Jonas Huerbin drafted like someone who had already conceded the tournament before the clock started. The case against this roster begins at the top, where Caleb Williams was taken at 2.04 against an ADP of 3.06, a reach that cost real capital at a premium draft position and still only netted a QB6. From there the draft never recovered its footing. Kyren Williams cost a round and a half of early equity to land a projected RB15, and Jordan James was yanked off the board a staggering 6.4 rounds ahead of schedule for a player ranked RB67. Four major reaches in a single draft is not bad luck, it is a pattern, and the pattern is paying a premium for players who do not return premium value. The lone bright spot is Bo Nix, a QB15 projection that undersells a quarterback who has been a top-10 fantasy signal-caller in both of his professional seasons, but Huerbin does not start a quarterback, so Nix watches from the bench while a 6th-percentile projection plays out exactly as advertised.

Katie Caldwell sits 11th in the Zelda division and in the 24th percentile of the field, and the draft sheet explains exactly how she got there. Four major reaches across the roster, zero steals, zero values, eleven chalk picks: this is not a draft that went sideways in one unfortunate moment, it is a draft that committed to the bit across seventeen rounds. Zach Charbonnet, taken nearly six rounds before his ADP, is the crown jewel of this particular disaster, a RB42 consumed as though he were a first-round asset. Courtland Sutton follows the same logic, a WR37 grabbed 2.4 rounds early because apparently someone had to. Even the late rounds refused to course-correct, with Kayshon Boutte and Elic Ayomanor, a WR76 and WR95 respectively, each pulled well ahead of consensus. The one credible asset, Jaxon Smith-Njigba at WR3, got buried under so many pre-ADP gambles that there is barely enough air in the room to appreciate him. Caldwell did not get unlucky. She drafted her way here.

Bryan Murphy won 75 percent of his matches last year and scored in the 89th percentile, and now he sits at 29th percentile in tournament projections and tenth in the Zelda division. That gap is the whole story. The roster is not a disaster, but it does not look like a team that earned those 2025 numbers either. Joe Burrow at QB4 is the ceiling, and the ceiling is genuinely high, but Burrow's career has a way of collapsing into injury at the worst moments, and asking a fantasy season to hinge on him staying healthy through 17 weeks is a familiar kind of hope that tends to go sideways. Christian McCaffrey at RB3 anchors the scoring floor, though Murphy reached slightly to get him and his depth behind McCaffrey grades out as average at best. The Jared Goff and Jameson Williams stack offers a reliable fallback, but Goff cost a reach of nearly two full rounds at pick 4.08, real money spent on a QB16. Murphy is not rebuilding, exactly. He is just carrying a reputation his current roster has not yet earned.

Allan Hepworth enters 2026 sitting ninth in the Zelda Division and at the 29th percentile of the field, and the roster construction offers little reason for optimism. The receiver group is legitimately impressive on paper, with Amon-Ra St. Brown (WR4), Rashee Rice (WR13), and Davante Adams (WR25) forming a genuinely enviable top end, but the whole operation runs through Patrick Mahomes, and Mahomes is still recovering from a torn ACL and LCL suffered in Week 15 of 2025. The news has been encouraging, ahead-of-schedule encouraging, but "probably fine" is not the same as "confirmed Week 1 starter," and a team already projected near the bottom of the division cannot afford to be built around a question mark. Beyond the Mahomes uncertainty, the draft added three major reaches, including Matthew Stafford taken more than two rounds before his ADP, a gamble that looks expensive

when the upside is a projected QB14. Hepworth is not without weapons, but weapons require someone to deploy them, and right now that someone is limping toward training camp.

Kasper Dreyer posted an 82nd percentile finish in 2025, which is the kind of result that earns a manager some goodwill heading into a new season. The 2026 roster is here to spend it. The receiver room is genuinely elite, with CeeDee Lamb (WR5) and Justin Jefferson (WR6) giving Dreyer a top-of-the-market foundation that most managers would trade away half their roster to assemble. But this is a positionless format, and the names filling out the rest of the projected lineup tell a different story. The quarterback situation is Baker Mayfield (QB18) and Kyler Murray (QB19), both minor reaches taken before their ADPs, with Jacoby Brissett (QB28) as insurance nobody asked for. David Montgomery, who lost his featured role in Detroit and followed it up by signing with Houston to compete with Woody Marks all over again, is the poster child for this roster's middle: players with question marks duct-taped over their ceilings. Dreyer sits 8th in the Zelda division and projects at the 33rd percentile. The reputation says contender. The roster says wait and see.

Joseph Petrosino is the kind of manager who makes the playoffs on tiebreakers or misses them the same way, and his 2026 roster understands the assignment. The foundation is genuinely scary: Jahmyr Gibbs at RB1 and Saquon Barkley at RB8 give him a top of the roster that most of the Zelda division cannot match, and Jayden Daniels at QB5 keeps the ceiling high. The problem is that the margins Petrosino needs to win are exactly where his draft started slipping. He closed out his picks by taking Tyquan Thornton at WR97 nearly five rounds early and Jalen Tolbert at WR102 more than seven rounds early, two late-round swings that prioritized upside over floor at the worst possible time. Coming off a 32-percent win rate in 2025, Petrosino cannot afford to leave value on the table in rounds where other managers were still finding it. Gibbs and Barkley make him dangerous. Thornton and Tolbert make him nervous. The difference between those two truths is his entire season.

