Dark Magician enters 2026 sitting 12th in the Oh! division and in just the 7th percentile of the entire field, and the draft offers little reason to revise that estimate upward. The quarterback situation is genuinely strong, with Lamar Jackson at QB3 and Jayden Daniels at QB5 both projected as starters, but in a positionless format, strength at one position only matters if the rest of the roster can carry its weight, and here it largely cannot. The receiver corps looks respectable on paper until you notice how much of it depends on players trending the wrong direction, and Marvin Harrison Jr. is the most instructive case: two seasons under 900 yards, an injury-wrecked 2025 campaign, and now Jacoby Brissett inheriting his offense in Arizona, which is about as uninspiring a quarterback situation as the league has to offer. The draft did not help matters, producing no steals, just two values, and a major reach on Daniels at 2.02. There is no cavalry coming, no obvious reconfiguration that changes the math. This roster is what it is, and what it is, unfortunately, is not enough.

Dark Paladin had the draft board to themselves and still managed to make a mess of it. Zero steals, zero values, twelve chalk picks, and then, in the rounds where managers with nothing left to lose typically unearth something useful, this team went the opposite direction and reached four times, each one worse than the last. Jack Bech at WR94 taken nearly five rounds early, Keenan Allen at WR99 grabbed nearly five rounds early, Michael Mayer at TE39 scooped up four rounds ahead of schedule, all of them late-round fliers treated like mid-round certainties. The top of the roster is real enough, Caleb Williams and Jonathan Taylor give this team a floor, but a team sitting 11th in the Oh! Division and in just the 13th percentile of the field did not get there because of its stars. It got there because the draft devolved into a series of panicked reaches for names that no longer deserved the urgency, and the scoreboard from a 7-29 season last year suggests the lesson has not quite landed yet.

Time Wizard sits 10th in the Oh! division and in just the 29th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet does not offer much comfort. The manager leaned on two major reaches, pulling C.J. Stroud at QB22 nearly three rounds early and Brian Robinson at RB45 nearly three rounds early, which is a rough way to spend premium draft capital when neither player grades out as a genuine difference-maker. The receiver group is the one legitimate bright spot, led by Puka Nacua at WR1 and Chris Olave at WR11, with Luther Burden at WR22 carrying real upside if the hype around him in Chicago finally converts into a full workload, a question that has followed Burden into yet another training camp. But receivers carry a team only so far when the quarterback situation runs from Stroud down to Bryce Young at QB26, meaning the ceiling on any given week is structurally depressed before a ball is thrown. There is no obvious fix hiding on this roster, no undervalued asset waiting to be unlocked. This is what it is, and what it is sits near the bottom.

The CDMX Ballers sit ninth in the Oh! Division and in just the 31st percentile of the field, and the draft record does little to suggest a turnaround is coming. Of the 20 picks on the roster, 15 landed exactly at consensus value, which is another way of saying the draft offered almost nothing by way of hidden upside. The two major reaches tell an especially uncomfortable story: Wan'Dale Robinson, currently projected WR47, was taken a full three rounds before his ADP, and he projects as the weakest starter on the roster, meaning the reach did not even land a difference-maker. Isiah Pacheco, reached three rounds early at RB52, was similarly costly. Drake Maye gives this team a genuine weapon, projected QB2, and De'Von Achane at RB6 provides real ammunition at the top of the lineup. But in a positionless format where winning comes down to stacking elite producers, two stars surrounded by a sea of chalk and costly mistakes is a thin foundation to build on. The ceiling exists; the floor is already visible from here.

Exodia won 61 percent of its games last season and scored at the 77th percentile, so the expectation heading into 2026 was reasonable optimism. Instead, the roster grades out at the 38th percentile and sits seventh in the Oh! Division, which is the kind of gap between expectation and reality that keeps managers up at night. The clearest culprit is the top-end anchor problem: Joe Burrow is projected QB4 and cost a first-round pick, a move that looks aggressive given quarterbacks carry no positional value in a positionless format. Ashton Jeanty grades out at RB7 and is a genuine asset, but after him the depth chart drops to Keaton Mitchell at RB49, and the wide receiver room tops out at Tee Higgins at WR19 and Jaylen Waddle at WR23, both solid but neither a tournament-winner alone. Tyler Warren at TE4 is quietly the best value on the roster. The problem is that fifteen chalk picks and one major reach left almost no margin for the kind of draft-day upside that separates contenders from also-rans at this level.

Blue-Eyes White Dragon enters 2026 sitting eighth in the Oh! Division and projecting at just the 38th percentile of the field, and the draft log does little to inspire confidence in a turnaround. The roster does have a legitimate foundation at the top, with Ja'Marr Chase projecting as WR2 and Kenneth Walker III slotting in as RB10, but beyond that core the roster thins out fast, and the draft decisions that were supposed to build depth mostly made things worse. The manager reached 4.7 rounds early for Cooper Kupp, a WR88 projection who lands nowhere near a starting-caliber player, and burned a 12th-round pick on Alvin Kamara, a projected RB50 who was available more than three rounds later in the room. Those are not bold swings, they are wasted capital that could have shored up a genuinely weak supporting cast, one whose projected floor is Tony Pollard at RB30. Coming off a 25th-percentile scoring season in 2025, Blue-Eyes White Dragon needed a reset draft, and this was not it.

