There is no sugarcoating the math for RMSummerlin in 2026. Sitting 12th in the Wrex division and projecting in just the 23rd percentile of the field, this roster is grading out as one of the tournament's softer entries, and the draft did nothing to change that trajectory. Sixteen chalk picks and zero steals left the team exactly where it started, no better, no worse, just stuck. The foundation is there in spots: Lamar Jackson at QB3 is a legitimate anchor, and James Cook at RB5 and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 give the lineup real backfield punch. But the receiver room thins out fast after Zay Flowers at WR16, and the Jackson-Flowers stack, while sensible, is the kind of bet you make when you're hoping for variance rather than banking on depth. Last season's 44 percent win rate was not a fluke that better luck corrects, it was a signal. With no obvious lever left to pull, RMSummerlin looks less like a sleeping giant than a team already awake and simply short on options.

There is no polite way to say this: RayKuhn57 is in trouble. After a 3-33 campaign that landed in the 2nd percentile of scoring, the hope was that the draft would provide a reset, and the draft did not provide a reset. Fifteen chalk picks, three major reaches, and zero steals later, the roster grades out at the 27th percentile of the field, good for 11th in the Wrex division. The backfield anchored by Bijan Robinson (RB2) and Omarion Hampton (RB9) is genuinely impressive, but the receiver group fades fast, with Khalil Shakir projected as a WR51 holding down a starting spot. The draft's defining move was burning a second-round pick on Caleb Williams before the position market cleared, a reach of nearly a full round that cost real equity. Compound that with Fernando Mendoza coming off the board six full rounds ahead of his ADP, and you have a draft that was trying too hard to find an edge and found none. The lever that was supposed to fix this roster was the draft, and the draft did not fix it.

There is no polite way to frame smisch's situation in the Wrex division: sitting 10th in the division and projecting at the 30th percentile of the field, this roster is asking its manager to thread a needle without much thread. The top of the lineup is genuinely fine, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Chris Olave at WR11 give smisch real weapons, and Jeremiyah Love at RB13 and Quinshon Judkins at RB22 add legitimate punch. But the draft was almost entirely chalk, 17 chalk picks with zero steals and zero values, which means smisch is getting exactly what the market expected and nothing more. When your floor and your ceiling are the same address, you need late-round windfalls to change the math, and they never arrived. Drake Maye projects as a QB2, which helps, but Hunter Henry at TE18 as the projected weakest starter is a quiet drag on a roster that cannot afford quiet drags. There is no obvious lever left to pull here, just a long season of hoping projections are wrong.

The cruelest thing about Dumpster Fire is that the draft went almost exactly as it should have. Sixteen chalk picks, two values, zero major reaches, sitting 31st percentile anyway. That is the part that stings. Jonathan Taylor at RB4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give this roster a legitimate ceiling, and the Jalen Hurts/DeVonta Smith and Kyler Murray/Jefferson stacks add a volatility upside that could carry a good week into a great one. But the floor keeps pulling the eye downward. Josh Jacobs projects as RB16, which would be a real asset, except his situation off the field is unresolved and his fantasy value is genuinely difficult to trust right now, which is obviously the far lesser concern in the larger picture. Bhayshul Tuten fell nearly two rounds past ADP and gives the roster some late-round cushion. Still, the projected weakest starter is Jordan Addison at WR43, and Evan Engram sits at TE36, and those are the numbers that quietly drag a team built correctly into the bottom third of its division.

joeg17 enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Wrex division and projected at just the 33rd percentile of the field, and nothing on this roster suggests a dramatic reversal is coming. The foundation looks decent enough: Ja'Marr Chase projects as WR2, and Patrick Mahomes and Matthew Stafford give the team real quarterback depth, with a Stafford-Davante Adams stack offering some correlation upside. But the draft told a quieter story than the marquee names imply. Of 19 picks, not one graded out as a steal or a value, with 16 landing at chalk and a major reach on Elijah Arroyo, taken more than five rounds ahead of his ADP, eating into the kind of surplus value that separates contenders from also-rans. Beyond Chase and George Pickens, the projected starters thin out fast, and Stefon Diggs projects as the weakest among them at WR56. There is no obvious lever left to pull, no buried asset waiting to emerge. This is more or less the hand joeg17 is playing, and it is a few cards short.

Coldenburg enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Wrex Division and projecting at just the 38th percentile of the field, and there is no clean diagnosis because there is no single catastrophic wound, just a slow bleed across the roster. The backfield is genuinely impressive, anchored by Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and De'Von Achane at RB6, but that group can only carry so much weight when the receiver corps grades out weak and the projected starter at the bottom of that group is Romeo Doubs at WR53. The draft did not manufacture a solution either: thirteen chalk picks, two major reaches, and zero steals left Coldenburg with a roster that reflects the market almost exactly, which is a polite way of saying there was no hidden genius at the draft table. T.J. Hockenson, reached nearly three rounds ahead of his ADP at TE23, was the boldest swing taken, and bold swings on tight ends rarely save seasons. Last year's 53rd-percentile scoring floor suggests some functional baseline here, but functional baselines

do not climb leaderboards, and right now Coldenburg looks like a team hoping the projections are wrong rather than one built to prove them so.

