, would be a comfort pick on most rosters in this field. Ghost did not get lucky. Ghost drafted well.
