Sausage Link finished last season at the 16th percentile in scoring and has done little to escape that gravity in 2026, projecting at the 8th percentile and sitting 12th in the Zelda division. The core is not without its names: De'Von Achane (RB6) and CeeDee Lamb (WR5) are legitimate difference-makers, and Tucker Kraft (TE5) adds real value at a thin position across the field. But the supporting cast fades fast, and the quarterback situation borders on desperate. Kyler Murray (QB19) was the big swing to fix it, taken more than two rounds ahead of his ADP at pick 6.02, and he projects as a QB19 for the trouble. That is the leaky faucet this team is trying to fill with a thimble. Making matters worse, Alec Pierce (WR32) missed the offseason with ankle surgery and is currently on the PUP list, meaning the manager's most credible depth piece might miss the first four games entirely. With almost no draft-day upside created and the ceiling already low, Sausage Link is a team searching for a lever that simply is not there.

MedallionHunter drafted two quarterbacks in the first four rounds and neither of them is very good. Dak Prescott cost a second-round pick at a position that barely matters in a positionless format, and Matthew Stafford followed him out the door in round four, two full rounds ahead of his market price. That is not depth, that is panic spending at the dollar store. The rest of the board reflects the same disorder: three major reaches on a roster that landed in the 21st percentile of the field, sitting 11th in the Zelda division. Bhayshul Tuten projects as RB25 and carries genuine upside now that Jacksonville's backfield is unsettled, but even the optimistic case on Tuten cannot rescue a draft that burned its early capital on Prescott and Stafford instead of building a top end worth projecting around. Rashee Rice fell a full round past his ADP and qualifies as the lone bright spot, which is a damning thing to say about a team that made 19 picks.

There is a particular kind of draft misery reserved for the manager who did everything right and still came up short. Its Dangerous To Go Alone played the value game honestly: fifteen chalk picks, two genuine values in George Kittle and Denzel Boston, and only three minor reaches across the entire board. The process was sound. The result is a team sitting at 24th percentile and tenth in the Zelda division, which is the sort of outcome that makes you question whether the game is fair. The backfield is genuinely impressive, with Jonathan Taylor, Kenneth Walker III, and Breece Hall all projected starters and the kind of depth that would make most managers envious. But the receiver group thins out fast, and Xavier Worthy at WR49 is the projected weakest starter on the roster. Joe Burrow and Kittle give this team a real ceiling, but ceilings require floors, and right now the floor looks like it was built by someone who ran out of lumber after round four.

Last year, TeamSimmer posted a 28-8 record and scored in the 95th percentile, which is the kind of season that makes a manager believe they've figured something out. The 2026 roster suggests they have not. The team sits at 28th percentile in tournament scoring projections and ninth in the Zelda division, a freefall that no amount of nostalgia for last year's brilliance can paper over. The core is not without merit, Amon-Ra St. Brown at WR4 and Justin Jefferson at WR6 give the lineup a genuine top-end pulse, and Derrick Henry and Kyren Williams project as starter-caliber contributors. But the depth behind that nucleus thins quickly, and the draft offered no help in building a cushion, producing zero steals against sixteen chalk selections and a minor reach on Rico Dowdle, who projects as the weakest starter on the roster at RB32. A team that scored at this level a year ago deserves the benefit of the doubt, but the gap between who TeamSimmer was in 2025 and who they appear to be in 2026 is too wide to wish away.

Rich Ganon finished 61st percentile in scoring last year and now sits at 32nd percentile in projections, which is less a regression than a slow leak nobody noticed until the tire went flat. The roster has genuine anchors at tight end, where Brock Bowers projects as TE1 and Colston Loveland comes in at TE3, and the receiver group is quietly deep with Garrett Wilson, Ladd McConkey, and Luther Burden all projecting as starters. But the rest of the picture is harder to spin. Ganon sits eighth in the Zelda division, and the draft did not do much to close that gap: 12 chalk picks, four minor reaches, and a major reach on Skyler Bell at WR103, taken more than six rounds ahead of his ADP. The clearest problem is at quarterback, where Malik Willis projects as QB24 and was still reached for a round early, meaning Ganon paid a premium for the weakest projected starter on the board. When the ceiling of your quarterback situation is "fine on a good week," it is very hard to manufacture the kind of upside this standing demands.

rmanning enters 2026 sitting seventh in the Zelda division and in the 41st percentile of the field, and the roster gives little reason to expect that to change. The backfield is legitimately impressive, anchored by Christian McCaffrey (RB3) and Omarion Hampton (RB9), and the draft did net some real value, including McCaffrey falling to pick 2.01. But the receiving corps is where this team bleeds out quietly: Davante Adams (WR25) and Makai Lemon (WR40) are the top options, and the tier drops off fast from there. No amount of backfield depth rescues you when the top of your receiving group grades out at WR25. The tight end situation compounds the problem, with Dalton Schultz (TE22) leading a group that stacks five players between TE22 and TE35 without a single one you'd feel good about. Two major reaches in the draft, Mason Taylor (TE35) taken nearly four rounds early and

Jake Tonges (TE34) taken three rounds early, suggest rmaning saw the weakness and tried to address it, and came up short anyway. Last season's 39 percent win rate looks less like a fluke and more like a baseline.

