Jeffrotull44 walked into the Scott Fish Bowl draft, looked at a board full of available talent, and somehow emerged with zero steals, zero values, and five major reaches. Five. The reach on Chris Olave at 2.04 when Olave's ADP sat at 3.10 is forgivable in isolation, but it set the tone for a draft that kept finding new floors. Kyler Murray, projected QB19, got grabbed nearly two full rounds early. Chimere Dike, projected WR84, went 3.6 rounds before his number was called. Elic Ayomanor, projected WR95, somehow went even earlier relative to ADP. The top of this roster is real, Caleb Williams projects as QB6 and CeeDee Lamb as WR5, but the draft capital spent chasing ghosts in the middle and late rounds left jeffrotull44 with a bottom-of-the-division projection that would embarrass someone who went 81 percent wins and scored in the 99th percentile last season. This is what it looks like when a manager convinces himself he sees something no one else does, and the board just quietly disagrees on every single pick.

jrichjr sits third in the 10 Yard Fight division and in the 3rd percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains why. Five major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a philosophy, and the results are unforgiving. Justin Herbert lands as QB8 after jrichjr paid a round-one price for him in round two, which is already a shaky return, and the Herbert situation compounds the problem. Mike McDaniel arriving in Los Angeles does make Herbert more interesting, but the Chargers have now won 11 games in back-to-back seasons under Jim Harbaugh's ball-control approach, Herbert's pass attempts have slid accordingly, and he has managed just 15 rushing scores in six years, meaning his upside stays capped even in a friendlier scheme. Then there is RJ Harvey, the team's weakest projected starter at RB28, taken three full rounds before his ADP. Reaching early and landing a weak link is the kind of double-loss that compounds across a roster, and this one compounded five times.

There is no flattering spin available for huntinmillions, sitting dead last in the 10 Yard Fight division and in the bottom 10 percent of the field. The draft tells the story clearly enough: zero steals, three major reaches, and a roster that reflects what happens when a manager keeps overpaying for players the market had already priced correctly. Christian Kirk at WR100 taken five full rounds before his ADP. Elijah Sarratt at WR98 grabbed more than four rounds early. Antonio Williams at WR64 yanked off the board two and a half rounds ahead of schedule. These are not aggressive bets on upside, they are just miscalculations, and they consumed capital that could have shored up a tight end room that bottoms out at Dalton Schultz at TE22. Jonathan Taylor and James Cook give this team a legitimate foundation at the top, but when your weakest projected starter is Kyle Monangai at RB33 and your draft board reads like a series of apologies, the foundation does not matter much. The 2026 season looks like more of the same exhausting mediocrity.

TheFranchise1 drafted nearly the entire roster at or after ADP, which is supposed to be the formula. Saquon Barkley fell a full round past his number. Fernando Mendoza slid even further. The process was clean. And yet the team sits at 9th in the 10 Yard Fight division and projects to just the 28th percentile of the field, which is what makes this roster feel like a careful argument that arrives at the wrong conclusion. The foundation is real: Lamar Jackson and Justin Jefferson anchor the lineup, and the Jackson/Mark Andrews stack gives the team a built-in bonus that most managers are chasing. But the projected starters thin out quickly after that, and Jadarian Price, the weakest projected starter, is coming in at RB26. This team finished in the 81st percentile last year. The players are largely the same quality of names. The math just refuses to cooperate, and there is no obvious broken pick to blame, no late reach to circle. Sometimes a draft goes right and the roster still does not add up, and that is the worst kind of wrong there is.

wallawalla16 sits at 62nd percentile and eighth in the 10 Yard Fight division, which tells you everything: not a pretender, not a contender, just a team where the margins decide everything. The foundation is genuinely strong. Bijan Robinson at RB2 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give this roster two top-five anchors that most teams in this field cannot match, and Patrick Mahomes projects as QB12 with real upside if he stays healthy. The problem is what surrounds them. A.J. Brown at WR8 and DeVonta Smith at WR14 are legitimate contributors, but the projected starter list bottoms out at Josh Downs at WR46, and that is where seasons quietly bleed out. The draft showed patience more than creativity, with 15 chalk picks and just two genuine steals, Quinshon Judkins falling three-plus rounds past his ADP and Aaron Rodgers sliding five full rounds. Those values give wallawalla16 a puncher's chance if the projections break right. If they do not, this is a roster that finishes exactly where it looks like it will finish.

Czechoslavernavia didn't build this roster on one flashy swing, and that restraint is exactly what makes it worth watching. The foundation is legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 give this team a backfield core that most managers would trade their entire late rounds to acquire. From there, the draft just kept compounding. Malik Nabers, a projected WR12, slid more than a round past his ADP and landed in the fifth. C.J. Stroud fell a round and a half into round eleven. David Montgomery, Quentin Johnston, even Greg Dulcich in the fourteenth, every one of them came at a discount. Five values and a steal, against only two major reaches, means this roster was built with margin at almost every turn. The Bo Nix reach in round four is the one decision that raises an eyebrow, but in a positionless format that flexibility matters less than the sheer number of contributors Czechoslavernavia assembled by consistently letting the draft come to them. Landing at the 66th percentile feels like a floor, not a ceiling.

