As the 2025 fantasy football season kicks off, ExtraSus finds themselves in a challenging position, ranking ninth in their division and struggling in the lower echelons of the overall standings. Rhamondre Stevenson, while a projected starter, is barely hanging on at RB40 and could become a glaring weakness that opponents exploit. The wide receiver lineup, led by Puka Nacua, appears strong on the surface but lacks the depth to carry the team through tougher matchups. The decision to reach for players like Kyler Murray and Christian McCaffrey earlier than their average draft positions might have been seen as bold moves, but they've come at the cost of flexibility and depth elsewhere on the roster. Meanwhile, Darius Slayton's selection well ahead of schedule has further drained potential value

from the bench. As ExtraSus maneuvers through the season, their position suggests a long road ahead, with little room for error if they hope to climb the ranks.


