If there's a silver lining, it's the youth of this team, with an average starter age of just 24.9, promising that this turbulent ride is only just beginning.

postseason push. The team also managed to secure some strategic value picks later in the draft, such as Rachaad White and Emeka Egbuka, which could prove instrumental as the season progresses. However, they took a gamble by reaching for Isiah Pacheco and Jack Bech earlier than necessary. Whether these choices pay off remains to be seen, especially in the context of their overall ranking in the 32nd percentile. As Butterfingers Franklin navigates through the intense competition, every player's contribution will be essential. The delicate balance between well-calculated risks and high-reward strategies could define their 2025 season.