douutpeoma didn't need a lottery ticket to build a winner in 2026, just a draft that kept winning small battles and letting them compound. The foundation is legitimate: Drake Maye at QB2 and Nico Collins at WR9 give this roster real upside at the top, and Collins arriving a full round after his ADP tells you how the rest of the draft went. Tucker Kraft at TE5 cost a round and a half less than expected, Jaylen Warren and Tony Pollard both fell past their market values, and Jacory Croskey-Merritt slid three full rounds to land at RB40. None of those are flashy moments, but five values and a steal across a single draft is a consistent edge, not a lucky one. The 2025 campaign finished at 64th percentile in scoring and a 58 percent win rate, so the infrastructure for winning already exists. At 77th percentile in projected tournament standing, douutpeoma enters the 10 Yard Fight division as a team that earned its position one quiet advantage at a time.

Franzmike didn't build this roster on one flashy pick. It was a draft that kept grinding out advantages, round after round. The clearest example is Derrick Henry, a projected RB12 who fell more than two full rounds past his ADP and landed at 6.06, a genuine gift. That kind of patience pays compounding interest when it shows up alongside De'Von Achane at RB6 and Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4, both projected starters anchoring a group that has real top-end weight. George Pickens at WR10 adds another starter with legitimate upside, and Chase Brown at RB11 cost less than his projection suggests he was worth. Matthew Stafford is an interesting wrinkle here: a 37-year-old coming off a career-best season and an MVP award, now drafted to share a quarterback room with his eventual successor, which makes his 2026 situation genuinely murky. Franzmike's 77th percentile tournament projection reflects a team built without a glaring weakness at the top, and sitting sixth in the 10 Yard Fight division, the floor here looks comfortably higher than the price paid to reach it.

post39 didn't win the draft on one thunderbolt pick. They won it the way good teams usually do, by being right more often than they were wrong. The foundation is legitimate: Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 is as close to a sure thing as fantasy football offers, and Kenneth Walker III at RB10 and Breece Hall at RB14 give this roster a starting core that most managers in the 10 Yard Fight would take without blinking. Then consider that Jared Goff fell more than two rounds past his ADP and lands as a projected QB16, essentially a high-end streaming option acquired at a discount, and the efficiency picture gets sharper. Luther Burden at WR22 is the wild card worth watching closely. Ben Johnson is already invoking Amon-Ra St. Brown comparisons in training camp, and after Burden averaged a 53 percent snap share over the final eight games of 2025, the hype has at least some statistical scaffolding beneath it. Sitting at 78th percentile tournament-wide, post39 has the makings of a team that earns its way deep into the bracket rather than hoping for one.

FFUnclePiff didn't win the draft with one brilliant move. They won it with a series of quiet, compounding advantages that added up to an 86th-percentile roster. The foundation was laid early: Trey McBride at pick 1.12 when his ADP sat at 1.08, and then Brock Bowers sliding to 2.01 despite an ADP of 1.07, giving this team two of the top two projected tight ends before the second round was finished. That kind of efficiency at the top of a draft is how rosters get built, not rescued. Ladd McConkey at WR20 falling a full round-plus past his ADP at pick 5.12 added another projected starter to a receiving group that already includes Garrett Wilson, Terry McLaurin, and Brian Thomas Jr. The one wrinkle is at quarterback, where Cam Ward projects as QB23, though the format's positional flexibility softens that considerably. Third in the division and inside the top 15 percent of the field, this is a team that earned its ranking the boring way, and boring at the top of a draft sheet looks a lot like winning come September.

aphewscruzloos sits second in the 10 Yard Fight division and in the top 10 percent of the field, and the draft sheet explains why in the most uncomfortable way possible. There were zero steals and five reaches, two of them major. And yet the roster is genuinely good. Puka Nacua at WR1, Drake London at WR7, Colston Loveland at TE3, George Kittle at TE9, and a projected starting group that holds up from top to bottom, all built through a draft that the algorithm would have graded a C at best. Xavier Worthy is the weakest projected starter at WR49, which tells you something about how deep this thing runs. The most instructive moment is London himself, the one true value in the draft, falling nearly a full round past his ADP and landing at 3.03 as the clear highlight of the board. That kind of good fortune has a way of covering sins, and this team had some sins to cover. Whether aphewscruzloos knew exactly what they were doing or simply got away with it, the scoreboard in the 10 Yard Fight will not care either way.

JoanJett did not come to the 2026 Scott Fish Bowl to negotiate. Sitting at the top of the 10 Yard Fight division and in the 91st percentile of the entire field, this roster was built the way championship teams are supposed to be built: disciplined at the top, patient in the middle, and sharp enough at the margins to tilt the ledger. Josh Allen at QB1 and Joe Burrow at QB4 give this team an embarrassment of riches at the position that wins tournaments outright, and Tetairoa McMillan, snagged a full 1.2 rounds past his ADP, immediately slots in as a projected starter at WR15 without costing a premium pick. Jameson Williams, another projected starter pulled at value, checks in at WR21. Six values against zero major reaches across the entire draft is not an accident, it is a philosophy. The only real conversation here is whether Wan'Dale Robinson's WR47 projection as the weakest projected starter is acceptable depth or a minor tax on an otherwise spotless sheet. It is a minor tax.
