The 2025 season is looking bleak for the Duuuvall Demolition. The wide receiver lineup, while not terrible, isn't enough to carry the team, especially with Brenton Strange lagging far behind in tight end rankings. Add to that a running back group led by Ray Davis, who is almost nonexistent in terms of impact, and you have a recipe for disaster. Even their attempts at gaining a small stack bonus with Trevor Lawrence and

Brian Thomas Jr. seem like a drop in the bucket compared to the glaring weaknesses. As it stands, this team is poised for another tough year, fighting just to stay relevant.

As PuertoRicoFF prepares to embark on their 2025 fantasy football season, the outlook appears rather bleak. Ranked 11th in their division, they find themselves languishing near the bottom, with a mere 3rd percentile ranking overall. Although the team boasts a solid core of running backs, including Ashton Jeanty and Breece Hall, this strength is overshadowed by glaring weaknesses elsewhere. The wide receiver corps, led by Garrett Wilson and Christian Kirk, lacks the firepower needed to compete effectively, while the tight end position remains a vulnerability with Hunter Henry failing to inspire confidence. To add to their woes, the team reached on several players, significantly overpaying for marquee names like Patrick Mahomes and others such as Trey Benson, who is inexplicably slated as a starter despite his low ranking. This pattern of reaching for players earlier than their average draft positions suggests a lack of strategic foresight, further exacerbating

an already suspect roster. With these challenges, PuertoRicoFF faces an uphill battle in 2025, making it difficult to envision a positive turnaround in their fortunes.