Chillyone finished 2025 at the 53rd percentile and is essentially parked in the same zip code heading into 2026, sitting sixth in the Wrex division with a roster that invites neither fear nor pity. The ceiling is real: Puka Nacua at WR1 and Nico Collins at WR9 give this team genuine top-end firepower, and when those two are cooking, Chillyone can hang points with anyone. But the floor is genuinely unsettling. Brock Purdy, projected as a QB13 starter, is surrounded by a 49ers receiving corps that is battered in almost every direction, with Kittle recovering from a torn Achilles, Pearsall's 2026 availability reportedly in doubt, and nearly every weapon around Purdy carrying some form of injury question. If Purdy regresses or misses time again, Dak Prescott is the fallback, and the distance between QB7 and QB13 is meaningful when margins are this thin. This is a team where a few projections break right and they climb; a few break wrong and the 53rd percentile starts to look optimistic.

Erik Davey's 2026 Scott Fish Bowl roster is the product of a manager who never needed a hero moment because he kept winning the small ones. The clearest example is the wide receiver group, where A.J. Brown (WR8), Jameson Williams (WR21), Luther Burden (WR22), and Carnell Tate (WR29) give Davey four projected starters who can all carry a week, assembled without a single steal on the board. Brown was a minor reach at 2.04, Burden cost him less than a round of early capital, and both proved worth it. Add Tyler Warren (TE4) and Mark Andrews (TE14) anchoring the tight end group, and Christian McCaffrey (RB3) as the top running back, and Davey's floor is legitimately high. The honest concern is quarterback, where Bo Nix (QB15) and Sam Darnold (QB21) are functional starters in a positionless format but not difference-makers. In a field this competitive, sitting 57th percentile and fifth in the Wrex Division is not a ceiling, it's a starting point, and this roster has the talent to climb.

cpapcstar17 didn't need a lottery ticket to build this roster, just a steady hand and a sharp eye. The draft produced three values and zero reaches, a clean sheet that reflects a manager who trusted the board instead of chasing names. Josh Allen sits at QB1 and anchors the upside, while Jared Goff at QB16 provides the kind of reliable weekly production that doesn't require you to hold your breath, backed by a Detroit offense that has returned its full supporting cast intact. The real engine of this team, though, is the running back group: Ashton Jeanty (RB7) and Saquon Barkley (RB8) project as legitimate difference-makers, and Jadarian Price (RB26) was snagged nearly two rounds after his ADP, the sort of quiet win that separates good drafts from great ones. That last season, a 99th-percentile scoring finish, wasn't a fluke of schedule or luck. It was output. This roster looks built to keep producing it.

PittSaints didn't make any single move that will end up on a highlight reel, and that's exactly the point. This is a roster built the old-fashioned way: show up, do the work, and come out ahead on nearly every pick. CeeDee Lamb at WR5 slipping to 2.06 when his ADP sat at 1.11 is the kind of gift that quietly tilts a draft, and Jaylen Warren falling more than a round past his ADP in the back half only added to the cushion. Stack those values on top of projected starters like Breece Hall (RB14), Kyren Williams (RB15), Cam Skattebo (RB20), Malik Nabers (WR12), and Trey McBride (TE2), and the depth chart starts to look less like a roster and more like a well-reasoned argument. The 2025 campaign was a rough one at 25th percentile in scoring, but this group projects as a genuine upgrade, and sitting third in the division at the 70th tournament percentile reflects a team that earned its standing one smart pick at a time.

Arush25 sits second in the Wrex Division and in the 82nd tournament percentile, and the draft sheet explains exactly why. Nine values across the board, built the patient way, picking players where the board gave them rather than forcing the issue. Brock Bowers at TE1 was the foundation, landed at pick 1.11 despite an ADP of 1.07, essentially on schedule but with a franchise-level tight end locked in before anyone could blink. From there, Arush25 just kept cashing in: Jayden Daniels at QB5 fell nearly a full round, Travis Etienne slipped over a round past his ADP, and Jacory Croskey-Merritt dropped a full 2.5 rounds before getting scooped at 15.11. Joe Burrow as a projected QB4 adds a second legitimate weapon at the position. The one blemish is Tua Tagovailoa, taken 2.7 rounds early at a projected QB31, which qualifies as the roster's lone major reach. But when your weakest projected starter is Makai Lemon at WR40 and your floor is this high, one blemish is a footnote, not a flaw.

There are rosters built on lottery tickets, and then there is dullday's 2026 squad, assembled with the quiet confidence of someone who simply kept winning exchanges. The draft tells the story plainly: three genuine values against zero major reaches, a ratio that reflects consistent execution rather than one spectacular gamble. Brian Thomas Jr. landing at WR31 a full round after his ADP, Jordyn Tyson slipping to WR34 a round late, Kyle Pitts materializing at TE7 when the board offered him up, these are the moments that separate a good draft from a great one, compounding into a roster that now sits first in the Wrex division and in the 83rd percentile of the field. The headliner is Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, but the sturdiness runs deep through Jaxon Smith-Njigba, Drake London at WR7, and Tee Higgins at WR19 forming a projected starting core that other managers will simply have to navigate around. Justin Herbert and Ladd McConkey running the stack is a sensible structural choice that ties the offense together. No single heist. Just a draft that consistently came out ahead.