Celtic Guardian didn't make headlines in the Scott Fish Bowl draft room, but the numbers tell a quiet, consistent story. CeeDee Lamb fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at pick 2.06, giving this roster a WR5 for a price that should have cost more. Josh Jacobs came in a round and a half late, Josh Allen anchors the position at QB1, and Kyle Pitts and Mark Andrews give the team a pair of projected starters at tight end. Scattered across the board, those kinds of small advantages compound. The Bo Nix reach at QB15 and the Jacory Croskey-Merritt reach at RB40 are real blemishes, but neither looks like a roster-breaking mistake when the rest of the draft consistently came out ahead of market. Coming off an 82nd-percentile scoring season in 2025, Celtic Guardian sits 60th percentile heading into 2026, which reads less like a step back and more like a team with proven production waiting for the projections to catch up.

dynastydak didn't win the draft with one flashy swing, they won it by consistently coming out ahead on deal after deal. Drake London at WR7 slipped two picks past his ADP, and Rashee Rice fell nearly a full round before dynastydak scooped him up at WR13, giving this roster a legitimate top-15 receiver pairing without overpaying for either. Meanwhile, Jahmyr Gibbs projects as the RB1 in the entire field, an anchor that makes every lineup decision easier. The draft wasn't flawless, James Conner cost three-plus rounds more than the market would have charged, but one overpay rarely sinks a team that otherwise kept its checkbook balanced across 19 picks. Coming off a 69th percentile scoring season in 2025, the infrastructure was already there, and this draft sharpened it. The result is a team sitting at the 63rd percentile tournament-wide with legitimate upside if Gibbs and that receiver core hit their projections. No drama, no lottery tickets, just a manager who kept winning small and let the wins add up.

Mirror Force is what happens when a manager trusts the board and never forces it. Six values and a steal across the roster, zero reaches, and a starting lineup that projects with genuine firepower at the top: Bijan Robinson at RB2, George Kittle at TE9, and a wide receiver corps anchored by George Pickens at WR10, Zay Flowers at WR16, and Emeka Egbuka at WR18. The stack with Dak Prescott and Pickens is a clean one, and the Egbuka pairing with Baker Mayfield gives this team a second avenue into the same games. Mayfield carries some uncertainty after a quieter 2025 following Mike Evans' departure and a shoulder that nagged him all season, but Egbuka is a legitimate WR18 projection and that stack has real upside. Dallas Goedert at TE15 fell nearly two rounds past his ADP and still projects as a starter. The weakest projected starter here is Michael Wilson at WR39. On most rosters in this field, that would be a compliment.

HoldMyBourbon didn't win the draft on one flashy pick, they won it by simply not losing rounds. The foundation is hard to argue with: Christian McCaffrey at RB3 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 anchoring the backfield, with Trey McBride sliding in at TE2 after falling nearly a full round past his ADP. That McBride number quietly matters as much as anything on this roster, because a TE2 at a slight discount is the kind of understated advantage that compounds over a full season. Barkley himself was another tick of value, taken at 3.10 against an ADP of 3.02, a marginal edge that reflects the broader draft philosophy here: patient, precise, rarely forced. The two major reaches on Calvin Ridley and Rashod Bateman are real and worth acknowledging, but they land in the back half of the roster where the risk is manageable. At 69th percentile entering the season, HoldMyBourbon sits fourth in the Oh! division with genuine top-tier firepower and a draft that, pick for pick, belonged in a different conversation than the results column suggests.

Toon Squad didn't make any single move that will end up on a highlight reel, but that's exactly the point. This is a roster built on consistent execution, the kind of draft where the board just kept breaking right. Landing Justin Jefferson at 2.08 when his ADP sat at 1.12 is the headliner, a WR6 who slid nearly a full round into Toon Squad's lap, and Harold Fannin at TE6 falling 1.3 rounds past his price tag only adds to the ledger. Pair Jefferson with a projected starter in Brock Bowers at TE1 and a second projected starter in A.J. Brown at WR8, and the foundation here is legitimately difficult to argue with. The QB situation is quieter, Jared Goff checks in at QB16 and Sam Darnold at QB21, and Darnold's path to better numbers depends on whether the Seattle passing game widens beyond what it was last year. But in a positionless format, top-shelf skill players carry the weight, and Toon Squad has those. A 72nd percentile finish is there for the taking if the studs stay healthy.

Self-Destruct Button is sitting at the top of the Oh! division and projecting into the 99th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly why: one steal, seven values, and just one minor reach across the entire board. The headline is Amon-Ra St. Brown, a WR4 projection who fell nearly a full round past his ADP and landed at pick 2.07, which is the kind of board gift that separates disciplined managers from lucky ones. Self-Destruct Button did not just take the gift and coast, either. Tucker Kraft came in at TE5 and fell 1.6 rounds before this team grabbed him in the sixth. Colston Loveland, a TE3, slipped nearly a round and landed in the third. Jaxon Smith-Njigba projects as WR3 and anchors a receiver group that also features DeVonta Smith at WR14 and Quentin Johnston at WR41, both starters, both taken at or below their market price. There is almost nothing to nitpick here. Self-Destruct Button built a roster the right way, and the projections reflect it.
