As the 2025 fantasy football season looms on the horizon, Justin Rogers (@RunDFF) finds itself facing an uphill battle. Despite boasting a trio of capable quarterbacks in Lamar Jackson, Brock Purdy, and Dak Prescott, the team is mired at the bottom of the WashingtonSentinals division standings, ranking 12th with little hope for improvement. Their quarterback strength is offset by glaring weaknesses at wide receiver and tight end, where Tre Harris and Rashid Shaheed are expected to play key roles despite their low rankings. In particular, Shaheed is a concerning starter given his position as the weakest player on the roster. While the running back corps offers some promise with Alvin Kamara and Joe Mixon leading the charge, reaching for these players earlier than necessary has undermined any potential value gain. Justin Rogers also made some questionable draft decisions, reaching for Kareem Hunt and Chris Godwin, which only compounded their woes.

These choices have left them languishing in the 4th percentile overall, suggesting a dismal season ahead with few signs of hope on the horizon.

weigh heavily on their prospects. Missteps like the early selection of Tyrone Tracy further exacerbate the challenges ahead. Even the intriguing Murray-Harrison stack might not be enough to salvage a season where strategic mishaps appear ready to overshadow any fleeting moments of brilliance.

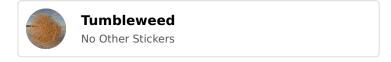