Matt Price didn't swing for the fences and miss, he just kept making the right call, round after round, and the roster quietly assembled itself into something worth watching. The headliner is Brock Bowers at TE1, a genuinely elite anchor who gives Price a weekly advantage at the position. Above him in the starting mix sit Nico Collins at WR9, DeVonta Smith at WR14, and Jaylen Waddle at WR23, a receiving corps that looks less like a draft product and more like a deliberate construction. Omarion Hampton slots in at RB9 to give the backfield a legitimate top-ten presence. The quarterback situation, with Jordan Love projecting at QB17 and Aaron Rodgers at QB29, is the one place where Price didn't come out ahead, but in a positionless format, a soft spot at QB matters far less than the quality stacked everywhere else. Last year's 94th-percentile scoring performance suggests Price knows how to translate a good roster into actual points, and this one gives him plenty to work with.

Kevin Dorman's draft board looks like a crime scene if you're the kind of person who worships ADP, and it looks like a blueprint if you're the kind of person who trusts their own sheet. Dorman pulled Dak Prescott at 2.09 when the board said wait until round three, grabbed Michael Mayer five full rounds before consensus suggested anyone needed to, and took Dontayvion Wicks another five rounds early for good measure. Three major reaches, zero steals, zero values. The case against this roster writes itself. The case for it is sitting right there in the projected starters: Josh Allen at QB1, Tucker Kraft at TE5, and a receiving corps built around Zay Flowers (WR16), Christian Watson (WR28), and Jordan Addison (WR43). That is a starting lineup that lands Dorman at 57th percentile in the field, fifth in the Zelda division. Not dominant, but genuinely good, and assembled almost entirely through conviction rather than value hunting. Whether that conviction was insight or fortune may not matter if Allen keeps doing what Allen does.

Jayson Snyder did not swing for the fences in the Scott Fish Bowl draft, and that is precisely what makes this roster worth watching. The foundation starts with Lamar Jackson, a QB3 taken a few spots after his ADP suggested he would go, and Ja'Marr Chase, a WR2 who slid four picks past where most managers had him priced. Neither qualifies as a steal in the dramatic sense, but in a tournament where the margins between good and great rosters are razor thin, consistently landing players at or below their market value compounds into a real edge. Snyder's squad finished the 2025 season at the 72nd percentile in scoring, so this is not a team still looking for proof of concept. The draft did not introduce any major liabilities either, with just a single minor reach on Hunter Henry across the entire board. Fourth in the Zelda Division and projected at the 63rd percentile, Snyder has the kind of sensibly built team that tends to still be relevant when the bracket tightens.

After a 2025 campaign that left Chad Kozlowski stranded in the bottom 10 percent of scoring with a 10-18 record and 3839 points, the 2026 roster reads like a man who spent the offseason with something to prove. The foundation is legitimately elite: Trey McBride at TE2 and Tyler Warren at TE4 give Kozlowski two of the most valuable players at their position in the entire field, and Ashton Jeanty at RB7 anchors a backfield group that projects to carry real weekly weight. Layer in the Jaxson Dart and Malik Nabers stack, a pairing that rewards both when it clicks, and you have a team built for the kind of sustained scoring that was simply absent a year ago. Kozlowski drafted mostly chalk, but the meaningful wins were real: Tyler Allgeier fell nearly three full rounds past his ADP and landed at 18.03, the sort of late-round cushion that quietly separates contenders from pretenders. A 69th-percentile projection and a third-place division standing is not a championship guarantee, but for a manager who knows exactly what last year felt like, this roster is a declaration.

Andrew Imber did not force this draft. He let it come to him, and that discipline shows up everywhere. The centerpiece is a backfield anchored by Bijan Robinson (RB2) and De'Von Achane (RB6), two projected starters who give Imber a ceiling most managers in the Zelda division are chasing from a distance. The receiver group reinforces the same pattern: A.J. Brown (WR8), Tee Higgins (WR19), and Luther Burden (WR22) all project as starters, and Burden arrived as a value after sliding 1.6 rounds past his ADP. That kind of quiet opportunism ran through the whole draft, with three values logged against zero reaches, a clean ledger that reflects a manager who never panicked. The 2025 season already told you what Imber looks like when things go right: a 75 percent win rate and scoring in the 88th percentile. Sitting second in the division with a tournament percentile at 84, this is a team built to contend, assembled pick by pick, without a single moment that required explanation afterward.

Ryan McDowell's 2026 roster reads like a masterclass in patient, disciplined drafting, and the results back it up: first in the Zelda division and sitting in the 98th percentile of the field. The foundation is a receiver corps that is genuinely difficult to argue with, led by Puka Nacua at WR1 and Drake London at WR7, both projected starters, and both acquired at better-than-market prices. London fell to pick 2.11 against an ADP of 2.06, a small discount, sure, but in a draft where McDowell logged five value picks and one outright steal against zero reaches, the discipline compounds. The steal was Chigoziem Okonkwo, a TE19 projection snagged a full two rounds late in round 12, which quietly shores up the tight end group alongside Colston Loveland at TE3. Loveland at TE3 is the kind of anchor that changes a roster's ceiling. After a 2025 that landed in the 20th percentile, McDowell clearly went back to the board and fixed things the right way, not by swinging big, but by simply not making mistakes.