GridironRatings sits at 41st percentile and sixth in the Zelda Division, which is exactly where this roster looks when you hold it up to the light: not broken, not dangerous, just hovering at the margin where every close call matters. The engine here is a receiver group that would make most managers envious, anchored by Jaxon Smith-Njigba (WR3), A.J. Brown (WR8), Chris Olave (WR11), and Malik Nabers (WR12) as projected starters. That top four alone could carry a season, but Nabers is the variable that makes this a different team in two directions. After tearing his ACL last year and drawing genuine concern in the offseason, he cleared the PUP list and looked explosively himself in training camp, with his redraft value climbing back from a July low of WR21. If Nabers is right, GridironRatings has genuine upside. If he fades or misses time, the margin for error shrinks to nearly nothing, because the rest of this roster, Tyler Shough at QB20 and Juwan Johnson at TE20, gives this team no cushion. The ceiling and the concern live in the same player.

CarlinDynasty didn't build this roster with one splashy move. They built it by consistently coming out ahead on individual picks, and the cumulative effect is a team that sits at 62nd percentile with legitimate upside to climb. The tight end group is where that discipline shows most clearly: Trey McBride at TE2, Harold Fannin at TE6, and Travis Kelce, who confirmed his return and is chasing his way back into the TE12 conversation, all project as starters. Fannin is a perfect example of the quiet competence that defines this draft, landing a round past his ADP without anyone making a fuss about it. On the receiver side, Drake London at WR7 and Zay Flowers at WR16 give the lineup proven production at the top, while DK Metcalf arrived at WR36 after sliding a full round past his expected cost. CarlinDynasty didn't need to gamble on any one pick to look this good. They just needed to be right more often than they were wrong, and on draft day, they were.

Dodongo Dislikes Smoke did not build this roster by swinging for the fences and hoping. They built it by being right, over and over, in quieter ways. The receiver group is the engine: Puka Nacua at WR1, Nico Collins at WR9, and George Pickens at WR10 give this team a ceiling that most managers in the field would envy, and Jameson Williams at WR21 pairs with Jared Goff in a stack that adds a legitimate volatility lever. Goff was the one minor reach on the board, taken 1.2 rounds early, but reaching for a QB16 with a WR21 already in hand looks less like impatience and more like construction. Meanwhile, Dallas Goedert and Jordan Love both fell to this team well past their ADPs, the kind of quiet draft surplus that compounds. The 2025 season, 78 percent wins and 95th-percentile scoring, suggests this is not a team discovering itself. It is a team that already knows what it is doing, sitting fourth in the Zelda Division and 76th percentile overall, with every reason to climb.

JL Showtime didn't win the draft with one thunderclap pick. They won it by consistently coming out ahead on almost every single selection. Seventeen chalk calls sounds like a manager playing it safe, but when the chalk includes Ja'Marr Chase at WR2 and Ashton Jeanty at RB7, you're not being boring, you're being right. The supporting cast holds up too: Caleb Williams at QB6, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Sam LaPorta at TE8 all project as genuine starters, and the floor never really drops off. Even the weakest projected starter, Hunter Henry at TE18, is a passable option on most weeks. The one genuine curiosity is the Jaxson Dart and Isaiah Likely stack, a bet that Dart's ceiling is higher than his rocky 2025 film suggests. Dart is the kind of tantalizing dual-threat that fantasy managers keep falling for, with good reason and with equal amounts of regret, so that pairing is either inspired or quietly corrosive. Either way, this roster sits third in the Zelda division and at the 78th tournament percentile, and it earned that standing the honest way.

JLBergstrom came out of this draft looking like someone who refused to let the board tell them what to do, and somehow the board blinked first. The headliners are legitimate: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and James Cook at RB5 give this roster a backfield foundation that most managers would trade several late picks to acquire, and Cook actually came at a slight discount relative to his ADP. But the part of this draft that will define JLBergstrom's season is the reach column, which is long and largely unapologetic. Fernando Mendoza and J.J. McCarthy were both taken well before the market valued them, and Jack Bech came off the board more than four rounds ahead of consensus. Those are gambles, not mistakes, and the distinction matters. What makes the roster work is that the core does not need the gambles to pay off. Kyle Pitts, coming off a legitimate breakout at TE7 and looking like a genuine anchor regardless of who lines up under center in Atlanta, gives JLBergstrom a safety net most teams at this percentile simply do not have. The conviction was real. The roster backs it up.

CrAshleySmAshley sits atop the Zelda division and in the 88th percentile of the field, and the draft record explains exactly why: no major reaches, no swings that missed, just four values quietly accumulated across sixteen rounds of chalk. The headliner is Josh Allen at QB1 paired with D.J. Moore in a stack that gives this roster a reliable weekly ceiling, while Lamar Jackson at QB3 adds a second stack with Mark Andrews that most managers simply never get to build. What makes the draft hold up under scrutiny is where the values came from. Zach Charbonnet fell more than two full rounds past his ADP, and Lamar Jackson himself slipped half a round before CrAshleySmAshley made the call. Neither pick required a gut-check gamble, just patience and a board that rewarded it. The 2025 season already showed 61 percent wins and a 68th-percentile scoring finish, so this is not a team discovering a formula. It is a team that has refined one.
