The situation isn't helped by the fact that Darnell Mooney, projected to start, is among the weakest receivers in the league. While the team managed to snag Josh Downs at a slightly advantageous spot in the draft, the decision to reach for De'Von Achane and significantly overvalue Dont'e Thornton has left them

scrambling for consistency. With a track record of scoring in the bottom quartile and winning less than a third of their games last season, Murrrk's prospects for turning things around seem dim, leaving its supporters to brace for another tough slog.
