The decision

to reach for certain players in the draft has left them with little room for error, further compounding their challenges as they try to climb out of their current standings. Overall, The Dirty Dozen's prospects appear bleak, with few bright spots on the horizon.

climb the ranks. CooperD enters the season with the weight of expectation heavy upon its shoulders, as they strive to defy the odds and outperform their current standing in both arenas.

seems destined to languish in mediocrity once again, stuck in the bottom half of their division and tournament rankings.
